The railing is 50" high approximately, only a few inches wide, and George is 6'4" high.

A photo of the blood on the overhang, has the appearance, of something drug across or through the blood, such as a body being dragged off, or sliding off the overhang. There is an area in the image, where the blood is dense, there is a small circle, such as where a wound would be. Had that wound been on the front side of George, and he grabbed it, it would also explain the bloody handprint found as well.

There was a bloody spot the size of a fist on a towel in George's restroom, bloody tissues were found in the cabin, and a small blood spot on the sheet, the size of a finger print. There was also a report of a small amount of blood on a rug. If George had been attacked explaining that wound look in the blood on the photograph, the blood in the restroom would have to be left there by the attacker. Surely the attacker wouldn't allow George to clean up before he was thrown overboard.

Margarita Chaves, the same passenger who claimed to have seen Mrs. Smith kick Mr. Smith, claimed to have spoken to Josh Askin, who reportedly said to her, "The room service is what saved us."

Dr Henry Lee took samples on the ship, and found biological evidence on the balcony, that had been over looked. Dr. Lee says, "Biological evidence basically involve blood, serum and bodily fluid. But those evidence I cannot discuss right now because this is an active investigation."

#### UPDATE: JUNE 30, 2006

On June 29, 2006 a lawsuit was filed by the Smith family. The lawsuit says "The cruise line deliberately and intentionally portrayed the incident as an accident, and hampered a full-blown, appropriate investigation into the facts and circumstances of George A. Smith's death," the lawsuit states.

Royal Caribbean delayed reporting the incident to the FBI, deciding instead to report the case to Turkish authorities knowing they would be unable to conduct a prompt and thorough investigation, according to the lawsuit, which was filed in state court in Miami, said Brett Rivkind, the attorney for Smith's sister and parents.

Smith's family have hired Stamford private investigator Vito Colucci to investigate their son's disappearance

#### Widow Jennifer Hagel Smith Settles With RCCI

Only a few hours later, Royal Caribbean Cruises announced it had reached a settlement with his George Allen Smith's widow, Jennifer Hagel Smith. "We have done our best to assist Jennifer through the tragic events involving the disappearance of her husband," Goldstein said. "She has handled herself well under the most trying of circumstances and we applaud her constructive approach to resolving this matter -- so much so that our company will also match a contribution by Ms. Hagel Smith to a charity of her choosing.

Hagel Smith attorney James Walker said he and Hagel-Smith are convinced that there are passengers who were criminally involved in her husband's disappearance. Royal Caribbean has promised in its settlement to give her unfettered access to information, such as vessel logs, video and passenger statements of what they heard, saw and did during the hours of Smith's disappearance. Walker and Hagel Smith say the settlement was the fast way for them to get access to information that could help them solve the case.

This settlement was reached, while the FBI are still investigation the case.

Greenwich probate court must approve the settlement, deciding if the settlement is in the best interests of the estate. The Smiths have said through their lawyer that they intend to object.

suit against Royal Caribbean Cruise Lines (RCCL), alleging invasion of privacy, causing emotional distress, false imprisonment and breach of contract.

The suit is asking for a minimum of \$15,000 in damages. The suit was filed in Miami, Florida. This is the third suit filed against RCCL related to this case, so far.

**Update: August 4, 2006**

In a routine move in court, lawyers for Royal Caribbean Cruise Inc, filed a motion to dismiss, in the civil lawsuit against the cruise line, brought by the family of George Allen Smith IV.

The cruise line calls the lawsuit false and frivolous allegations, saying they were thanked by the FBI for their assistance in the case.

The family alleges the cruise line delayed reporting the incident to the FBI, didn't preserve the crime scene, deliberately portrayed the incident as an accident.

**Update: October 16, 2006**

Judge Jon I. Gordon granted a motion today to dismiss the lawsuit filed by the family of George Allen Smith IV, faulting Royal Caribbean International its handling of the case.

"It's a setback, of course, but it's not the end," maritime lawyer Brett Rivkind told Greenwich Time Thursday. "The Smith family isn't discouraged. Whether the Smith family won or lost, the issue is going to be decided in an appellate court."

**Update: January 4, 2007**

Jennifer Hagel Smith gets a settlement from Royal Caribbean Cruise International for ONE MILLION dollars. The money will be paid to the estate of George Allen Smith IV. The courts still have to approve the settlement. The investigation into her husband's death continues. But, in the settlement RCCI has said they will show the widow all the evidence they have in the case. Royal Caribbean denies any wrongdoing and does not admit to any liability.

**8:50 a.m.** - The Smith's cabin is sealed and a guard is posted outside the cabin door., Ship's personnel continued to search the ship for the missing guests.

Sometime after that, one of the male passengers with George the night before, is brought to security and questioned. They ask if he knows where George is, and tell him it is suspected that George went overboard. The passenger asks if they found blood. Security begins looking for Mrs Smith.

Jennifer Hagel Smith has passed a lie detector test and is not considered a suspect.

The male witnesses involved are interrogated by Turkish police. The father of Josh Askin, Dr, Jerry Askin, has the forethought to video tape the interrogation. This video tape, the cruise line has said didn't exist. According to Royal Caribbean's official statement: Turkish authorities refused the ship's explicit request that the interviews take place on the ship. It is shown on 48 Hours Saturday April 8, 2006, and does in fact exist. After the interrogation is over, Dr Askin asks what is next, and he is told that they are going to arrest Jennifer Hagel Smith. That never happened.

During the interrogation Josh Askin is very protective of Jennifer, and insists they talk to the casino manager, Lloyd.

Lawyer, Albert Y. Dayan for Rustislav Kofman, one of the Russians questioned by the FBI, denied his client had any role in the disappearance.

The 3 Russian speaking men are forced off the ship in Italy, when they are accused of raping a woman that one of them met in the jacuzzi. They had sex with the woman and video taped it. They deny raping the woman, saying it was consensual sex. All three admit having sex with her.

The ship's captain, says he figures that George pushed a chair up to the balcony, sat on the railing, and then accidentally fell overboard. The captain is no longer working for the cruise line, having taken early retirement.

Major news coming out of Aruba tonight. Three new witnesses have come forward. And they say they have new information that could finally break the Natalee Holloway case wide open. Plus, a new million-dollar reward and rumors of Natalee sightings in Venezuela. We're going the go live to Aruba for the latest details and get reaction from Natalee's father and stepmother, complete Aruba coverage in just a few minutes.

But, first, a SCARBOROUGH COUNTRY exclusive, new developments in a story that we've been following closely for weeks now, the search for newlywed George Smith IV. Now, as we reported, the groom vanished from a Mediterranean cruise sometime during the night of July 5. Turkish investigators and the FBI say they have no more leads—the family in seclusion.

But with me now tonight with the latest, Harris Faulkner, a correspondent for "A Current Affair," and, speaking to SCARBOROUGH COUNTRY exclusively, a man who was not only on the same cruise, but he says he had a room next to George Smith and his new wife. He's going to be coming forward and telling us some details of what he heard the night Smith disappeared.

First, Harris, let's go to you. Get us up to date with what's going on right now in the investigation, but start—there are a lot of people out there who don't know all the details. Let's start by talk about this young American couple. Who were they? Where were they? What do we know?

HARRIS FAULKNER, "A CURRENT AFFAIR": Well, hey, Joe.

We can start with George Allen Smith and his new bride, Jennifer Hagel Smith, meeting in Connecticut, falling in love, getting married a few weeks ago, 26-year-old George, 25-year-old Jennifer leaving for their honeymoon cruise in the Mediterranean, going to some beautiful ports, including Italy and many other places, ending up at some point between Turkey and Greece.

And that's when the trouble began. George at a bar with between three and five guys, seen drinking very heavily, Jennifer, at that same bar on the cruise ship, the nightclub on the cruise ship Brilliance of the Seas, which is a Royal Caribbean ship, the two of them partying, but kind of separately that night, according to witnesses who we talked to.

George comes over to the bar, where Jennifer is standing with several other guys, one of the witnesses we've talked with, complaining about the fact that she is separate from him, refusing to join him and his friends at the table. The two had a little bit of a spat. Witnesses say she kicked him in the private parts, and they finished having words together, split up.

She then left the bar and was so visibly intoxicated, according to witnesses, that she was kind of ping-ponging off the walls of the bar leaving. George left after that with at least a couple of these two other guys who were seen at the table with him. What we do know the next day is that authorities began looking for George Allen Smith after reports passengers had seen what looked like blood on an overhang, which would have been below the couple's cabin, and facing some lifeboats.

Officials on the ship went to go see what that stain was, figured it was blood, started searching every single one of those cabins above that overhang. George Allen Smith was the only one who was missing and could not be accounted for on the ship. They tracked down Jennifer. She said she didn't even realize when she woke up that morning that her brand-new husband, newlywed groom, was not in the room with her. And that's where we are.

SCARBOROUGH: And, Harris, that's the part of it is that so many people don't understand. How do you go on a honeymoon cruise? How do you wake up in a small cabin? You wake up the next morning, you leave to work out and you don't even know that your new husband is

not there?

FAULKNER: Well, there was...

SCARBOROUGH: I mean, are—are authorities buying that?

FAULKNER: Well, you know, I don't know whether they're buying it or not. I can tell you that we haven't been able to get any comment from Jennifer Hagel or her family. She's said to be in seclusion, very devastated, as you might imagine, by the loss of her new groom.

We do know that they had been drinking heavily, according to witnesses, far past the lights coming on, 3:00 a.m. on the morning of July 5. So, waking up the next morning, not finding her groom there, there were reports that she said she had gone to a gym. I did talk with a witness who saw her in the elevator looking for the solarium, which reportedly is located the near gym area. So, that could very well be true.

She told authorities, so we're told, that she was simply thinking that George was with some other friends on the ship that night and possibly the following morning, and had just not really pictured him missing. Now, authorities...

(CROSSTALK)

SCARBOROUGH: You were also, Harris, talking about—you have talked to other witnesses that say they actually, when they went into port, they would be traveling around, that, actually, both of these young newlyweds were drinking very heavily. What can you tell us about that, again, not just that night, but throughout the entire cruise, that they were living on the edge?

FAULKNER: It was throughout the entire cruise.

And, Joe, just to give you an idea, we talked with a young man who is believed to be one of the last to see George Allen Smith alive. He lives in Southern California. He was on the cruise with his family members, namely, parents. And his parents had shared a cab with George Allen Smith and his new bride. And they describe the couple as being very intoxicated, having to pull off the road at one point to let George get out and get sick.

It was also described that he was dropping a lot of money in the casino and buying strangers, complete strangers, rounds of drinks at the bar. So, this was a couple having a good time and also described as very lovely on the ship, very friendly, but definitely out to have a good time.

SCARBOROUGH: But you also said, though, that they appeared to have, according to witnesses, that night especially...

FAULKNER: A spat.

SCARBOROUGH: ... a volatile relationship.

FAULKNER: Well, a spat on that night anyway. And one of the witnesses that I talked with said that Jennifer was physically leaning on him at the bar because he thought she was so drunk. It might have looked like she was flirting. But he said, absolutely, she was leaning out of the necessity to keep from falling down, in his opinion.

Now, I should say that I talked to that witness again today. He was in our offices because we were able to get an exclusive photograph of the two of them kissing, Jennifer and her husband. And it's on our Web site, [acurrentaffair.com](http://acurrentaffair.com). You can go and see it. Those two embraced in a kiss on the ship during that cruise. We had a picture of that.

The video is on our Web site, that witness saying that, you know what? They looked like they were very much in love. But he had to come in and identify them in the video for us today, and he said, Joe, he knows a lot that happened that night. The FBI has not recalled him to find out what he knows. He says his friends saw a lot that night. They're concerned that the FBI hasn't talked to them. They're ready to say what they know.

SCARBOROUGH: I will tell you, it's fascinating. It sounds like a possible—yet another possible botched investigation.

Thanks so much for being with us, Harris Faulkner. Greatly appreciate it.

FAULKNER: You're welcome.

SCARBOROUGH: Lets bring in Clete Hyman. He was on the cruise that night and was actually next door to George and Jennifer's room.

Thank you so much for being with us, Clete.

Can you tell us what happened that night? Take us—again, take us through hour by hour. As you were next door, you heard quite a few things. Tell us about it.

CLETE HYMAN, PASSENGER ON CRUISE: Well, our first contact with the couple next door was the second night of the cruise.

They appeared to be having quite a party in their room. It lasted from about 11:00 at night until well past 3:00 in the morning. Our next time—we would only pass them in the hallways. We really had no contact with them. However, early on the morning of the 5th, at about 4:00 in the morning, we were awoken by loud yelling coming...

SCARBOROUGH: Excuse me, Clete. And that was the night. The 5th was the night he disappeared, correct?

HYMAN: The morning of the 5th.

SCARBOROUGH: Morning of the 5th.

HYMAN: Night of the 4th, morning of the 5th, yes.

SCARBOROUGH: And so that's the night you're taking us through.

(CROSSTALK)

SCARBOROUGH: OK. Go ahead. I'm sorry.

HYMAN: Yes.

We were awakened about 4:00 in the morning by loud yelling coming from the cabin. It sounded like people cheering, like a drinking-contest-type thing. There appeared to be numerous people in the room. This went on two separate times that we know of, the one that woke us up and then one about a minute later.

Then, all we could hear was loud talking in the room for, oh, probably three minutes. At that point, we heard people just outside of the door of the cabin. It sounded like people maybe saying good night. And it sounded like maybe three or four people. At that point, we heard talking in the room off and on for the next about five minutes. But then, all of a sudden, there became some very loud arguing out on the balcony. This went on for a couple of minutes.

SCARBOROUGH: Was it between a man and a woman, two male voices? Who was fighting?

HYMAN: No. It was several male voices, I would say three or four voices. I wouldn't say they were fighting, but they were obviously very loud and in an arguing manner.

This went on for a couple of minutes. And then we heard someone saying good night, good night, just repeatedly, like they were trying to usher people out of the room. After about, oh, 30 seconds of that, we did hear the cabin door open and some male voices outside. And then the males went down the hallway.

SCARBOROUGH: Clete, stay with us.

HYMAN: After this point...

SCARBOROUGH: OK. Wait. Wait. Clete, stay with us.

HYMAN: OK.

SCARBOROUGH: Because we want to hear more of your story, especially you saying that you heard something sound like possibly a couch thrown overboard, a thud. We're going to be talking to you about that and what you heard later on that evening.

Also, a little later, Natalee Holloway's dad and stepmom are going to be here to talk about today's latest developments in Aruba. Three new witnesses have come forward to talk about the night Natalee disappeared.

And later, long live rock, as long as they clean it up on network TV. A parents group is complaining about the charity Live 8 concert. Did a TV network go over the line, or are they just too sensitive?

We're just getting started at SCARBOROUGH COUNTRY. Stay with us.

(COMMERCIAL BREAK)

SCARBOROUGH: You're looking at images out of Aruba, the FBI reenacting what happened the night that Natalee Holloway disappeared. The witness tip that brought them here, well you that, plus more complete coverage coming from Aruba, next.

(COMMERCIAL BREAK)

SCARBOROUGH: Let's now continue with our exclusive interview with a man who stayed in the cabin next to missing newlywed George Smith. And he's back to tell us more about what he heard from George Smith's cabin the night he vanished—vanished.

Clete, thanks for staying with us.

Now, to reset, you're in there. You're awakened in the middle of the night. You hear voices, a party going on. They took it outside. Soon, you said an argument began. I also understand that you heard something that you said sounded like furniture being moving—moved around out there. And these—you said, I understand, that you heard a thud. Talk about that.

HYMAN: Yes.

Well, after the young men left the room, for the next about five minutes, you could hear someone going about the cabin and opening and closing cabinet doors. And it also sounded like they were actually moving furniture around. That went on for, like I say, five to seven minutes. And then it went out into the balcony.

SCARBOROUGH: What—what time was that, Clete? Clete, what time was that, about?

HYMAN: A little after approximately 4:20 in the morning.

SCARBOROUGH: So, they were cleaning up the place. Somebody was cleaning up the place at 4:20 in the morning.

HYMAN: Well, that was the assumption I made, that maybe that they were straightening up a little bit. However, the noise went out onto the balcony, and you could hear furniture being moved.

And then, at times, it sounded like furniture was being actually picked up and dropped, that they weren't too careful about the way they were moving the furniture. I only heard one voice in the cabin at that point. This—outside, the movement went—was sporadic. Stuff would be moved. Then there'd be some silence. Then furniture would be moved again. Then there was just total silence. This was probably maybe two minutes or so of total silence, and then that horrific thud.

Talk about that horrific thud.

HYMAN: Well, the thud, originally, my first thought was someone had fallen on the balcony, but it was way too loud for that. So, my next...

SCARBOROUGH: So, that night, you thought somebody may have

been—either fallen overboard or been thrown overboard and hit the balcony?

HYMAN: No.

At no point did I really—that didn't go into my mind, because the -

it actually reverberate in the room and on our balcony. So, I thought maybe someone had literally fallen on their balcony or that they had thrown furniture overboard. Because of the impact, it sounded like something very heavy. And my first thought was maybe throwing furniture overboard.

SCARBOROUGH: So, what happened the next morning when you woke up? Obviously, you heard the loud thud, went to sleep, woke up the next morning. What did you do then?

HYMAN: Well, a little after 7:00 in the morning, I had gone out to look at the scenery on our balcony as we were pulling into port, and I did look around the partition between our balcony and the balcony of the Smiths.

And I was curious whether, in fact, the furniture had been thrown overboard. However, everything was still on the balcony. I noted that the door going into the room was open, but there didn't seem to be anything of any importance.

SCARBOROUGH: So, so, the furniture—all the furniture was still up there, accounted for. So, obviously, the thud you heard was not a piece of furniture from the balcony. Did you talk to investigators that morning?

HYMAN: No, I did not. We went ahead and went into Kusadasi, Turkey.

We had a tour. And I did not speak to anyone until we returned.

SCARBOROUGH: And then you told them—then you spoke to investigators, told them what you're telling us here tonight.

Clete Hyman, thanks so much for being with us. We greatly appreciate you coming on and...

HYMAN: You're welcome.

SCARBOROUGH: ... and taking us inside the incredible events of that night. We greatly appreciate it.

HYMAN: You're welcome. Good night.

SCARBOROUGH: Now you're looking at exclusive video of an FBI reenactment that took place today after three new witnesses came forward with information that could possibly unlock the mystery of what happened to Natalee Holloway.

In a minute, we're going to be hearing from Natalee's dad, Dave, and also stepmom, Robin.

But, first, let's go to NBC Michelle Kosinski. She's, of course, in Aruba with the very latest.

Michelle, tell us about this new information, especially the one witness that stepped forward with possibly very helpful information in this investigation.

MICHELLE KOSINSKI, NBC CORRESPONDENT: All right.

We see the extraordinary reenactment happen this afternoon. FBI and local police have a chopper in the sky. They have the Kalpoe brothers' car parked in an area and this witness' car. This first witness who we're told came forward on Friday says that he was driving around the area near the Marriott Hotel and he spots the Kalpoe brothers, he says, with Joran Van Der Sloot in a car. He says this was about 3:00 a.m. the day Natalee Holloway vanished.

And this would be after the time the Kaipoe brothers said that they were already at home—Joe.

SCARBOROUGH: And, Michelle, this isn't just one witness that's come forward. I understand two others have come forward. What can you tell us about them and their stories?

KOSINSKI: Well, we have one who we're told has already talked to police who says he knows where on this island Natalee Holloway's body was placed. And then another witness, a woman, was identified today by the private investigator working for Natalee's family. She lives in the area right near where this reenactment happened, in fact.

And she says, maybe a couple days after Natalee disappeared, she sees a car fitting the description of the Kaipoes' car driving around repeatedly in that area, for whatever that is worth. But because of these witnesses, now we're going to see the volunteer searchers come back to this island as soon as possible with ground-penetrating radar. And they're going to search these two areas based on witnesses' statements.

Now, while this is going on, we see Natalee's mother today raise the reward for her safe return to a stunning level.

(BEGIN VIDEO CLIP)

BETH HOLLOWAY TWITTY, MOTHER OF NATALEE HOLLOWAY: We're going to be able to now raise the reward for the safe return of Natalee from \$200,000 to \$1 million. And we're just so hoping that, you know, any information that someone has or people just feel comfortable to please come forward. Still, the same applies as far as remaining anonymous.

(END VIDEO CLIP)

KOSINSKI: She says that million dollars comes from donations from a group of friends in the United States—Joe.

SCARBOROUGH: And, Michelle, I understand that the reward money for Natalee's safe return may have come about because of a possible sighting or at least rumors of sightings. What did you hear from that press conference about that?

KOSINSKI: Well, we know right now there's no hard evidence of anything like that.

But there are rumors all over this island. Of course, there has been no sign of Natalee here. So, of course, people speculate maybe she was kidnapped. We know the family's private eye has also had investigators working for him down in Venezuela to that effect. And, keep in mind, right now, the family just wants to draw out any information it can.

SCARBOROUGH: Now, didn't—did—we're looking at a map right now to show where Aruba is in relation to Venezuela.

But Jug—Jug Twitty actually came out and talked about that possibility today, didn't he?

KOSINSKI: Yes, he did. He said that that's just another possibility that he wants to explore.

And the point of grief that the family is right now, they want to take any bit of information, any lead, any possibility they can, and use everything they can to fully explore it. We also got news today that four new investigators are on this case.

And here's what Jug told us today.

(BEGIN VIDEO CLIP)

JUG TWITTY, STEPFATHER OF NATALEE HOLLOWAY: There's been rumors out there for, you know, many weeks, that we can't find her on the island here, that she's possibly in Venezuela, Curacao, all these places. And, hopefully, this will help. You know, if she's out there, if

people have information, that they can help us, you know, find her, that they will come forward. And, as Beth says, it's all anonymous.

(END VIDEO CLIP)

KOSINSKI: And four more investigators from Holland got on this case today. One of them is a behavioral analyst. And two others are interrogation specialists—Joe, back to you.

SCARBOROUGH: All right, Michelle, thanks so much for that report.

I tell you what. So long after Natalee has disappeared, so much starting to finally happen in this case.

Let's bring in Natalee's dad, Dave Holloway, and her stepmom, Robin.

Dave, remarkable, For as long as Natalee has been missing, for all of this activity to start happening, it sounds like things may be possibly moving in a direction where we can get some resolution in the case. What can you tell us about your reaction and the family's reaction to today's developments?

DAVE HOLLOWAY, FATHER OF NATALEE HOLLOWAY: Well, the gardener, his statement puts them back near the north of the Marriott.

In fact, the racquet club is located less—well, probably a quarter-of-a-mile to a half-a-mile across the field from the Marriott. So, it's a short distance away. So, that kind of gives us an idea that whatever happened occurred near that area. So, it's like, where's the haystack? We can find—find the needle.

SCARBOROUGH: You know...

D. HOLLOWAY: The island is just too large to look everywhere.

SCARBOROUGH: You know, and, Dave, also, remarkable—again, these timelines. When you go through these investigations, you know, when you talk to prosecutors, they're always trying to do a timeline to figure out what happened that night. Apparently, this one witness coming forward with possibly hard information that says the Kalpoe brothers and Joran Van Der Sloot weren't being truthful, that they were out as late as 3:00 a.m. That would change the investigation, wouldn't it?

D. HOLLOWAY: That's correct. We know that they left approximately 1:00 to 1:30. And then, when they left Carlos 'n Charlie's, you know, you didn't really have any idea, based on the number of statements that he made, you know, where they ended up. And this puts us back up near that area.

SCARBOROUGH: Remarkable.

Hey, stay with us, Dave.

And, Robin, also get back with you.

We've got a lot more to come, a lot ahead in the Natalee investigation.

Also, get the aspirin out, because this is going to give you a heck of a headache. She wanted to execute the perfect dive, but the board got in the way. We'll show you what happened coming up next.

And a little later, Jessica Simpson didn't even know it was happening. We'll tell you about the woman who posed as the new Daisy Duke assistant and got a lot of free booty.

Who wrote that in the script? Who wrote—Rich, was that you? Matt?

(COMMERCIAL BREAK)

SCARBOROUGH: This 17-year-old diver uses her noggin to get ahead.

We'll tell you her story coming up.

But, first, here's the latest news that you and your family need to know.

(NEWS BREAK)

(MUSIC)

SCARBOROUGH: The concert is to raise awareness about African death, but now rising anger over what your kids may have seen and heard.

And, if a picture is worth 1,000 words, wait until you see this video, the face-first mistake that will take your breath away.

Welcome back to SCARBOROUGH COUNTRY. Those stories coming up in minutes.

But, first, let's bring back Dave and Robin Holloway, a lot of developments in Aruba today.

Dave, let me ask you, is the FBI—we understand the FBI's getting more involved now. Are they keeping you and your family informed in what's going on in this investigation?

D. HOLLOWAY: They are. We have usually daily contact with the FBI if something develops. In fact, I spoke with them today. And they indicated that they're looking into the evidence. And it's not that they're going to do any investigative work. It's going to be simply a fact that they're going to look into it and put another set of eyes on it.

SCARBOROUGH: Are you pleased that they're allowed to get more engaged in this process?

D. HOLLOWAY: Absolutely. The more eyes you have on looking at something, maybe they'll uncover something that was missed early on. And, hopefully, that—that will be the case.

SCARBOROUGH: Robin, talk about the strain that this investigation has had. It continues on and on. Obviously, a lot of people believe the Aruban government's not doing enough—now the Aruban prime minister coming out. And it looks—again, it looks like there's starting to be outside pressure from Alabama officials and others. Do you think finally they're getting the message that we Americans aren't going to just sit back and let them cover up this case and this possible crime?

ROBIN HOLLOWAY, STEPMOTHER OF NATALEE HOLLOWAY: As far as boycotting Aruba, we don't think that's the answer. Just—I mean, Aruba, the people are just so sweet and good-hearted. And I don't think the answer is to boycott Aruba.

And we're just so grateful they're allowing the FBI be involved now. I mean, the evidence, for what we understand, is in Washington—not Washington, Virginia. And, just, you know, they have got access to that now. But it's stressful. It's a strain. It's—you know, it's -- 57 days is a long time. And, you know, we never dreamed it would go on this long. But we just—we just—we need answers soon.

SCARBOROUGH: It just—yes. It just—it does seem to continue on and on.

Dave, though, it looks like, again, the pace of this investigation finally starting to pick up.

I want to take you back, though, to what happened last week. We saw incredible footage of you talking to Paulus Van Der Sloot and actually giving him some items. Talk about that remarkable meeting.

D. HOLLOWAY: Well, we had a meeting prior to him going into the jail to speak with his son. In fact, I went to the jail to approach Joran about he professes his innocence. I want him to talk to me and profess that innocence.

Afterwards, I spoke with the father and asked him if he had talked to Joran. And he indicated that, in fact, he did talk. But his father had indicated that too much time had passed and that it wouldn't be permissible for me to speak with his son. But I did question him on a



number of things that had gone on, some of the things I saw on TV. And all of his responses were a negative, that he was not involved, the Kalpoe brothers were not involved, Joran was not involved, and on and on.

And, you know, we ended it with the fact that he understood my situation and that, as a father of Joran, he'd do anything to protect his son. And we...

(CROSSTALK)

SCARBOROUGH: And we understood that you gave him—gave him something. What did you give him?

D. HOLLOWAY: I gave him a Bible and one of the books that the other person had that was with me, a spiritual book, and then "The Purpose Driven Life." It's a 40-day book that—you know, it's all about God and it's not about you and everything revolves around God.

And, hopefully, they'll read it and understand that it is all about God and not themselves. And maybe they'll get something out of it.

SCARBOROUGH: How are you and the family holding up tonight?

D. HOLLOWAY: You know, you take every day as a new day and hopefully that it will come to an end.

And, you know, you just—as I said it earlier, you know, I left Meridian with a prayer that God will give us strength to get through this. And I continue to hold on to that prayer. In fact, my pastor came over today, and we had another prayer just to reinforce it. So, we're making it. It's tough. But we'll prevail in the end.

SCARBOROUGH: All right.

Well, Dave and Robin, know that our prayers and our thoughts are with you and the entire family. Thanks a lot for being with us tonight...

R. HOLLOWAY: Thank you.

D. HOLLOWAY: Thank you.

SCARBOROUGH: ... to get us up to date with the very latest.

Now, coming up next, I'll tell you what, a lot of parents across America concerned about a concert that was supposed to raise awareness about African poverty, how that concert ended up harming American kids. We're going to take a look at Live 8 and the parents group who says they want ABC to be fined because of what they showed that day.

And, also, she posed as Jessica Simpson's assistant to get a lot of free stuff. We'll tell you what happened when her booty was delivered.

(COMMERCIAL BREAK)

SCARBOROUGH: Now to a story that's stirring emotions out in California and across America, a piece of art that, among other things, shows the flag in the shape of the country being flushed down a toilet. But it's not hanging in a museum or a gallery. It's at the California Department of Justice Building in Sacramento.

Now, last week, we spoke with Karen Hanretty of the California Republican Party about it. Let's take a look and see what she said.

(BEGIN VIDEO CLIP)

KAREN HANRETTY, CALIFORNIA REPUBLICAN PARTY: The attorney general is arguing, well, if we take down this painting, that is somehow censorship. But I can guarantee you that the Democratic attorney general would never allow a painting of a gay pride flag to be floating in a toilet bowl and hung in his building. That would never happen.

(END VIDEO CLIP)

SCARBOROUGH: OK. Now, that was Thursday night.

Now let's get the other side of the story. We're joined by the artists, Stephen Pearcy, and his wife, Virginia Pearcy.

Steve, you just heard Ms. Hanretty talking about the art being displayed in the Justice Department. What's your response to her?

STEPHEN PEARCY, ARTIST: Well, I think she's purely speculating as to whether that kind of display would be shown.

In fact, there's a good chance that there will be such a display for conservative artists who show whatever types of images they want. I think that what the test will be would be whether an image would be—would rise to the level of a hate crime, not whether it's just merely objectionable or offensive to a particular group.

SCARBOROUGH: And, of course, you know, Stephen, obviously, when you put something that looks like the American flag in a toilet, you knew that was going to be offensive to, you know, the overwhelming majority of Americans. Sometimes, art is to provoke.

My question for you, though, is, that is certainly you're right, obviously. We have got a powerful First Amendment.

S. PEARCY: Right.

SCARBOROUGH: My question is, how in the world did it end up in a government building? That's what's so shocking to so many Americans.

S. PEARCY: Well, that's the ideal place for such a painting. It's—it evokes discussion. And what's wrong with evoking discussion in a public building? That's—that's what the public forums are all about.

(CROSSTALK)

SCARBOROUGH: Kind of like the Ten Commandments, right?

S. PEARCY: Right.

And it's basically—you know, again, this is not a religious depiction, so it's not quite like the Ten Commandments. But in terms of evoking discussion, political discussion, a public building is an ideal place. And these kinds of things will continue. The painting...

SCARBOROUGH: Well, let me ask—let me ask you this, though, because, I mean, that really does cut against all the arguments we've ever heard when you talk about the First Amendment, the Ten Commandments, or any religious display. People say, you have a right to do that out on the street corner. You have a right to talk about that in church.

S. PEARCY: Well, basically—right.

SCARBOROUGH: But you take it inside of a federal building or a state building, all of a sudden, you're impinging on my rights. You're offending me.

Obviously, you know, a picture of the flag going down the toilet is going to be offensive to probably 80 percent, 90 percent of Americans. Why put that in a building that taxpayers paid for?

S. PEARCY: Actually, what I have found is that the majority of Americans have agreed with that depiction. The majority of the people that I have spoken with and I think the majority of Americans...

SCARBOROUGH: What, the American flag down the toilet?

S. PEARCY: They agree that the country is going down the toilet, thanks to President Bush. And that image depicts exactly that idea.

(CROSSTALK)

SCARBOROUGH: You say the majority of people you talk to. Where do you live?

S. PEARCY: The majority of—I live in Sacramento and I live in Berkeley. But I'm talking about the polls across the country. They show now that the majority of Americans feel that the country has been taken down the toilet by the president. And...

VIRGINIA PEARCY, ARTIST: Yes. We're not advocating that people flush their flags down the toilet. What we're saying is that Bush is leading this country down the toilet because of his policies.

The Downing Street memos that have recently come out indicate that Bush intentionally misled this country into war.

S. PEARCY: And over 1,700 soldiers have died because of his lies.

And that's why his approval ratings are in the tank.

(CROSSTALK)

SCARBOROUGH: But, really, do you really think, though, that the proper place for this to be, again, is to be in a government building paid for by American tax dollars, that, again, obviously the majority of Americans—you can say that the majority of Americans are opposed to this war or opposed to Mr. Bush's foreign policy.

But, certainly, I'll guarantee you the majority of Americans don't like depictions of the American flag of their country being flushed down the toilet.

(CROSSTALK)

S. PEARCY: Yes.

SCARBOROUGH: You're not that separated from middle America, are you?

S. PEARCY: Any piece of artwork that would be displayed in a public building, someone can find political content.

And, for example, the artist might have been—an artist in a case might have been somebody who hated the draft or something. They say, well, that's a political—that's a statement. If you post any art that's been created by that artist, you're saying it's OK to evade the draft and you're endorsing that. Any kind of an argument could be made as to any particular piece of art. So, it certainly belongs in a public building, more so than your airwaves, for example, are owned by the public.

You're licensing the airwaves to use...

SCARBOROUGH: Right.

S. PEARCY: ... for your private purposes, but they're owned by the public. And this particular space in the building was temporarily attributed for private use. It's no different, really.

SCARBOROUGH: All right. All right.

Thanks a lot, Stephen. And, of course, you have brought up before, as has Virginia, that no tax dollars have been actually spent on this display. We appreciate you all being with us tonight.

S. PEARCY: And I think it's important—I think it's important to point out that we are trying to express a sign of patriotism through dissent. And I think that dissent is the highest form of patriotism. And...

SCARBOROUGH: Well, you'll get—you'll get no argument from me. But, again, an image of a flag in a toilet, I think there may be less offensive ways to dissent.

But thanks, again, for being with us tonight.'

S. PEARCY: OK. Thank you for having us.

(CROSSTALK)

SCARBOROUGH: We greatly appreciate it.

S. PEARCY: All right. OK.

(BEGIN VIDEO CLIP)

UNIDENTIFIED MALE (singing): Oh, who (EXPLETIVE DELETED) are you?

(END VIDEO CLIP)

SCARBOROUGH: That's The Who performing during a Live 8 performance a few weeks ago. Now, the bleep was over a certain four-letter word that most parents don't want their kids hearing.

But ABC, who aired the concert on tape delay, didn't bleep the F-word out. Now the Parents Television Council has filed a complaint.

With me now are Melissa Caldwell. She is a research director for the Parents Television Council. And also Alex Mar, she is the online news editor for "Rolling Stone" magazine.

Let's start with you, Melissa.

You think ABC should have massive fines levied against them. Tell us why.

MELISSA CALDWELL, PARENTS TELEVISION COUNCIL: Well, this is a question of commonsense decency. But, more importantly, it's also a question of law. You may recall that, a few years ago, a couple years ago, Bono, U2, used that same expletive during a broadcast of the Golden Globe Awards.

And the FCC came out and said, well, it can't be considered indecent because he's using it in the sense as an adjective. And after outrage from Congress and parents across the country, the FCC reversed itself. And it said, well, we're not going to issue fines in this instance, but henceforth, broadcasters are on notice that further utterances of this word on the broadcast airwaves will be considered indecent, and will lead to fines and forfeitures.

So, we're just asking for the FCC to be consistent in the application of the law.

SCARBOROUGH: And this is what ABC said in a statement:

"Unfortunately, one inappropriate phrase sung by one performer was initially missed and made it into the East Coast network feed. It was subsequently edited out of the West Coast feed."

You know, Alex, with a Bono situation, that was live. They didn't know what Bono was going to be saying at the Golden Globes Awards. But, in this case, "Who Are You?", what, I think that came out in 1978. It's a song most people know that were born, you know, before—or after 1960, at least. This was tape-delayed. ABC still failed to cut it out of the East Coast feeds. It seems like somebody dropped the ball there. Do you think they should be fined?

ALEX MAR, ONLINE NEWS EDITOR, "ROLLING STONE": Well, look, I think, I think, Joe, that, really, it's a matter of picking your battles.

And, in this case, you have one fleeting instance of the use of a four-letter word vs. an International Initiative to eradicate extreme poverty and famine on an entire continent. So, I think it's a little bit unfortunate that the PTC is choosing to use Live 8 as an example.

SCARBOROUGH: Melissa, what about that? I mean, you look at this concert, have all these artists that came together obviously to help try, whether you think they can do it or not, try to alleviate suffering in

Africa, whether it's AIDS or whether it's through poverty.

I mean, do you really think this is the proper forum for your organization to be attacking?

CALDWELL: Well, I don't want to undermine the worthiness of the cause, but consistency is very important.

If the networks are led to believe that the FCC is going to excuse it in this instance because it was—well, it was a worthwhile cause, then why wouldn't broadcasters believe that the FCC would excuse it in future instances? If you're not consistent, broadcasters are not going to take the decency laws seriously and they're not going to take the appropriate steps to edit out this kind of language, when it's so easy to do, especially when there are children in the viewing audience.

SCARBOROUGH: So, Melissa, what do you want ABC to do? If they step forward and say, you know what, we made a terrible mistake, we're very sorry, is that good enough for you? Or do you think they—do you want them to be fined and do you want all of their affiliates that ran this program to be fined also?

CALDWELL: It seems sort of a shame to make a test case out of ABC, because I do believe they were trying to make an effort to edit out most of the offensive language. This is one that slipped past them.

You know, if they make a good-faith effort in the future to edit out obscene language from broadcast, whether live or on tape delay, I think that would be a great step. But I think it's important for the FCC to be consistent in the application of the law.

SCARBOROUGH: Alex, what do you think about all of this? I'll give you the final thoughts.

MAR: Well, I think one thing that's important to keep in mind is that the PTC is advocating a significant increase in the maximum penalty for incidence of indecency on air.

Congress has proposed as high as half-a-million dollars for a single incident of indecency. And, you know, let's keep in mind that indecency is defined as possibly something as basic as a cuss word. And what you have is a situation where the artists are ultimately going to suffer, because the networks, rather than take a risk at scheduling an edgier artist, you know, in the chance that that person may slip up on live TV, they may institute a ban against that artist, as we saw with NBC a few months ago and the band Motley Crue.

When they were in the middle of promoting their new C.D., they were effectively banned from the network for using a curse word on live TV.

*This is a partial transcript from "On the Record," February 13, 2006, that has been edited for clarity.*

**GRETA VAN SUSTEREN, HOST:** New questions about what really happened the night George Smith disappeared from his honeymoon cruise. George was partying with four young men that night and their versions of the night's events do not match up with what other witnesses told police.

The lawyers for two of those young men join us now. Albert Dayan is the lawyer for Rusty Kofman. He joins us live in New York. And, Keith Greer, the attorney for Josh Askin is live in San Diego.

Keith, first to you, let's talk about the Absinthe that they were drinking that night. What's the origin of that? Who brought it to the ship?

**KEITH GREER, ATTORNEY FOR CRUISE SHIP PASSENGER:** Step back just one first, Greta, there has been no statement the boys have made which has been inconsistent anywhere and I want to address that if we get a chance. But the Absinthe you had some questions about that specifically?

briefly they leave the disco about 3:30 in the morning. The boys take Georgé back to his room. They get there a little after 3:30, get to the room, stay there for a little bit and notice that Jennifer's not there. They were making noise obviously. The people on both sides of the room heard them at that time, very consistent.

George wanted to go find where Jennifer was. The boys didn't want him to go alone. They decided to help him. They took George down to the solarium and the Jacuzzi area where they couldn't find Jennifer.

They went back to the room at that point in time and put George to bed a little before four o'clock and left the room, again stayed there very briefly, again very consistent with both Clete Hyman and Pat and Greg's comments on either side of the cabin.

**VAN SUSTEREN:** All right, well my understanding from Clete Hyman is that he heard a thud about 4:05, called security at that point and that sometime later, which is inconsistent with at least your recitation of the facts and maybe you can somehow reconcile that, is that he later saw three people leave the room so that's inconsistent in my mind.

**GREER:** Right. Yes, Greta, actually I pulled all the prior transcripts today and went over all of Clete Hyman's statements and he's very clear at four o'clock he'd been awakened for the second time that evening. He was upset. There was a call made to security. The boys left.

Clete at that time said he looked outside the room and saw three boys going down the hall. Why he didn't see a fourth boy we don't know. It's a very narrow hallway. A couple of the boys are larger. Did one of the boys leave sooner? We don't know. We know that the boys left together and went down to have room service.

Clete then says he hears for a period of time a single voice in the room, doors opening and closing, drawers opening and closing abruptly, furniture being moved. Then that going out onto the deck with some furniture being moved, about two minutes of silence and then the, what's been described as a horrific thud when we now know George fell off which is about 4:20 in the morning according to Clete Hyman.

Around 4:15 in the morning, according to one of the guests, Denise, the young girl who also heard it and woke up that night. At that point in time, the boys had been in their room already, had ordered room service and, as you know, pictures have been produced that the boys took at that time when they got back to the room in the first place but then when the room service finally showed up and they had a stack of food plates, you know, six feet high and took a picture.

One point I wanted to make tonight, Greta, was some of the other attorneys have said that's not consistent or doesn't make sense why you would take pictures of yourselves and of all this food at 4:10 in the morning.

**VAN SUSTEREN:** Actually, I don't have a problem with that. I should tell you this is full disclosure, Keith, we only got 15 seconds but we've done that on our show on the road, taken pictures of food, so that one, that one isn't...

**GREER:** But, Greta, this was a younger brother. This was the younger brother...

**VAN SUSTEREN:** Anyway, we have to take a quick break.

**GREER:** ... that the older brothers came home drunk and the younger brother was...

**VAN SUSTEREN:** All right, let me just take a quick break. We'll be right back in just a moment.

(COMMERCIAL BREAK)

**VAN SUSTEREN:** We're back with the lawyers for two of the last people to see honeymooner George Smith alive. Albert Dayan joins us live in New York and Keith Greer is live in San Diego.

Albert, this timeline I'm trying to piece together and you showed me some pictures and you told me there was room service ordered. Do you have a receipt or anything that we can sort of, you know, that corroborate your client's statement about what time room service was ordered and what time it was delivered?

**ALBERT DAYAN, ATTORNEY FOR CRUISE SHIP PASSENGER:** Well, you must take into account that we cannot really account for the timestamp on the camera. I mean that can vary a minute or two on each way, whether you add it or subtract it from the timestamp on the camera.

The easier way to find out what time that phone call from room service was made if you inquire as to the ship's log, telephone log I'm sure they register every call that's made from every room, especially if it's for food service. You can also ask for food registry as to what time the food was ordered and what time that food was delivered and I think that that would dispel any concern about whether the timestamp on the camera was accurate.

**VAN SUSTEREN:** I take it, Albert, that you don't have access to the boat information and that the cruise line has it and that's something you can't get those receipts, telephone logs.

**DAYAN:** Well, I'm sure that the FBI did get access to that information and I believe that upon review of that information that they had ascertained that the boys were actually in the room when this horrific thud is heard.

**VAN SUSTEREN:** Albert, how many times has your client talked to the FBI or has your client even testified before the grand jury?

**DAYAN:** Well, it's interesting you raise this because I had heard a camp of lawyers for the Smith family, particularly Mrs. Smith, make very irresponsible allegations about the boys' version of the events and that they had somehow conspired and maybe built this version of events.

These boys have not spoken. Most of these boys have not spoken to each other. Mr. Greer and I had just recently have communicated with each other. And, if these boys did conspire to give one story, consistent story to the FBI they would definitely not leave someone like Kaufmann, who is my client and let him speak to the FBI on three separate occasions.

**VAN SUSTEREN:** Keith, how many times has your client talked to FBI or any law enforcement or Turkish authorities?

**GREER:** Yes, the Turkish authorities a couple of times, the FBI on the boat and then two subsequent lengthy interviews.

**VAN SUSTEREN:** And how recent was the most recent one with the FBI?

GREER: Back in September I believe.

VAN SUSTEREN: Do you know, Keith, if this is still an active investigation? Do you have any communication with the FBI on this?

GREER: Yes, it's definitely still ongoing, Greta.

VAN SUSTEREN: Did they give you any idea of when, you know, when they intend to sort of, you know, close this up one way or the other?

GREER: Absolutely no idea at all.

VAN SUSTEREN: How did you client, Keith, learn that George Smith had disappeared?

GREER: It was that next morning when he was sitting in the room right next to Jennifer and the people from the boat came in and told Jennifer "Your husband's overboard. We think he's dead." And, Jennifer heard it the same time Josh heard it.

VAN SUSTEREN: What brought him to that room and it's right next to the purser's office but why did he go there at that hour?

GREER: Yes, most of the family was already off the boat getting ready for a tour and when Josh went to get off the boat it was his sea pass seized up and they wouldn't let him off the boat.

VAN SUSTEREN: So they already knew that he had...

GREER: And so they said "You need to go back to guest services." They sent him back to guest services.

VAN SUSTEREN: So they knew at that point that George was missing and that he had been seen with George the night before is that your assumption?

GREER: Even if they hadn't been seen with George my client had mentioned to his statesman outside the door when he heard George being paged that George had been drinking a lot the night before and they might need to send somebody to his cabin because he might not respond to the page due to the previous night's activities.

VAN SUSTEREN: All right, Albert, Keith, thank you both.

George Allen Smith IV, an attorney, and his wife Jennifer Hagel Smith an elementary school teacher were on their honeymoon cruise.

George went missing on day 8 of the cruise between Turkey and Greece.

George Allen Smith IV and his wife were in the casino. There, they met several other passengers and became friends. It was reported by several passengers George, and possibly Mrs. Smith were drinking Absinthe, which is not sold on the cruise ship. For info on Absinthe - [click here](#)

Walter Zalisko, a police officer who was a passenger onboard, says George Allen Smith IV was openly stating that he had \$50,000 cash with him on the cruise, money, at least in part, he got for a wedding gift.

Several passengers reported that his wife appeared to be flirting with Lloyd Botha, an assistant manager at the casino who tagged along to the disco with the group, after the casino closed. They say she was so intoxicated she could barely stand up, and was hanging on one male in the casino, which may have been incorrectly assumed to be flirting.

At that point several passengers report hearing George call his wife a 'hussy'. Then, they claim, she pushes him back, then swiftly kicks him in the groin. Passenger Margarita Chaves witnesses this act. George bends over in severe pain, and she wanders out of the casino, "with an attitude" according to one passenger, not be seen again until after George is presumed to gone overboard. The casino assistant manger, quickly follows Jennifer out to the disco.

However, Lloyd's attorney, Andrew Rier says that is not what happened. Rier claims there are ship records to prove that Lloyd did not leave the disco with Jennifer. "The timeline at 3:20 puts Botha in his room and the Smiths are still upstairs in the disco along with these Russian gentlemen," he explains. The record of entry into Lloyd's cabin, shows Lloyd entered his cabin at 3:20. Lloyd says he has nothing to hide, and takes an FBI polygraph later. His attorney says, "He took a polygraph examination. And by the time we left the FBI, if Lloyd ever, for a moment, was a person of interest, I can categorically state that he no longer was when he left."

Royal Caribbean says it was actually someone from the bar staff who escorted Jennifer out. "He helped her to the elevator, got her to the ninth deck, where her cabin was. She said she was OK," says McCrary. "Then this crewmember went back about their duties."

Mrs. Smith strongly denies kicking George, but acknowledges that she was so drunk, she doesn't remember leaving the casino, or where she went from there, only a couple minutes after the alleged kick.

George is extremely intoxicated according to several passengers, and is helped back to his cabin by two Russian speaking brothers, Greg and Zach Rozenberg, a third Russian speaking man, Rusty Kofman, who is their cousin from Brooklyn, and an english speaking man. The english speaking man is Josh Askin, who is traveling with his family, as they celebrated his parent's 25th wedding anniversary. Josh confirms this event.

After arriving at his cabin, #9062, one of the men, Rustislav 'Rusty' Kofman, says they all left to try to find Mrs. Smith, to no avail, and

A police officer, Clete Hyman, and his wife in the cabin next door, reported hearing George (presumed) return to his cabin with others on several nights and hearing the sounds of loud parties.

**THE TIMELINE - THE CASE UNFOLDS**

**4:02am** - Kofman's attorney says there was no drinking at that time. They brought George back to his room, and put him to bed. He says George was so grateful they brought him back to the room that he kissed one of the young men.

**4:02am** - Josh Askin says there was no party, he used the restroom in George's cabin, while the Russians tucked George in bed.

**4:15am** - Clete Hyman reports hearing a verbal argument between three, maybe four individuals in the Smith's cabin on the balcony. He says the argument went on for a couple moments, then he heard male voices say goodnight. This part of the story is different from that told by Josh.

Clete Hyman reports hearing people leaving the cabin, opened his door to look out, and saw **three** men leaving the cabin. There were reports that **four** men helped George to his cabin.

Capt. Bill Wright, senior vice president of fleet operations for Royal Caribbean, said that the investigation has found that **four** passengers did indeed escorted George back to his cabin on the night that he vanished.

**4:20am/4:25am** Clete Hyman hears one man talking, and furniture moving. Then it is silent. There was a couple minutes of total silence.

Pat Lawyer didn't hear what Clete Hyman thought was a drinking game—but they did hear that same moving about of furniture, and she said it sounded like the cabin was being trashed. She says that all of a sudden there was a lot of noise coming from the cabin next door, the George Smith cabin, and what it sounded to me like is somebody was throwing things against the wall, like throwing furniture in the room against the wall or against the floor

**4:30am** - Clete Hyman and Pat Lawyer hear the sound of a horrific thud. The sound was so loud, it reverberated through our cabin, and it sounded like somebody fell out on the balcony.

**4:30am** - After the awful thud, both the deputy chief and the couple heard knocks— two sets of raps on the Smith cabin door about 4:30 a.m. It was security. Greg Lawyer opens her cabin door and looks out in the hall at them, and tells them. "Hey, you guys, you better get in there because that room is trashed." The cruise line confirms they were ship's security officers responding to the noise complaint Clete Hyman made just after 4:00 a.m. Security walks away without further investigating, because all is quiet.

**4:30am** - The Russians say they are back in their cabin, they order a huge amount of food from room service, and it is delivered around 4:45am. The group took photos of the room service because they were amazed at the amount of food.

**4:30am** - Mrs. Smith is found sleeping on a floor in a hallway, on the other side of the ship, right outside a crew only room, and five doors down from Josh's cabin. She is unable to make it back to her cabin. Ship personnel arrived and remained with Mrs. Smith while two crew members went to her cabin to find her husband, but the cabin was empty. A wheelchair is brought to take her to the cabin.

**4:47am** - Jennifer arrives back to her cabin. At that time George is not there, and ship staff do not notice any blood in the room. More oddly, security nor the female crew member who accompanied Jennifer to her room, find the room trashed as described by neighbors on both sides of the Smith cabin.

**5:15am** - Josh Askin arrives at this cabin, and goes to bed.

**6:14am** - The ship arrived in Kusadasi, Turkey

**6:39am** - passengers were cleared to go ashore

**8:30am** - Teenager Emilie Rausch, her sister, and her mother reported seeing what appeared to be a bloody stain several feet long on the almost 12-foot wide metal canopy over the life boats below passenger balconies. A tally of passengers is done, and three are found missing. Mr and Mrs Smith and another passenger. The third passenger is located, and the ship begins to page the Smiths.

**8:30am** - Mrs. Smith had reported for their 'couples massage' appointment an hour and half early, four hours after being put to bed, drunk, according to her and the account of other passengers. She reports to the massage right after other passengers found the blood outside and reported it.

She was wearing the same clothes she had on the night before. No blood was seen on her clothing. It was at the massage appointment where she was retrieved and brought to security, where she was told that it was suspected something happened to her husband, and he may have gone overboard.

**8:30am** - There's a knock on Rusty's cabin door, and he hears somebody say "Wake up, we have a missing person on a ship," Rusty says he thought they were talking about Jennifer because they had gone looking for her the night before.

**8:41am** - The ship's Chief Officer entered the Smiths' cabin, and determined the cabin was empty.

What You Should Know Before You Decide to Vacation on a Cruise Ship

**To whom are the cruise lines responsible, if anyone?**

Before George was murdered on Royal Caribbean's Brilliance of the Seas, we had sailed on cruise ships as a family many times. We wish now that we had known before George booked his honeymoon cruise the extent to which crimes do occur on cruise ships and the fact that when crimes do occur onboard cruise ships, it is unclear who, if anyone, has authority to investigate such crimes. It is now our mission to educate the public about what we have learned.

Cruise line corporations incorporate in countries such as Liberia and Panama and the boats themselves are flagged with different countries' flags such as the Bahamas. Cruise ships then sail in waters that are either international or belonging to another specific country. An additional player in the jurisdictional puzzle is the country of the next port of call which may be different from the countries described above. As a consequence, if a crime or other incident happens at sea, there is serious confusion as to which country has jurisdiction and which country should investigate the incident. It is questionable the extent to which Liberia, Panama, the Bahamas and other countries have adequate resources or incentives to investigate crimes onboard cruise ships particularly those that occur in other countries' or international waters.

Because cruise ships are foreign flagged and incorporated, they are able to avoid paying U.S. taxes and avoid U.S. regulation to a large extent. Although these cruise line corporations use our ports, sail in our waters, have their corporate headquarters in Miami and carry our citizens, they are not even required to report crimes and other incidents to the FBI or any other U.S. law enforcement agency. By their own admission, cruise line corporations voluntarily report crimes to U.S. law enforcement agencies. One of the major issues that a cruise crime victim or his or her family encounters is that cruise lines have reverse incentives when faced with a possible crime. If a crime on a cruise ship is made public (as in my brother's murder), the fact that crime does occur on cruise ships is exposed in the media, bookings become soft and their profit margins slide.

Thus, cruise line corporations have incentives to minimize the extent to which crimes are reported and made public. When crimes are underreported and covered up, cruise ships can continue on their journeys at full capacity with cruise passengers left unaware of the possible dangers that may await them onboard.

Carrier reserves the right to refuse to permit any Passenger to take on board the Vessel or on any mode of Transport any item Carrier deems inappropriate.
- (b) Unless negligent, Carrier is neither responsible nor liable for any loss of or damage to Passenger's property. Liability for loss of or damage to Passenger's property in connection with any air or ground transportation shall be the sole responsibility of the provider of the service and in accordance with applicable limitations.
- (c) Carrier's liability for loss or damage to property is limited to \$300.00 per Passenger unless Passenger declares the true value in writing and pays Carrier before embarkation or before arriving for the start of the RCT Land Tour (whichever is earlier) a fee of five percent (5%) of the amount that such value exceeds \$300.00. In such event, Carrier's liability shall be limited to its true declared value, but not exceeding \$5,000.
- (d) In no event shall Carrier be liable for loss of or damage to jewelry, cash, negotiable paper, photographic/electronic equipment or other valuables unless they are deposited with Carrier on the Vessel for safekeeping against receipt (RCT may not accept valuables for deposit). Carrier's liability for loss of or damage to valuables so deposited shall not exceed the amounts indicated in Clause 2(c).
3. No undertaking or warranty shall be given or shall be implied as to the seaworthiness, fitness or condition of the Vessel or any food or drink supplied on board.
4. Any medical personnel, masseuse, hair stylist, manicurist or other service providers on board the Vessel or on Transport are provided solely for the convenience of Passenger. Such persons are independent contractors and not acting as agents or representatives of Carrier. Carrier assumes no liability



whatsoever for any treatment, diagnosis, advice, examination or other services provided by such persons. Passenger shall pay for all medical care requested or required, whether aboard or ashore, including the cost of any emergency medical care or transportation incurred by Carrier.

5. All arrangements made for or by Passenger for air transportation, shore excursions, ground tours, ground transportation, hotels, restaurants and other similar activities or services are made solely for Passenger's convenience and are at Passenger's risk. The providers of such services are independent contractors and are not acting as agents or representatives of Carrier. In no event shall Carrier be liable for any accident or harm to Passenger which occurs off the Vessel or the Transport as a result of any acts, omissions or negligence of any independent contractors.

6. Carrier may for any reason, at any time and without prior notice, cancel, advance, postpone or deviate from any scheduled sailing or port of call, or substitute another vessel or port of call, and shall not be liable for any loss whatsoever to Passenger by reason of such cancellation, advancement, postponement, substitution or deviation. In connection with a Cruise/Tour, Carrier may for any reason, at any time and without prior notice, cancel, advance, postpone or deviate from any scheduled departure or destination, or substitute another railcar or bus or destination or lodging or other component of the Cruise/Tour, and shall not be liable for any loss whatsoever to Passenger by reason of such cancellation, advancement, postponement, substitution or deviation. By way of example, and not limitation, Carrier may deviate from any scheduled sailing and may otherwise land Passenger and his property at any port if Carrier believes that the voyage or any Passenger or property may be adversely affected as a result of hostilities, blockages, prevailing weather conditions, labor conflicts, strikes onboard or ashore, breakdown of vessel, congestion, docking difficulties or any other cause whatsoever. Similarly, by way of example, and not limitation, Carrier may at its discretion elect not to visit a location shown on your itinerary. Carrier reserves the right to substitute a hotel for the planned hotel, provided that Carrier shall make commercially reasonable efforts to provide a comparable hotel.

7. Carrier shall have the right to comply with any orders, recommendations, or directions whatsoever given by any governmental entity or by persons purporting to act with such authority and such compliance shall not be deemed a breach of this Contract.

8. Refunds for Passenger cancellations prior to sailing or the first day of the Cruise/Tour (whichever occurs first) are limited by the terms of Carrier's refund policy. Passengers are advised to consult the Carrier's cruise brochure for the terms of Carrier's refund policy.

9. All Passports, visas and other travel documents required for embarkation and disembarkation and at all ports of call are the responsibility of Passenger.

10. Passenger, or if a minor, his parent or guardian, shall be liable to, and shall reimburse Carrier for, any damage to the Vessel, the Transport or any property of Carrier caused directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, by any willful or negligent act or omission on the part of the Passenger, and Passenger, or if a minor, his parent or guardian, shall further indemnify Carrier, the Vessel and the Transport and each and all of their agents and servants against all liability which Carrier, the Vessel or the Transport or such agents or servants may incur towards any person or company or government for any personal injury, death or damage to property caused directly or indirectly, in whole or in part, by any willful or negligent act or omission on the part of Passenger.

11. IT IS AGREED BY AND BETWEEN PASSENGER AND CARRIER THAT ALL DISPUTES AND MATTERS WHATSOEVER ARISING UNDER, IN CONNECTION WITH OR INCIDENT TO THIS CONTRACT SHALL BE LITIGATED, IF AT ALL, IN AND BEFORE A COURT LOCATED IN MIAMI, FLORIDA, U.S.A., TO THE EXCLUSION OF THE COURTS OF ANY OTHER STATE, TERRITORY OR COUNTRY. PASSENGER HEREBY WAIVES ANY VENUE OR OTHER OBJECTION THAT HE MAY HAVE TO ANY SUCH ACTION OR PROCEEDING BEING BROUGHT IN ANY COURT LOCATED IN MIAMI,

12. (A) NO SUIT SHALL BE MAINTAINABLE AGAINST CARRIER, THE VESSEL OR THE TRANSPORT UPON ANY CLAIM RELATING TO LOSS OF OR DAMAGE TO PROPERTY UNLESS WRITTEN NOTICE OF THE CLAIM, WITH FULL PARTICULARS, SHALL BE DELIVERED TO CARRIER AT ITS PRINCIPAL OFFICE WITHIN TEN (10) DAYS AFTER TERMINATION OF THE VOYAGE OR THE CRUISE TOUR (WHICHEVER IS LATER) WHICH THIS CONTRACT RELATES; AND IN NO EVENT SHALL ANY SUCH SUIT FOR ANY CAUSE AGAINST CARRIER, THE VESSEL OR THE TRANSPORT RELATING TO LOSS OF OR DAMAGE TO PROPERTY BE MAINTAINABLE UNLESS SUCH SUIT SHALL BE COMMENCED (FILED) WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS AFTER THE TERMINATION OF THE VOYAGE OR THE CRUISE TOUR (WHICHEVER IS LATER) AND PROCESS SERVED WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS AFTER FILING, NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW OF ANY STATE OR COUNTRY TO THE CONTRARY.

(B) NO SUIT SHALL BE MAINTAINABLE AGAINST CARRIER, THE VESSEL OR THE TRANSPORT FOR ANY CLAIM, INCLUDING BUT NOT LIMITED TO, DELAY, DETENTION, PERSONAL INJURY, ILLNESS OR DEATH OF PASSENGER UNLESS WRITTEN NOTICE OF THE CLAIM, WITH FULL PARTICULARS, SHALL BE DELIVERED TO CARRIER AT ITS PRINCIPAL OFFICE WITHIN SIX (6) MONTHS FROM THE DAY CAUSE OF ACTION OCCURRED; AND IN NO EVENT SHALL ANY SUCH SUIT FOR ANY CAUSE AGAINST CARRIER, THE VESSEL OR THE TRANSPORT BE MAINTAINABLE UNLESS SUCH SUIT SHALL BE COMMENCED (FILED) WITHIN ONE (1) YEAR FROM THE DAY WHEN THE CAUSE OF ACTION OCCURRED AND PROCESS SERVED WITHIN THIRTY (30) DAYS AFTER FILING, NOTWITHSTANDING ANY PROVISION OF LAW OF ANY STATE OR COUNTRY TO THE CONTRARY.

(C) THE CARRIER HEREBY DISCLAIMS ALL LIABILITY TO THE PASSENGER FOR DAMAGES FOR EMOTIONAL DISTRESS, MENTAL SUFFERING OR PSYCHOLOGICAL INJURY OF ANY KIND UNDER ANY CIRCUMSTANCES, EXCEPT TO THE EXTENT SUCH DISCLAIMER IS PROHIBITED BY 46 U.S.C. §1183C. (B) WITHOUT LIMITING THE PRECEDING SENTENCE, IN NO EVENT WILL CARRIER BE LIABLE TO PASSENGER FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL, EXEMPLARY OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES.

(D) THE EXCLUSIONS OR LIMITATIONS OF LIABILITY OF CARRIER SET FORTH IN THE PROVISIONS OF THIS CONTRACT SHALL ALSO APPLY TO AND BE FOR THE BENEFIT OF AGENTS, INDEPENDENT CONTRACTORS, CONCESSIONAIRES AND SUPPLIERS OF CARRIER, AS WELL AS OWNERS AND OPERATORS OF ALL SHORE-SIDE PROPERTIES AT WHICH THE VESSEL OR THE TRANSPORT MAY CALL, AS WELL AS OWNERS, DESIGNERS, INSTALLERS, SUPPLIERS AND MANUFACTURERS OF THE VESSEL OR THE TRANSPORT, OR ANY COMPONENT PARTS OF EITHER, TOGETHER WITH THE EMPLOYEES AND SERVANTS OF EACH OF THE FOREGOING.

13. Passenger, or if a minor, his parent or guardian, shall be liable to Carrier, the Vessel and the Transport for any fines or penalties imposed on the Vessel, the Transport or Carrier by any authorities for his failure to observe or comply with local governmental laws or regulations, including requirements relating to immigration, customs or excise.

14. Passenger warrants that he and those traveling with him are fit for travel and that such travel will not endanger themselves or others. Carrier reserves the right to terminate a Passenger's cruise or RCT Land Tour or both at any time, at the risk and expense of the Passenger disembarked, when in the opinion of Carrier, Passenger is believed to be a danger to himself or a disturbance or danger to others.

Carrier shall not be required to refund any portion of the fare paid by any Passenger who fails for any reason to be onboard the Vessel or the Transport at the time of the Vessel's or the Transport's departure from the port of embarkation or any port of call or destination or point of departure as the case may be and shall not be responsible for lodging, meals, transportation or other expenses incurred by Passenger as a result thereof. Carrier shall have no obligation to any Passenger to deviate from any scheduled sailing or port of call or destination.

16. Carrier has the exclusive right to include photographic, video and other visual portrayals of Passenger in any pictorial medium of any nature whatsoever for the purpose of trade, advertising, sales, publicity or otherwise, without compensation.

Passenger acknowledges and confirms that any travel agent utilized by Passenger in connection with the issuance of this ticket is, for all purposes, Passenger's agent and Carrier shall not be liable for any representation made by said travel agent. Passenger shall at all times remain liable to Carrier for the price of passage.

18. In addition to the restrictions and exemptions from liability provided in this Contract, Carrier shall have the full benefit of any applicable laws providing for limitation and exoneration from liability, and nothing in this Contract is intended to operate to limit or deprive Carrier of any such statutory limitation of or exoneration from liability. Without limiting the foregoing, Carrier claims benefit of all restrictions, exemptions and limitations of the "Convention Relating to the Carriage of Passengers and Their Luggage by Sea" of 1974 as well as the Protocol to the "Convention Relating to the Carriage of Passengers and Their Luggage by Sea" of 1976 ("Athens Convention"), which limits the liability of the Carrier for the death of or personal injury to a passenger to no more than the applicable amount of Special Drawing Rights as defined therein, and all other limits on damage or loss to personal property.

19. This Contract contains the entire agreement between Carrier and Passenger and supersedes any other agreements, written or oral, relating to the subject matter. Any waiver of any provision of this Contract must be made in writing and signed by Carrier. If any portion of this Contract shall be determined to be invalid, then said portion shall be deemed severed from the Contract in such jurisdiction only and all remaining portions shall remain in full force and effect.

## GETTING READY

Whether you're cruising the warm Caribbean seas or a glacial Alaskan bay, you will have to be prepared. We're here to help you get started.

### WHAT SHOULD I PACK?

Days onboard are casual, so you'll be most comfortable in sportswear or resort wear. Shoes should be low-heeled for deck activities. Bring a few swimsuits (so you'll always have a dry one). Ashore, you'll need comfortable walking shoes. For evenings, count on three basic types of attire.

**Casual:** sundresses or slacks and blouses for women; polo shirts and trousers for men  
**Smart Casual:** dresses or pantsuits for women; jackets for men.  
**Formal:** cocktail dresses for women; suits and ties or tuxedos for men.

If you're cruising to the Caribbean, Mexico or other warm weather destinations, bring a hat for protection from the sun. If your cruise vacation will take you to Alaska, Canada/New England or Northern Europe, be sure to pack a jacket and several sweaters. We recommend that you hand-carry all travel documents, medication and any personal items that will meet your needs until your luggage is delivered to your stateroom. Luggage delivery aboard may take a few hours.

### EVENING ATTIRE

The following will help you plan your evening attire onboard the ship:

- 3-5-night cruises 10-12-night cruises
- One formal night Two formal nights
- Two or three casual nights Three smart casual nights
- All other nights are casual All other nights are casual
- 6-9-night cruises 13-15-night cruises
- Two formal nights Three formal nights
- One smart casual night Four smart casual nights
- All other nights are casual All other nights are casual

Each ship also offers a variety of casual dining options each night.

### WHAT TRAVEL DOCUMENTS AND IDENTIFICATION DO I NEED?

Bring all the cruise documents contained in this booklet (please fill out any necessary forms prior to leaving home) and proper

identification. A valid passport is necessary for all international cruises. On domestic voyages, U.S. citizens will not be allowed to embark the ship without acceptable proof of identity.

### WHAT IS CONSIDERED ACCEPTABLE PROOF OF IDENTITY?

Documents that will be accepted as proof of identity are:

- Passport (either valid or expired).
- Original or certified copy of your birth certificate along with a federal, state or local government photo ID card.
- A voter's registration card or a Social Security Card is not acceptable.

- Naturalization papers (original or certified copy) with federal, state or local government-issued photo ID card.
- Non-U.S. citizens residing in the United States must present a valid Alien Registration (i.e., Green Card) prior to boarding the ship.

### WHAT IF I AM TRAVELING TO EUROPE OR GOING TO AN EXOTIC DESTINATION?

Failure to bring valid travel and health documents such as passports, visas, vaccination certificates, etc. will result in denial of embarkation. If you are a U.S. citizen, Royal Caribbean will provide the forms necessary for your cruise to an exotic destination.

Note: For full information on travel documents, please see a travel agent or a vacation planner.

### WHAT ABOUT HAIR-DRYERS AND LAUNDRY?

For the benefit of our guests, all Royal Caribbean ships provide hair-dryers. For a very sensible fee, we'll do your laundry and dry cleaning in just one day. We do not provide irons in staterooms as they constitute a fire hazard. There are no self-laundry facilities aboard.

## GETTING TO THE SHIP

In no time, you'll be onboard and ready to embark on the most adventurous vacation of your life. Here is the information you need to get there.

### HOW EARLY DO I NEED TO ARRIVE?

You should plan to arrive at the pier at least two hours before the ship is scheduled to depart. Boarding times vary by itinerary. It is your responsibility to arrive on time.

Please check your itinerary in the front of this booklet for confirmed boarding time. In preparation for prompt departure, cruise check-in will close 30 minutes prior to sailing. Guests arriving after this will not be permitted to board. For security reasons, guests are not allowed to bring visitors onboard our ships in any port.

### WHAT IF MY FLIGHT IS DELAYED?

If you have purchased an optional CruiseCare® Vacation Protection Plan, you'll be reimbursed up to \$500 to cover accommodations, meals and "catch-up" transportation - as long as the airline delay was caused by covered reasons. Otherwise, either you or the airline are responsible for any expense incurred to meet the ship at its next port of call.

### HOW DO I GET TO THE SHIP?

That depends on whether Royal Caribbean arranged your transportation or whether you arranged your own transportation. For information on how to get to the ship, please refer to the documents found in the upfront section of this booklet.

### CAN I LEAVE MY CAR AT THE CRUISE TERMINAL?

Most of the time you'll find parking (charged at a daily rate) located near the cruise terminal. Please refer to the documents found in the upfront section of this booklet.

### HOW DO I CHECK IN?

Please have all forms completed prior to leaving home. Simply present your cruise documents and identification to one of our agents. They will check you in and issue you a SeaPass™ card, which will serve as your identification card for boarding and re-boarding the ship, as well as your charge card for any onboard purchases. You will also receive our Welcome Aboard flyer, which will answer the questions most frequently asked during boarding. You can also fill out guest information forms on our website. Click on "Before You Board" to get started.

### HOW DO I FIND OUT ABOUT AND PAY FOR SHORE EXCURSIONS?

You can purchase your shore excursions online by visiting our website, www.royalcaribbean.com, any time of the day or night. To prebook an excursion, you will need your cruise reservation number, ship name and sailing date.

Once you have completed your purchase, an immediate recap of the selected tours will be provided along with a final e-mail confirmation when your credit card purchase is approved. Your purchased tour ticket(s) will be delivered to you in your stateroom. Kindly note that you have up to 10 days prior to your sail date to purchase your shore excursions online. Once within the 10-day sail date deadline, the booking system is closed and tours are no longer available for pre-booking. From this point, all guests must book their excursions onboard the vessel on a first-come, first-served basis.



## GETTING SETTLED

### HOW DO I PAY FOR

#### ONBOARD PURCHASES?

Royal Caribbean offers SeaPass™, a convenient way for you to pay for all of your onboard purchases and shore excursions. To open up a SeaPass account, just present your Visa, MasterCard, American Express, Carte Blanche, Optima, Diners Club International, JCB or Discover Card, and we'll take care of everything. On the final morning of your cruise vacation, an itemized statement of your account will be delivered to your stateroom. We accept cash in the casino, for gratuities and for foreign exchange on applicable itineraries.

#### WHAT ABOUT CASH, CHECKS AND FOREIGN CURRENCY?

Guest Relations at the Purser's Desk or casino can cash a personal check for up to \$200 – or for \$250, if you are an American Express cardholder. Personal checks are not accepted for purchases aboard the ship. U.S. dollars and traveler's checks are accepted in most ports. Guest Relations at the Purser's Desk will cash traveler's checks, large U.S. bills, Canadian dollars and pounds sterling on applicable itineraries and currencies. (In Europe, all ports offer exchange services.)

#### CAN I CALL HOME FROM THE SHIP?

You can make ship-to-shore calls from your stateroom, 24 hours a day. The cost is \$7.95 per minute and will be automatically charged to your SeaPass account.

#### WILL MY FRIENDS AND FAMILY BE ABLE TO CONTACT THE SHIP?

Your friends and family can contact the ship by dialing (888) 724-SHIP (7447). They can call (732) 335-3285 for access from outside the U.S. The cost is \$7.95 per minute and can be charged to their American Express, MasterCard or Discover. (From outside the U.S., additional long distance charges will apply.)

#### IS THERE A CODE OF CONDUCT?

For the safety and comfort of our guests, Royal Caribbean has developed a set of Guest Vacation Guidelines for both adults and children. If Royal Caribbean determines that certain guests are in violation of these guidelines, we may be forced to ask the offending party to leave the ship at the next available port of call. Please make sure to familiarize yourself with these guidelines, which are located in the Guest Services Directory found in your stateroom.

#### IS THERE A SAFE PLACE TO STORE MY VALUABLES?

A limited number of safety deposit boxes are available at Guest Relations at the Purser's Desk, free of charge to our guests. In addition, safes are available in most staterooms.

#### TIPPING GUIDELINES

To thank those who have served you well, we suggest the following guidelines:

- Dining room waiter: \$3.50 a day per guest
- Stateroom attendant\*: \$3.50 a day per guest
- Assistant waiter: \$2.00 a day per guest
- Headwaiter: \$0.75 a day per guest
- Gratuities for other service personnel are at your discretion.

\*If sailing in a Suite, please use this as your guide for stateroom attendant: \$5.75 a day per guest.

Please note: All gratuities can be added to your SeaPass account onboard for your convenience. A 15% gratuity will be automatically added to your bar bill or wine check when you are served.

## BEVERAGE POLICY

### WHAT ABOUT ALCOHOLIC BEVERAGES?

Guests are not allowed to bring alcoholic beverages of any kind onboard for consumption or any other use. Alcoholic beverages that are purchased duty-free from the Shops On Board or at ports of call will be stored by us and delivered to your stateroom on the last day of your voyage. A member of our staff will be at the gangway to assist with the storage of your purchases.

### WHAT ABOUT DRINK PACKAGES?

We now offer an Unlimited Soda and Juice Package and a Wine and Dine Package. Both of these packages provide guests with substantial savings during their cruise. You should take note that both packages are available for sale onboard each ship for a limited time only on the day of departure. Please ask a staff member to direct you once onboard so you don't miss this opportunity. ### WHAT ABOUT WINE?

Royal Caribbean has a state-of-the-art wine list that beautifully represents "The romance of the sea, the passion of wine and the elegance of Royal Caribbean" please review our complete list by visiting [www.royalcaribbean.com](http://www.royalcaribbean.com). A limited selection is available for preordering; please see page 9 for selections.

### WHAT IS THE DRINKING AGE ONBOARD?

Royal Caribbean International's age policy for consumption of alcoholic beverages is as follows:

- For all Alaska itineraries guests must be 21 years old to consume any alcoholic beverages.
- Guests 21 or older may consume any alcoholic beverages on any sailing.
- Guests 18 – 20 may consume beer and wine (except for Alaska) if the parent or legal guardian has signed a waiver granting permission. The waiver may be requested at check-in or at the Purser's Desk onboard. Guests 18–20 without a signed waiver will not be allowed to drink. This policy subject to change without notice.
- Applicable age restrictions apply while the ship is in port, in accordance with local age limitations.

- Providing alcohol to a minor is a violation of our Guest Vacation Guidelines and will not be tolerated. Please review our Code of Conduct in the "Getting Settled" section for details.

### INOCULATION / HEALTH

As detailed in our brochure, all guests must ensure that they are medically and physically fit for travel. The Centers for Disease Control (CDC) and the World Health Organization (WHO) provide guidelines as to which vaccinations are required in each country. In many cases inoculations are recommended but in some circumstances they are required. We recommend that you check with your health care professional or a Travel Medicine Specialist certified by the WHO for guidance. ### FAMILY LEGAL DOCUMENTS

Adults who are not the parent or legal guardian of any minor child traveling with them are required to present the child's valid passport and visa (or certified copy of the child's birth certificate) and an original notarized letter signed by at least one of the child's parents. The notarized letter from the child's parent must authorize the traveling adult to take the child on the specific cruise and must authorize the traveling adult to supervise the child and permit any medical treatment that must be administered to the child. If a non-parent adult is a legal guardian, the adult must present a certified Certificate of Guardianship with respect to the child.

### TRAVEL ADVISORY

We hope you enjoy your time on shore, visiting the fascinating ports and cities of Europe. Please take a moment to review these traveler tips that will help protect you from any misfortune, especially from criminals who prey on tourists. Criminals often target museums, monuments, restaurants, train stations, hotels and beach resorts, airports, subways, and ATM machines.



- ✔ Carry limited amounts of cash and credit cards, and leave valuables and personal documents locked in your stateroom safe or in some other secure location.
- ✔ Be aware that thieves often work in pairs or groups, where one person distracts you and an accomplice performs the robbery. For example, a stranger might wave a map in your face and ask for directions, or someone might "inadvertently" spill something on you, just to distract you from the act of theft.
- ✔ "Good Samaritan" scams may occur. A passing motorist might point to your car and indicate you have a mechanical problem, and when the vehicles are stopped, a theft may take place when you are checking the "problem."
- ✔ Do not leave valuables in a parked car. Also, while driving, keep the doors locked, windows rolled up, and valuables out of sight. Small items such as cameras, luggage, and briefcases are sometimes stolen from parked cars.

The overwhelming majority of cruise guests will have a trouble-free visit. But it is always wise to be alert and take precautions. We hope you have a healthy and enjoyable cruise vacation.

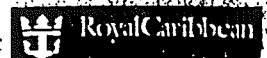

The days ashore present an invitation to adventure, education, and enjoyment. Organized Shore Excursions give you the opportunity to explore the many fascinating places you will want to see. To ensure the best possible sightseeing, Royal Caribbean has planned a varied program of excursions ranging from simple to sophisticated, in tune with existing conditions in each port. These excursions are arranged and operated by independent agencies, with experienced guides to escort you. This brochure lists the descriptions of the available Shore Excursions at each port of call. Most Shore Excursions may be purchased in advance. Certain excursions are limited in the total number of participants; therefore, for your convenience, we recommend you advance purchase. Also, please note that all tour duration times are approximate and can change without prior notice.

## General Information

---

### When should I reserve my Shore Excursions?

This brochure contains brief descriptions of tours available. Please book your excursions as soon as possible since some shore excursions can accommodate only a limited number of participants. Tours are sold on a first-come, first-serve basis and we recommend that you purchase them in advance of your cruise in order to avoid disappointment. An order form is included with this brochure. Royal Caribbean must receive the order form and payment at least 20 days before sailing. You will be notified if a tour of your choice is not available. On board, you may purchase tours through the interactive TV system in your stateroom (if available), by booking form dropped at the excursion desk or directly at the Shore Excursion Office during the hours advertised in the ship's daily program.

### How can I book shore excursions in advance via the Internet?

You can purchase your shore excursions online by visiting our website, [www.royalcaribbean.com](http://www.royalcaribbean.com) at any time. To pre-book an excursion, you will need your cruise reservation number (obtained from your travel agent or reservation agent), ship name, and sailing date. Once you have completed your purchase, an immediate recap of the selected tours will be provided along with a final e-mail confirmation when your credit card purchase is approved. Your purchased tour ticket(s) will be delivered to you in your cabin. Kindly note that you have up to 10 days prior to your sail date to purchase your shore excursions on-line. Once within the 10-day sail date deadline, the booking system is closed and tours are no longer available for pre-booking. From this point, all guests must book their excursions on board the vessel on a first-come, first-serve basis. Your stateroom attendant will deliver your purchased ticket(s) to your stateroom on the evening of boarding. If you do not receive your tickets in your stateroom, please inquire at the Shore Excursion Office as soon as possible.

### How strenuous are the Shore Excursions in each port of call?

Most of the cities you will be visiting during your cruise vacation were built without regard for the modern conveniences and freedoms we may take for granted today. They offer quaint, narrow, cobblestone streets, and large bustling walkways that have been in existence long before the advent of motorized transportation. To preserve their antiquity, many cities and old towns are pedestrian-only, and may not be conveniently accessible for guests with mobility impairments. All of the Shore Excursions require some degree of mild, moderate, or strenuous walking. Likewise, venues that have grand entryways, multiple stories, and sprawling gardens, make stair-climbing a necessity. To assist our guests, we have rated each Shore Excursion within this brochure by the amount of walking and stair climbing needed to fully participate in the excursion as indicated by the tour description.

The Shore Excursions presented in this brochure require the guests to use a coach or other forms of transfer which will require you to step up 2 to 3 steps, approximately 10 inches high each. Most (but not all) coaches used can accommodate collapsible wheelchairs to be stored in the luggage compartment underneath the coach. However, it should be noted that escorts, drivers, guides, and shipboard staff are not obliged to lift guests into the vehicles. Lift-vans and/or coaches are not available in all ports of call. Tendering may preclude guests in wheelchairs from going ashore at certain ports of call. For further information, please check with the Shore Excursion Office on board immediately upon arrival.

Due to the various celebrations taking place during the year 2005, kindly note that certain circumstances may arise where the tour content or itinerary may have to be altered without prior notice. This is beyond the control of either the local tour operator or Royal Caribbean International.

Please note there are certain excursions that for safety reasons, age, weight, and/or height restrictions apply. The individual vendors impose these restrictions and Royal Caribbean International must comply accordingly.


Guests wishing activity type tours (i.e. biking, kayaking, hiking, etc.) should be in excellent health and make themselves aware of the physical, age, and fitness requirements before making a value judgment as to whether or not to participate. Any guest with limitations, or who have had recent surgery, pregnancy, or are taking prescription drugs, should check with the excursion office before booking any activity type tours.

By booking the excursion, you are also confirming that you and your party are in good physical and mental condition and have no history of seizures, dizziness, fainting, heart conditions or respiratory problems. You also confirm that no one is taking medicine that carries a warning about impairment of physical or mental abilities.


For the comfort of all our guests, smoking is not permitted aboard any sightseeing vehicle or transport.

Kindly note the below symbols act only as a guideline and guests must make their own judgment regarding participating in tours.


#### Mild

 To fully participate may require leisurely walking over primarily even surfaces. There may be a limited number of steps, a minimal amount of cobblestones or uneven surfaces, and some standing for extended periods of time.


#### Moderate

 To fully participate may require extended periods of walking over even and uneven surfaces, steep terrain and/or water activity in a slight current. There may be steps, inclines, cobblestone surfaces, and extended periods of standing. Participants with physical limitations should take this into account.


#### Strenuous

 To fully participate may require extended periods of physical exertion, extensive walking, climbing, or biking. There may be numerous steps, inclines, cobblestones, and other rough terrain throughout the excursion. These excursions are the most active and have been designed for participants in excellent health and very good physical condition.


#### Dress Code

 Conservative attire is recommended when going ashore on this tour. No exposed shoulders or knees. Short pants and tank tops are not acceptable.


#### Meals

 Most tour departures complement the ship's meal service hours. If a meal is served on an excursion, it will be designated with this symbol.


#### Light Snack / Refreshment

 If a light snack or refreshment is served on an excursion, it will be designated with this symbol.

#### Shopping

 Time permitting, limited shopping is available during the tour.

#### Waiver

 All participants on this tour are required to complete a waiver and/or release form. This document will be distributed by the tour operator prior to commencing the tour.

### What is a Tender Port of Call?

There are some ports where the ship remains at anchor. Either the ship's boats (tenders) or local boats will be used to transport you back and forth between the ship and shore.

### What do Shore Excursions include?

Shore Excursions include transportation according to the itinerary, meals, refreshments, guides, and entrance fees as indicated. Fares for Shore Excursions are subject to change without notice. All prices quoted are based on tariffs and exchange rates current at the time of printing, and are subject to increase with or without previous notice consequent upon any increase in the basic tariff and/or exchange fluctuations, which may accrue prior to commencement of the tours.

Prices of shore excursions are quoted per person and generally include available local transportation, ranging from coaches, taxis, limousines, and boats. Meals and local taxes are included where specified. Where tours are operated by car, 2 to 3 persons are allocated to each vehicle. Prices do not include any expenses incurred in returning to the ship should it be elected to leave the group before the tour is completed.

### When and where do Shore Excursions depart?

Most tours will meet in a lounge on board the ship prior to departing. When the ship is at anchor, staff will be on hand to assist you to the departure point.

Timings have been established according to information received from the local Agents but are subject to alterations should the vessels arrival time at the port be delayed or circumstances arise whereby the itinerary for a particular excursion must, necessarily, be amended. Guests should be mindful of the fact that at ports where the ship lies at anchor, the afternoon excursions commence from the dockside, not the ship. Guests should, therefore, allow at least 30 minutes for the tender ride to shore.

When booking more than one tour in a day, please allow at least 60 minutes between the return of the first tour and the departure of the second tour.

Tour departure times may vary from those listed on the order form, especially in ports where the ship must tender guests ashore. Please check your tour tickets for the time and location of departure. No announcements for the tours will be made on board the ship.

### Is it possible to Miss the Ship?

All guests are required to be back aboard ship no later than 30 minutes prior to the scheduled departure time, which is listed in the Cruise Compass and posted at the gangway. The scheduling of all Shore Excursions conforms to this requirement. If you leave a tour en route; however, it will be your responsibility to secure transportation and return to the pier on time. If for any reason a ship's excursion is delayed, the ship will be notified and await the tour's return.

### What type of transportation is used for Shore Excursions?

Standards of transport vary considerably; however, Shore Excursions utilize the best quality transportation possible in each port. Air-conditioned vehicles are not always available nor do all tour buses have restroom facilities on board. Please note that some countries have local restrictions and/or zoning laws that prohibit the use of the on board facilities and prohibit the idling of engines while parked at the various venues. The air-conditioning systems may not be to North American standards. Please also bear in mind that cars, taxis or mini-buses may be used in some ports where coaches are not available or are limited.

### What if I wish to take the same coach as my family or friends?

Guests wishing to travel with friends should proceed to the point of departure as indicated on your shore excursion tickets, as this will help the tour staff to allocate space in the same vehicle.

#### What if I wish to tour on my own?

Guests who do not join these prearranged shore excursions must, therefore, rely on whatever transportation equipment might be available, and they are advised that the drivers are not under supervision. Such drivers may not be informed of the sailing hour of the ship and it is not certain that they will follow routes that are more desirable. In addition, considering the limited transportation facilities in some ports, relief cars may not be obtainable in case of breakdowns along the road. Tours are the best way of seeing the country during a stay at a cruise port of call and they have been arranged so the guests see as much of interest as possible.

#### Will transportation be available from the ship to city centers?

Many ports are not located in the city center. For the convenience of guests, a shuttle bus service has been arranged (for a nominal fee) in those ports that are located approximately 1 mile or more away from the closest city center and do not have adequate local transportation available. This service is set up to complement local transportation, and guests are welcome to utilize local services, when and where available. Details of which ports will have a charged shuttle service will be advised on board the ship. Tickets will be available for sale only on board.

#### How should I tip our Guide/Driver?

Extending a gratuity to your guide or driver is strictly optional; however, in some countries, these personnel may anticipate that if you are pleased with their services, you will reward them in a monetary way. A commonly accepted guideline is USD \$1.50 per person for a half-day tour and USD \$3 per person for a full-day tour.

#### How can I find out more about the ports we'll be visiting?

During your cruise, informative Port Explorer videos will be shown on a selected television channel in your stateroom. A Port Explorer pamphlet with general information and a city map highlighting Places of Interest will also be delivered to your cabin. For additional independent information, please consult the onboard Discover & Shopping Guide.

#### Will I miss meals when I go ashore?

Most tour departure times complement the ships meal service hours, so you can enjoy your meal aboard and then go ashore. However, if you take more than one tour in a day, your return on board may not coincide with meal hours. You will be informed of meal times before arrival in each port. Full day tours include meals where indicated.

#### What should I wear?

Some countries may have more conservative ideas about dress than you are accustomed. So as not to offend local opinion, it is suggested that you dress conservatively. It is suggested when visiting places of worship (temples, mosques, etc.), you should avoid wearing shorts, tank tops or revealing clothing. Guests should wear comfortable walking shoes at all times. When visiting ruins or walking on cobblestone streets, wear rubber-soled shoes. It is also smart to wear a sun hat, protective sunscreen, and sunglasses.

#### Will I have time to shop?

Whenever possible, shopping time has been allocated within the framework of the excursions. However, tours are not designed for shopping, and time is limited.

#### How do I pay for Shore Excursions on board?

The only way to pay for Shore Excursions on board is through your shipboard credit system for which you sign up after boarding the ship.

\*Children's tickets are available on some tours for guests aged 4 years to 12 years (inclusive). Guests aged 13 and over will be charged the adult price. A parent or guardian must accompany guests under 18 years of age. Infants 3 years and under will be carried free of charge, subject to them not occupying a seat.

### What about my Travel Documents and Identification?

As a reminder to our guests, kindly be advised that passport, visa and inoculation regulations may vary by destination and change from time to time. It is the sole responsibility of the guest to obtain and have available when necessary the appropriate valid travel and health documents such as passports, visas, vaccination certificates, etc., that are necessary for air travel, disembarkation at the various ports of call and re-entry into the appropriate country of origin.

**SeaPass Card:** Remember to take your SeaPass Card with you whenever you go ashore. It will serve as your Identification Card, which you will be required to show to the officer on duty before re-boarding the ship.

## Terms and Conditions

Royal Caribbean International reserves the right to cancel any Shore Excursion due to inclement weather conditions, or for any other reason whatsoever, and shall not be liable for any loss whatsoever to guests by reason of such cancellation. Full refunds will be made to guests holding tickets for canceled Shore Excursions.

The Tour Operator reserves the right to withdraw any tours due to lack of demand and to make any alterations deemed advisable for the comfort of guests, bearing in mind the convenience and best interest of each group.

Itineraries are expected to be operated as described in the brochure but the right is reserved to change or omit a place to be visited or the sequence of the tour, in accordance with conditions or circumstances prevailing at the time of tours, with or without previous notice; bearing in mind the convenience and best interest and safety of guests. The right is also reserved to decline, to accept, or retain any person as a member of any party at any time.

### Personal Possessions

Personal articles such as coats, cameras, handbags, etc., are the guest's responsibility. Do not leave your possessions unattended at any time.

### Responsibility

Shore Excursions are operated by reputable local agencies and have been thoroughly checked by Royal Caribbean International for full interest and value. Shore Excursions are offered for sale by Royal Caribbean International as a convenience to our guests. While great care has been taken to offer the finest excursions available in each port, these tour services are provided by independent tour operators and Royal Caribbean International will not be responsible or liable for any loss, damage, injury, costs or delays resulting from, or in connection with, your use of these services. Royal Caribbean International acts only as the agent of the supplier of these services and does so on the express condition that no liability of any kind, howsoever caused, shall attach to Royal Caribbean International or its agents, servants or employees in connection with or arising there from.

All tickets, coupons, and vouchers issued by Royal Caribbean International for Shore Excursion arrangements made on behalf of guests are expressly subject to the terms and conditions of the person or company providing such transportation facilities ashore.

### Refunds of Prepaid Excursions

Any refund request of prepaid excursions received by Royal Caribbean International 10 days prior to sailing will be made in full (unless noted otherwise). Refund requests made on board after the Shore Excursion Office closes ticket sales for that particular port will not be accommodated.

### Refund of Excursions Purchased On Board

Tours purchased on board may be refunded at any time prior to the Shore Excursion Office closing ticket sales for that particular port. Refund requests made on board after the Shore Excursion Office closes ticket sales for that particular port will not be accommodated. If notice of cancellation is received after closing date and hour, a refund can be assured only in the event of the ticket being resold.

Closing times will be published in the Cruise Compass. No refunds will be made for failure to use all of the described services included in the tour price. Should any tour have to be abandoned due to difficulties en route, the best possible refund will be arranged according to the circumstances. Please note that tour lengths noted in this brochure are approximate.

No refunds are made to any guest who might cancel, deviate, leave, or otherwise not utilize all of the services scheduled to be provided by an excursion. Members of any excursion who elect to leave the automobiles or motor coaches, in the shopping area, or elsewhere, must provide their own transportation at their own expense back to the landing place of the vessel. Should any such excursion; however, be abandoned through force majeure the best possible refunds will be arranged according to the circumstances.

#### Cancellations and Refunds of Overnight Excursions and Flightseeing Tours

Overnight Excursions and Flightseeing tours may be canceled and the full tour price refunded at any time up to 30 days prior to the sailing date of the cruise. A 10% cancellation fee will be applied to all cancellations made from 30 days to 15 days prior to the sailing date of the cruise. Due to the booking requirements in the countries visited, no cancellations or changes may be made within 14 days prior to the sailing date of the cruise, or on board the ship.

#### Cancellations

Shore Excursions are subject to cancellation or modification, depending on the number of guests participating. In the event of a tour cancellation or modification, the Shore Excursion Manager and/or staff will give advance notice. Certain tours have a minimum-booking requirement, or must be limited to a maximum number of participants. If the minimum number for participation is not achieved, the excursion will be cancelled. In this event, an alternative may be offered; otherwise, a full refund will be given.

#### Reservations / Cancellations

Shore Excursions are available for purchase once you are aboard the ship and en route to your destinations except where otherwise noted, within the deadline advertised in the ship's daily program. Very shortly after each closing time and date, final confirmations are sent from the ship to the Agencies concerned informing them of the definite and final requirements for meals, seats, number of automobiles and motor coaches, etc. If notice of cancellation is received after closing date and hour, a refund can be assured only in the event of the ticket being resold. However, in the event of any of the shore excursions having to be canceled, full refund will be made and upon tendering of same Royal Caribbean shall be free of all liability in respect thereof. The closing dates and hours for all tours will be announced in the daily issue of the ship's program.

### Additional Information

**GUIDE SERVICES AND TRANSPORTATION EQUIPMENT:** In certain interesting but off the beaten track places, professional guides are at a premium. The best available and obtainable guides of competence are engaged. It is exceptional for drivers of public hire vehicles to speak any language but their own. Transportation equipment used for the shore excursions is the best available in the ports of call. In some ports, it is not possible to obtain buses or taxis equipped with air conditioning or bus or taxis with air conditioning that meets North American standards.

When choosing a tour, please keep in mind that you are a visitor in a foreign country; some luxuries to which you are accustomed may not be available. To get the most out of your excursion, please notice, feel, experience, and enjoy the local cultures, conditions, and customs.

With the popularity of some ports of call, the excursion itineraries and order of the actual tour may be changed at the discretion of the local operator, with or without notice, in order to give the best service possible under the prevailing local conditions.

**NIGHT EXCURSIONS** vary throughout the world's cruise ports. Many hotels have international-type acts, others national dances or folklore shows. Some ports are renowned for nightlife while others are more conservative. We aim to take you to the most generally accepted shows, but do not expect to find Paris standards at every port of call.   Before returning home from your cruise vacation, a tour of this lively Mediterranean city should not be missed! Please be aware that at certain times there may be a mass taking place in St. Peter's Basilica, without previous notice. In the majority of cases, the guide(s) will give an explanation or description from the outside and guests will be allowed to enter the Basilica individually. Depending upon the number of people in the Basilica, it may be closed for security reasons. These safety precautions are beyond the control of the local tour operator or Royal Caribbean International.

This typical village stands at the top of a rocky hill overlooking the Maremma region. Tuscany dates back to the 9th-century BC. Although a terrible earthquake destroyed parts of the village in 1971, Tuscany's Etruscan and Renaissance buildings have been beautifully restored and still reflect the Etruscan history. You will enjoy a walk with your guide through the narrow cobblestone lanes of this charming village and also take in the views of the surrounding valleys. There you will visit the Basilica of St. Pietro, a beautiful Church of the VII century and rebuilt in the XII century. The church is characterized by its rose window that represents the symbol of the four Evangelists.

Leaving Tuscany, you will proceed to a local family-owned farmhouse that produces olive oil, vegetables, biscuits, jams, wine and a various collection of liquors. On arrival, gain insight into the history of olive oil production and enjoy sampling a variety of different oils with typical bruschetta bread, tomatoes, homemade jam and honey, all accompanied by local wine and liquors. The town has gone through different stages and has preserved its medieval appearance, perched as it is on top of a hill and enclosed within an intact wall from which towers, palaces and churches overlook the sea and dominate the territory spreading out for almost 28,000 hectares.

At the entrance of the city walls, you will begin your cycling tour. Visit the Romanesque Church of San Francesco, the largest church in Tarquinia with its arches that reach great heights, before seeing the Town Hall Lodge, a XIV century building. The Cathedral with its impressive facade and the Palazzo dei Priori a massive urban fortification, was built in the first half of the XV century by Cardinal Vitelleschi who was a powerful plenipotentiary and supreme strategist of the Roman Curia. Continue the circuit to the southern part of the walls by the district of Santa Maria in Castello. It is there the group will choose between an easier or more difficult route to reach the farmhouse. After a short ride, you will reach the farmhouse where the production of homemade products including olive oil and wine are granted by the direct cultivation of their own land. After a presentation of the local products, lunch will be served. At the lunch's conclusion, your coach will take you back to the pier.

Note: There are approximately 3.75 miles of cycling over grass, gravel and cobblestone surfaces on this tour. Participants must be in good physical condition, comfortable using hand brakes and confident on a bicycle. Participants must be at least 60 inches (150 cm) in height. Participants should be aware that there are certain inherent risks involved in any cycling excursion. A parent or guardian must accompany children under the age of 18 years. Please wear the appropriate walking or sports shoes and dress comfortably. This tour will operate rain or shine; therefore, participants should take the appropriate weather gear with them, carry a backpack for belongings and take extra bottled water to stay hydrated during the ride.

You will return to the coaches through the Arcadian Way that still bears groove marks from ancient chariot wheels. At the Ephesus Archeological Museum, you'll be escorted through the many exhibits tracing the religious and chronological history of the ancient city. Filled with attractively displayed mosaics, statuary and other artifacts, the museum exhibits several marble statues of the Mother Goddess Artemis, goddess of nature, childbirth and the harvest. Overlooking Ephesus are the remains of St. John's Basilica, a once great church built on a 2nd century tomb thought to hold the remains of St. John. While the church is now in ruins, there are many frescoes, mosaics, and graceful columns that attest to the glory that marked the place where St. John, the Evangelist, lived and died. There will be time for browsing and shopping once back in town or you can return directly to the ship.

   While perhaps less grand than Ephesus, the ruins of Priene, Miletus and the holy sanctuary of Apollo at Didyma present a marvelous overview of the ancient world.

Drive through the colorful town of Kusadasi, along the coast, and the countryside among the cotton fields and the olive groves to reach the ancient city of Priene. The setting is dramatic with steep Mont Mykale rising behind the town and the broad flood plain of the Meander River spreading out at its feet. You will discover the Hellenistic theater, which used to seat 5,000 spectators, the beautiful ruins of the Temple of Athena and the agora (marketplace) of the town.

You will also travel to see the ancient city of Miletus; its theater rises to greet you as you approach the flood plain. Miletus was a great Ionian Port, as important in antiquity as Ephesus, as was famous for being the native city of several philosophers and sages. The theater, reconstructed during the Roman period, is an impressive structure built against the slope of a hill and which is the only monument left of the Ancient Miletus along with the well-preserved Faustina Baths. A typical lunch will be served in a local restaurant in the town of Didim before beginning your visit to the Temple of Didyma, which was not a town in antiquity but the home of the God Apollo. It is believed that the first temple was constructed in 560 BC, then replaced by the Hellenistic temple that was used for nearly 500 years until Christianity forbade the consulting of the oracles. By design, the beautiful temple is encompassed by a double row of columns, some 120 in all. There will be time for browsing and shopping once back in town or you can return directly to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2.5 miles over uneven and cobblestone surfaces, inclines, and 20 - 40 steps. In Priene, guests will have a steep 10-minute climb from the parking lot to the heart of the ancient town. Touring the above venues will require continual standing and/or walking for approximately 2 hours. Comfortable walking shoes, hat and sunscreen recommended. Tour order may vary in order to avoid congestion at the venues. The drive between Kusadasi and Miletus is approximately 1 hour and the drive between Didyma and Kusadasi is approximately 1.5 hours, dependent upon traffic conditions.

Continuing the tour, the next stop is at the ancient site of Miletus, which was a great Ionian Port, with two lions guarding its entrance. Miletus was the native city of several philosophers and sages. The theater, reconstructed in the Roman period, is an impressive structure built against the slope of a hill. The ruins of the Faustina Baths are well preserved and the Agora area is strewn with delicately carved white marble ruins. You will travel to Didim where a typical lunch will be served at a local restaurant.

After lunch, you will continue to Didyma, to admire the magnificent Temple of Apollo, a great monument of antiquity. Many times looted and burnt, the sanctuary's elegant beauty is still impressive. Some of the 120 columns that remain standing allow one to visualize the full magnificence of the structure. You will have time for shopping and browsing back in town or you can return directly to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 3 miles over uneven and cobblestone surfaces, inclines and 10 - 40 steps. Touring the above venues will require continual standing and/or walking for approximately 3.5 hours. Comfortable shoes, a hat and plenty of sunscreen are recommended. Tour order may vary in order to avoid congestion at venues. The drive between Kusadasi and Miletus is approximately 1 hour and the drive between Didyma and Kusadasi is approximately 1.5 hours, dependent upon traffic conditions.

**KDG - Temple of Artemis, St. John's Basilica & House of Virgin Mary**

   This tour is designed for guests who are unable to make the long walk at Ephesus but still want to visit the areas holy sights. You'll travel through the small town of Selcuk, dominated by its graystone Byzantine fortress en route to the Temple of Artemis, built in honor of the Greek goddess of hunting, wild nature, and fertility. Deemed as one of the seven wonders of the ancient world, the Temple of Artemis used to be the largest marble temple in the ancient Greek world since it was four times as big as the Parthenon in Athens, Greece. The temple served as both a marketplace and a religious institution. Offerings by thousands of pilgrims each year enabled the temple to grow so wealthy that it became the world's first bank. Today, little remains of the magnificent structure. Your guide will describe its importance, its wealth, and the tension that existed between the Romans and the Christians that settled in the area over the centuries.

Overlooking Ephesus are the remains of St. John's Basilica, a once great church built on a 2nd century tomb thought to hold the remains of St. John. While the church is now in ruins, there are many frescoes, mosaics, and graceful columns that attest to the glory that marked the place where St. John, the Evangelist, lived and died. From the early days of Christianity, the devoted have accepted this site as a place of pilgrimage.

The House of the Virgin Mary is where the Blessed Virgin is reputed to have spent the last years of her life. A stigmatized German nun who had never been to Ephesus had a vision of the House of the Virgin Mary and described it in detail to the German writer Clemens Brentano who later published a book about it. Inside the tiny house is a peaceful shrine with a statue of St. Mary, which was found when the ruins of the house were discovered. The site was made famous by the travels of Pope Paul VI and Pope John Paul II. Outside is the Fountain of Our Lady, providing the faithful with water from the holy foundation. There will be time for browsing and shopping once back in Kusadasi or you can return directly to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.5 mile (1.45 hours) over even surfaces, slight inclines with 2 - 3 steps to enter/exit the coach.

## Livorno (Pisa), Italy

---

Throughout Europe, please be aware that ongoing restoration work is being carried out in many of the towns, cities and venues visited which is beyond the control of Royal Caribbean International.

Due to the high volume of visitors and to help preserve the historic towns and centers, many cities have strict parking regulations. This may involve extensive walking from the bus parking lot to the various venues and sights visited. During the peak summer months you may encounter large crowds in each city or venue. Due to this reason, local guides may decide to alter the tour itinerary and the order in which it is accomplished. It may not be possible to visit all sites listed and there may be long lines (queues) to enter the popular venues. This is beyond the control of the local tour operator or Royal Caribbean International. It is suggested for guests to leave all valuables on board the ship and be careful of pickpockets.

All sightseeing will be on foot since large coaches are not allowed in the main center of Florence. The majority of the walking will be over cobblestone streets or flat even surfaces. Proper attire that covers shoulders and knees is recommended for both men and women for visits to the religious venues. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended.

During the months of October through June, most major shops are closed holidays, Sunday and Monday mornings, and daily from 1:00 pm until 4:00 pm. During the months of July through September, major shops are closed on holidays, Saturday and Sunday afternoons, and daily from 1:00 pm until 4:00 pm. While major stores will be closed on the days listed above, most leather and souvenir shops will be open.


The drive between Livorno and Florence is approximately 90 minutes, subject to traffic conditions. The best quality transportation has been obtained for the journey, however, the vehicle's air-conditioning system may not be to North American standards. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended for every shore excursion.

### LVA - Florence & Pisa

 The Renaissance began in Florence when, from the 13th to the 15th centuries, a profusion of poets, painters, sculptors and architects poured out an endless stream of exquisite art. Home to the Leaning Tower, Pisa was once a tremendous trading and sea power in the region.

Departing the port of Livorno, a short drive through the beautiful Tuscan countryside takes you to the historic university town of Pisa, situated on the banks of the Arno River. A short walk will take you to the Field of Miracles to marvel at the Leaning Tower of Pisa. Enjoy the beauty of this architectural wonder as you take in the scenery from the piazza.

Upon reaching Florence, your guide will escort you along the city streets to the Piazza del Duomo, where the Cathedral, Bell Tower and Baptistery share the same square. The cathedral is one of the longest in the world, and took over 140 years to build. Its 14th century bell tower is richly decorated with colored marble and fine sculptures, while the baptistry is festooned with magnificent mosaics and a copy of Ghiberti's "Gates of Paradise" cast in bronze. You'll stop in the Piazza della Signoria, the heart of Florence and the city's largest square where you will see a copy of Michelangelo's "David" and the Loggia dei Lanzi. Pause for a photo opportunity with your local guide at the nearest point to Ponte Vecchio, famous for its covered design and shopping opportunities.

Lunch (with a flute of Italian champagne and house wine) will be served at a first class restaurant or hotel. Following lunch, you'll visit the Church of Santa Croce, known as Italy's Westminster Abbey for the Italian monarchy buried there. Its 14th century interior is one of the


finest examples of Florentine Gothic architecture. There, you'll have limited time at leisure to explore or shop.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 3.5 miles over even and cobblestone streets with 10 - 15 steps and extended periods of standing and waiting. The walking distance between the Field of Miracles and the bus parking area is approximately 15 minutes each way. Guests will have approximately 45 minutes in Pisa for photographs. Entrances to the venues/monuments on the Field of Miracles are not included. Please note that you will not have time to visit the interior of the Leaning Tower of Pisa on this tour. The Church of Santa Croce is closed on Sundays, during special events and during mass services. Should this occur during your visit, guides will give an explanation outside and guests will then enter on their own. Photography is not permitted in the Church of Santa Croce. View the exterior of the Church of Santa Croce, known as Italy's Westminster Abbey for the Italian monarchy buried there. Afterwards, you will be left on your own for approximately 3 hours for lunch (at your own expense) and to explore Florence. The guide will advise you of the time to meet again to reboard the coach for the return trip to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2 miles over even and cobblestone streets with some steps and extended periods of standing and waiting. If guests should miss the return coach, transportation back to the vessel is their own responsibility and at their own expense. The Church of Santa Croce is closed on Sundays, during special events and mass services. Photography is not permitted in the Church of Santa Croce. Tour sequence may be altered to avoid congestion, but always covering the mentioned sites. An escort will accompany the coach to/from Florence to answer questions.

#### LVC - Historical Florence & Accademia Museum

 This full day tour will give you the opportunity to visit one of the most famous cities in the world, Florence. The tour combines the important sites within the city including Ponte Vecchio, Church of Santa Croce and the Accademia Museum.

In Florence, you will begin your walking tour through the city visiting the Accademia Museum to view one of Michelangelo's most treasured creations, the statue of "David." Having survived the outdoor elements of Signoria Square, the magnificent sculpture was moved inside the museum in 1873, where it remains today. After lunch, you will pause to the nearest point to view the elegant Ponte Vecchio. Meaning "old bridge," the Ponte Vecchio dates back to 1345, when it was built to replace a bridge that was swept away by a horrible flood. Today, the bridge is visited by many tourists, and is home to gold and jewelry vendors. You'll visit the Church of Santa Croce, known as Italy's Westminster Abbey for the Italian monarchy buried there. Its 14th century interior is one of the finest examples of Florentine Gothic decoration. Afterwards, you will have limited time at leisure to explore and shop. Drive to Piazzale Michelangelo for a panoramic view over the city with the Ponte Vecchio crossing the Arno River.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2 miles over even and cobblestone streets with 10 - 15 steps and extended periods of standing and waiting. The Church of Santa Croce is closed on Sundays, during special events and mass services. Should this occur during your visit, guides will give an explanation outside and guests will then enter on their own. Should your scheduled port visit fall on a Monday, the Palazzo Vecchio or Museo dell' Opera will be substituted since the Accademia Museum is regularly closed on Mondays. Your guide will explain the significance of each of the magnificent buildings in the Piazza. The façade of the Cathedral is in Tuscan-Romanesque style, but the striped black and white arches inside may have been inspired by Moslem work. The architecture of the circular Baptistery is equally fascinating, Romanesque below and Gothic above. (Entrance to the Baptistery and Cathedral is not included.) You'll have time at your leisure to explore and with many photo opportunities within the Field of Miracles.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.5 mile over paved flat surfaces with 5 steps into the Cathedral and extended periods of standing and waiting. The walking distance between the Field of Miracles in Pisa and the parking area is approximately 15 minutes each way. An escort will accompany the coach to/from Pisa to answer questions and a local guide will be met once in Pisa for the guided portion of the tour. Please note that you will not visit the interior of the Leaning Tower on this tour. Entrance to the Tower is approximately 15.00 Euros per person. Tickets have a specific entrance time and guests should be aware that this time may not be within your stay in Pisa. The Cathedral is closed on Sundays, during special events and mass services. Photography is not permitted inside the Cathedral. If you wish to independently visit the Baptistery or Campo Santo, an admission fee is required, so plan to carry local currency (Euros) with you.

  Travel through the Tuscan countryside and visit a small vineyard that produces the wine, which has made the region famous. Wine is never in short supply on Italian tables. The country produces some fine wines and Tuscany is the place where wine is "Tradition." Driving through the Tuscan countryside, you will admire the soft rounded hills, the medieval architecture of the villages and the silver green of the olive trees mingling with the dark green of the cypress trees. On reaching the vineyard, you will be shown the process of winemaking and the traditional methods of bottling. Enjoy a generous tasting of wines produced in the area accompanied by local salami and bread. This district is said to produce some of the best wines of the world.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 200 yards over even and cobblestone surfaces with 5 - 10 steps.

#### LVG - Tuscan Countryside - San Gimignano & Volterra

    This tour has been designed for guests who have already seen the famous attractions and beauties of Florence and Pisa and want to take in more of the Tuscany region. After a 2-hour drive through medieval hill-towns and beautiful surrounding valleys, you'll stop at San Gimignano, an enchanting medieval village that has taken the name of the Bishop Gimignano, who saved the City from the barbarians. "The Town of the Pine Towers," as it has been called, well earns this name because of its tall, majestic towers. You'll have time at your leisure to explore or shop. For a taste of Tuscany's legendary cuisine, a local farmhouse will serve a generous lunch with typical local specialties.

Driving west you'll reach the village of Volterra where the sightseeing on foot will include Piazza dei Priori, one of the most beautiful squares in Italy, defined as a bellicose assembly of towers and palaces. Proceed to Piazza San Giovanni to admire the temples dedicated to prayer, the Baptistery and Cathedral. See the ruins of Roman Theatre (dating back to the 1st century BC), that was brought to life again only at the beginning of this century. This magnificent example of the flourishing Roman civilization could hold up to 2,000 people. Time permitting; you will visit a local alabaster workshop, enjoy a short demonstration by a local artisan and have the opportunity to purchase selected items.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 200 yards over even and cobblestone streets with 20 - 25 steps. The walking distance

between the entrance of San Gimignano and the parking area is approximately 15 minutes with a slight incline and 22 steps. Photography is not permitted inside the Cathedral. The Cathedral is closed on Sundays, during special events and mass services. Should this occur during your visit, guides will give an explanation outside and guests will then enter on their own. Tour sequence may be altered to avoid congestion, but always covering the mentioned sights. The return drive from Volterra to Livorno is approximately 1.5 hours, dependent upon traffic conditions. The shopping hours and closure dates should be reviewed in the introduction section of Livorno.

This tour has been designed for guests who wish to combine a visit to the two most important art museums of Florence with the world famous Miracle Square of Pisa. You will visit the university town of Pisa where you will have a brief stop by the Field of Miracles for photographs and to marvel at the exterior of the Campanile, better known as the Leaning Tower. This famous Bell Tower leans over 16 feet out of perpendicular! Efforts to stabilize the building are made constantly together with a continued monitoring process of the structure.

Drive via modern highway to Florence. Situated on both banks of the Arno River and surrounded by the Appennine Hills, the city had an impact not only on the culture of Italy but on all of Europe. Upon reaching the city, you will pause at Piazzale Michelangelo for a spectacular view of Florence and the entire Arno Valley.

You'll visit the Uffizi Gallery that was built in the form of a horseshoe extending from Piazza Signoria to the River Arno and linked with Palazzo Vecchio by a bridge over the street. The Uffizi consists of forty-five rooms housing paintings by Cimabue, Giotto, Botticelli, Leonardo da Vinci and ancient Roman sculptures. Visit Piazza della Signoria where a copy of the "David" and original sculptures by Cellini and others are displayed. Before lunch stop by the famous 14th century bridge over the Arno River, the Ponte Vecchio; home of the world famous Florentine jewelry. For a taste of Italy's legendary cuisine, enjoy lunch with wine at a top local restaurant.

Re-board the mini-bus and drive to the Accademia Gallery, which became the focus of attention in 1873 when Michelangelo's "David" was exhibited for the first time in a specially constructed tribune. Enjoy a brief visit to the museum where the focus will be on Michelangelo's works.

Pause in the fascinating Piazza del Duomo (Cathedral Square) while your guide points out the stunning features of the Duomo, the Cathedral of Santa Maria del Fiore, along with its magnificent Baptistery and Campanile. The fourth largest church in the world, the Duomo was consecrated in 1436, although its facade dates from the 19th century. The exterior design is of beautiful green and white marble and its magnificent dome, created by Filippo Brunelleschi, is a masterpiece. The east doors, which depict scenes from the Old Testament, are often referred to as the "Gates of Paradise."

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 3.5 miles over even, uneven and cobblestone surfaces with 10 - 15 steps and extended periods of standing. The walking distance between the Field of Miracles and the bus parking area is approximately 15 minutes each way. Guests will have approximately 30 minutes in Pisa for photographs. Entrance to the venues/monuments on the Field of Miracles are not included. Please note that you will not have time to visit the interior of the Leaning Tower of Pisa on this tour. If the Accademia Museum and Uffizi Gallery are not open due to a scheduled Monday closure, the Palazzo Vecchio or Museo dell' Opera will be substituted. Depart from Pisa and proceed to Viareggio where you will be escorted to a local Lido on the beach. Your escort will designate a meeting time and place and then you will be on your own for approximately 4 hours. You can use the changing rooms and will have the opportunity to relax on the beach or by the swimming pool. A complimentary sun-bed and beach umbrella will be provided to you.

During your stay on the beach, you may also want to visit this lovely town, which since last century has been one of the most popular Italian summer resorts. The seaside is pedestrian-only with many elegant shops, fashionable Italian firms, and cafes. Taste the local fresh seafood at one of the many restaurants located at the Marina. After a relaxing day, reboard the coach for the return trip via the old Aurelia road.


Note: This tour will only operate from June 14, 2005 through September 16, 2005. Walking in Pisa and Viareggio is at the guest's discretion and over even and cobblestone surfaces with several steps. This tour does not include lunch or entrance fees. The walking distance between the Field of Miracles in Pisa and the parking area is approximately 15 minutes each way. Leave the port of Livorno and drive northwest through the Tuscan countryside to the town of Lucca. Your coach will park outside the city walls and you will begin your walking tour through the town. Founded as a home to the Etruscans, the city was also an early Roman colony as well as a prosperous silk-trading center during the Renaissance. In its long history, Lucca has been part of the Pisan Republic, Napoleon's French Empire, and an independent city-state. Stroll from piazza to piazza, learn the city's history, and see the Piazza San Michele, the Via Fillilungo, Torre delle Ore, Piazza Dell'Anfiteatro and the Duomo. Lucca's Romanesque Cathedral dates from the 12th century and features a façade with elaborate reliefs and columns. The Gothic interior features a devotional Volto Santo, an image of Christ on the cross, supposedly carved by Nicodemus, a purported witness of the crucifixion. The Duomo also boasts Tintoretto's magnificent painting of the Last Supper. You will stop for photos in Piazza Dell'Anfiteatro, the oval-shaped piazza occupies the site of a former Roman amphitheater; the surrounding building were built on the theater's foundations. You will have free time to browse in the shops along Lucca's exclusive Via Fillilungo or enjoy a stop in one of the local cafés. At the end of the tour, retrace your journey back to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2 miles over even and cobblestone surfaces with few steps. Time permitting; guests will have approximately 30 minutes for shopping and browsing while in Lucca. Should a mass service be taking place in the Duomo, the guide will make an outside explanation and guests will enter on an individual basis to view the interior quietly and reverently. Photography and video are not permitted inside the Cathedral. Tour sequence may be altered to avoid congestion. The shopping hours and closure dates should be reviewed in the introduction section of Livorno.

#### MKA - Ancient Delos

DURATION: 4 Hours Approx.

 The small, uninhabited island of Delos was once the religious center of the entire Aegean area. Today, its archaeological ruins stand as an important historical site in Greece. According to mythology, Delos was the birthplace of Apollo, the god of sun, light, music, harmony and beauty. According to revelations of 19th century excavations, Delos prospered for centuries due to its strategic position within the trade routes of the Aegean.

A local boat will transport you on the 30-minute ride to the west side of the island, which leads directly to the entrance of the archaeological site. You will walk into the heart of the sanctuary where you will see the Temple of Apollo, monuments famous for their history and architectural style, the famous dried lake with the palm tree and the unique marble lions of Delos. After a short rest stop, continue towards the terrace of the foreign gods. The view of the archipelago from there is unforgettable. You will pass through the theater and walk into the famous Hellenistic mansions of Delos with their superb mosaics decoration the floors and walls. You will then return by boat to Mykonos harbor.

Note: Guests must be able to walk and stand for approximately 2 hours over varying terrain. Comfortable walking shoes, a hat and plenty of sunscreen are recommended. Participants will be required to walk (10 minutes) from the town shuttle station to the pier to board the ferry bound to/from Delos since the greater portion of Mykonos is in a pedestrian only zone.

## Naples, Italy

The best quality transportation has been obtained for all excursions in Naples; however, each vehicles air-conditioning system may not be to North American standards. Guests may encounter considerable crowds and delays at the funicular and marina landing in Capri during peak summer months. Due to this reason, local guides may decide to alter the tour itineraries and the order in which they are accomplished. It may not be possible to visit all sites listed and there may be long lines (queues) to enter the popular venues. This is beyond the control of the local tour operator or Royal Caribbean International. The majority of the walking will be over cobblestone streets or flat, even surfaces. Proper attire that covers shoulders and knees is recommended for both men and women for visits to the religious venues.

During the months of October through June, most major shops are closed every Sunday and Monday mornings and are closed daily from 1:00 pm until 4:00 pm. During the months of July through September, major shops are closed on Saturday and Sunday afternoons and are closed daily from 1:00 pm until 4:00 pm.

Heavy traffic congestion and crowds should be expected during the high summer season in August 2005. Expect delays and long lines (queues) at venues.

Exterior walking portion of listed tours will be conducted in all weather conditions (rain or shine). Guests are advised to take the appropriate weather gear and wear comfortable walking shoes.

For a select shore excursion to be provided in another language (i.e. Spanish, French, German and/or Italian), the required minimum of 25 guests must be met. Please contact the Shore Excursion office directly on board the vessel for further details.

**NPA - Capri, Sorrento & Pompeii**

Ⓢ Ⓜ ⓐ After disembarking your ship you will walk to the jetfoil terminal for a 40-minute ride to Capri. From the dock at Marina Grande, the funicular will transport participants up the terrace to Capri Town. The view from the town overlooks the marina and the Sorrento Peninsular. Capri has become very commercial in recent years, but you will enjoy visiting La Piazzetta, the heart of the shopping and nightclub area. Wander through the narrow streets and explore the shops and sights. Time permitting; it may be possible to visit the beautiful Augustus Gardens, overlooking the famous Faraglioni of Capri and Marina Piccola. Return to the marina by funicular and travel by watercraft back to the mainland.

Driving south, the next stop is the fabled town of Sorrento. Legend states it was the sirens of Sorrento who attempted to lure Ulysses onto the rocks. Lunch (with a flute of Italian champagne and house wine) will be served at a first class restaurant or hotel. After lunch, board your coach for the transfer to Pompeii. Located 12 miles from Naples is the Roman town of Pompeii at the foot of Mount Vesuvius. This archaeological site is considered to be the world's finest example of a Roman town and its way of life. In 79 AD, the catastrophic eruption of Mount Vesuvius buried the town under 20 feet of ash and pumice stone, preserving the entire city. During the walking tour of the ruins, admire the mansions and art of wealthy patricians who moved to Pompeii to escape the turmoil of Rome; view countless paintings and inscriptions and the streets with raised pavements on either side. At intersections are stepping-stones that ensured pedestrians a safe crossing. This prosperous Roman City had an extensive forum, lavish baths, temples and villas richly decorated with frescoes. Excavations have revealed details of everyday life such as the wine jars still set in the counter of the wine shop. Time permitting; a stop will be made at a cameo factory, where you will learn about the delicate art of cameo carving and have an opportunity to purchase some of the handicrafts.

Note: There is extensive walking involved over cobblestones and uneven ground in Pompeii (1.5 miles) and approximately 1 mile of walking over cobblestone surfaces in Capri. You may encounter crowds and delays at the funicular station in Capri during the peak summer months. Inclement weather and rough seas may cause seasickness on the boat to/from Capri so guests should take the necessary precautions. The archeological site of Pompeii and the funicular in Capri are not wheelchair accessible. There is a steep incline at the entrance of Pompeii with 20 - 25 steps. The drive between Sorrento and Pompeii is approximately 1 hour. Comfortable walking shoes, hat and sunscreen are highly recommended. Guests will be on their feet up to 90 minutes at any given time. Shops in Sorrento may be closed during the lunch stop. Tour order may be reversed but all sites will be visited.

### NPB - Amalfi Drive & Pompeii

 This excursion combines some of the most beautiful scenery along the Italian Coastline-The Amalfi Drive with the Ruins of Pompeii. Admire the dolomite cliffs, towering straight up out of the sea and typical villages, which have characterized Sorrento's Peninsular for many centuries. Amalfi was part of the four Maritime Republics that included Venice, Genoa and Pisa. You will have time to take photos and stroll along the narrow streets to the Piazza del Duomo. From this square, a flight of 60 or more steps leads to the impressive Cathedral of St. Andrew. The interior of the church dates as far back as the 13th century with the highlight of the cathedral being the 11th century bronze doors from Constantinople. Lunch will be served at a restaurant on the Amalfi Drive.


Your coach will wind its way along the Amalfi Coast passing by Vietri sul Mare onto the autostrada towards the ruins of Pompeii. You'll visit the extensive ruins of Pompeii, site of one of the most famous excavations in the world. Your visit to Pompeii will include the same highlights as described in tour NPD. You will then board your coach for the return drive to your ship. Time permitting; you'll stop at the cameo factory to see how this delicate work is done before heading back to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over cobblestones and uneven ground. Pompeii is not wheelchair accessible. Comfortable walking shoes, hat and sunscreen are highly recommended. Guests wishing to enter the Cathedral of St. Andrew must ascend approximately 60 or more very steep steps. ### NPC - Amalfi Drive - Sorrento & Naples

You'll see first-hand why its delightful climate make the village a favorite Mediterranean resort.

Drive along the steep winding coastal road and admire its splendid views. Pass Positano, a pretty fishing village, which has become a colony of artists and writers. The picturesque seaside resort of Amalfi lies at the mouth of a deep gorge. Lunch will be served in a local restaurant on the Amalfi Coast.


Amalfi is a romantic, Moorish-style resort town overlooking the Bay of Salerno at the foot of the steep Lattari hills. In the center of the town stands the 11th-century Cathedral of St. Andrew, said to hold the remains of the apostle. Distinctive for its black-and-white facade and its mosaics, the building features bronze doors cast in Constantinople in 1066 and a bell tower dating to the 13th century. Head out from the Piazza del Duomo and explore the narrow alleyways lined with shops and boutiques. The return journey will proceed via Vietri sul Mare. Time permitting, you'll stop at the cameo factory to see how this delicate work is done. Once in Naples, you will enjoy a short panoramic tour passing the Royal Palace, S. Carlo Opera House and the Umberto Gallery.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 50 yards over even surfaces with 5 - 10 steps. There are several steps to access the lunch venue. Comfortable walking shoes, hat, and sunscreen are highly recommended. The drive between Naples and Sorrento is approximately 1.5 hours and the return from Amalfi to Naples is approximately 2.5 hours. Guests wishing to enter the Cathedral of St. Andrew must ascend approximately 60 or more very steep steps. The order of the tour may be reversed. Please note that due to local regulations and restrictions, an alternate stop on the Amalfi Coast (Minori, Maiori or Vietri sul Mare) will be made should a parking space not be available in Amalfi.

### NPD - Exploration of Pompeii

lavish temples and porticoes, you'll begin to grasp the lifestyle of the inhabitants. Admire the mansions and the art of wealthy patricians who moved to Pompeii to escape the turmoil of Rome; view countless paintings and inscriptions. See the streets with raised pavements on both sides and the stepping-stones that ensured pedestrians a safe crossing at intersections. Time permitting; you'll stop at a cameo factory where you will have the opportunity to observe local artisans at work in their centuries-old tradition.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over cobblestone and rocky streets. There is a steep incline at the entrance with 20 - 25 steps. Comfortable walking shoes, hat and sunscreen are recommended. Pompeii is not wheelchair accessible. The drive between Naples and Pompeii is approximately 45 minutes, dependent upon traffic conditions.

**NPE - The Ruins of Herculaneum**

  Another victim of the fiery temper of Mt. Vesuvius was the village of Herculaneum, which buried under mud and lava, lives on in its uniquely preserved atmosphere. Unlike the commercial city of Pompeii, Herculaneum was a seaside resort. Dating back to the 4th century BC, the city was thought to have been founded by the legendary Hercules. This elite Roman resort was devastated by the same volcanic eruption that buried Pompeii in 79 AD. Unlike the ash and lava that devastated Pompeii, Herculaneum was covered by a torrent of mud, which protected the ruins from atmospheric agents and illegal excavators. This natural preservation of wooden elements, foodstuffs, fabrics, and architecture provides a fascinating and intimate look into the Roman's private life in ancient times. The site was discovered by accident in the early 1700's when a well was being dug and workmen struck a stone pavement, the stage of the city's theater. Serious excavations began under Mussolini but only about eight blocks have been excavated. The rest is covered not only by rock but also by a dense modern neighborhood. Bringing more of Herculaneum to light is a slow operation, with new digs continuing. Time permitting; you'll stop at a cameo factory, where you will have the opportunity to observe local artisans at work in their centuries-old shell-carving tradition.

Note: This tour involves extensive walking (1 mile) over cobblestones and uneven ground with steep inclines and approximately 10 - 15 steps. Comfortable walking shoes, hat and sunscreen are recommended. Herculaneum is not wheelchair accessible.

**NPF - Panoramic Naples**

  This excursion will take in Naples' best sites from the comfort of your coach.    Designed for guests who wish to enjoy an overview of the Amalfi Coast, visit the famous village of Positano, explore Pompeii, which probably is the most important excavation of the world, and lastly to see Sorrento, world famous summer resort that attracts people from all over the world. This tour will be conducted by small minivans, giving you the opportunity to reach Positano, where large coaches are not permitted and the possibility to see in the same day the most important sights that characterize the Gulf of Naples.

Known as one of the most spectacular sceneries anywhere, the Amalfi Drive is a favorite destination for countless visitors. Departing from the pier you will pass Mount Vesuvius as you begin your coastal drive south to the ancient City of Pompeii, which is one of the most famous excavations in the world. Ironically, one of the ancient world's worst disasters preserved time in Pompeii, where you will experience life as it was lived in 79 AD. Once a thriving empire 1,900 years ago, it was devastated by the eruption of Mount Vesuvius in 79 AD when 30 feet of volcanic ash and pumice stone covered the city. As you enter Pompeii by the Sea Gate, a short walk takes you to the city's hub, the Forum. Surrounded by lavish temples and porticoes, you'll begin to grasp the lifestyle of the inhabitants. Admire the mansions and the art of wealthy patricians who moved to Pompeii to escape the turmoil of Rome; view countless paintings and inscriptions. See the streets with raised pavements on both sides and the stepping-stones that ensured pedestrians a safe crossing at intersections. Driving towards Sorrento, you will see the dolomitic cliff towering straight up out of the sea and typical villages, which have

characterized its peninsula for many centuries.

The next stop is the fabled town of Sorrento. Legend tells us it was the "sirens" of Sorrento who attempted to lure Ulysses onto the rocks. This delightful town has a wonderful climate and marvelous views of Naples Bay. Take a stroll around the main square and explore the side streets. There are many souvenir shops and local specialties including articles of highly polished wood inlaid with beautiful marquetry. You'll see first-hand why its delightful climate make the village a favorite Mediterranean resort. Lunch, including wine, will be served in a quality hotel/restaurant.


You will proceed along the Amalfi Coast to Positano, where a picture postcard comes to life - a patchwork of flat and domed roofs and vine-covered stairways tumbling down to meet the gentle curve of beach, which is dotted with brightly colored fishing boats. Enjoy time at leisure to explore this elegant spot with its designer boutiques, shops, and seaside cafés. On the return to the ship, time permitting; you'll stop at a cameo factory, where you will have the opportunity to observe local artisans at work in their centuries-old tradition.

Note: This exclusive tour has limited participation and is operated by mini-bus. Although the mini-bus is allowed to enter areas restricted to larger transport, guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over cobblestones and uneven ground in Pompeii. The tour itinerary may be reversed but always covering the mentioned sights. Pompeii is not wheelchair accessible and cannot be viewed from the entrance. Comfortable walking shoes, hat and sunscreen are highly recommended.

#### NPH - Island of Capri with Lunch

 Spend a day on the popular island of Capri, which teems with tourists during the summer. Soak up the luxuriant gardens, the sun-drenched squares, restaurants, shops, and crowded streets. You will also enjoy the spectacular views of the sea and sky from Anacapri.

From pierside in Naples, you will walk to the nearby marina to board a boat for your scenic 50-minute cruise through Naples Bay to the Island of Capri. Arriving at the colorful Marina Grande, your guide will dispatch you into various local minibuses for the transfer along the winding road to Anacapri. Visit the beautiful Villa S. Michele and gardens of Axel Munthe, a Swedish physician and author of the famous book, *The Story of San Michele*, in which he wrote his life, his discovery of Capri, and his dream of establishing his home on the island. The villa offers an interesting collection of antiques and marvelous panoramic view from the garden. After the visit, you will have a short time to explore Anacapri before the return drive down to Capri Town.

The route will offer magnificent views along the way. Walk with your guide through narrow streets and the central square, La Piazzetta, which is surrounded by intriguing old buildings and filled with sidewalk cafes. Popular with tourists and local alike, Capri is always extremely crowded and bustling with activity. You'll savor a lunch of Italian fare with wine at a hotel or restaurant in Capri Town.


After lunch, you will have the opportunity to explore the Gardens of Augustus with your guide. The gardens are filled with many species of plants and you can take in the views of the Faraglioni, a famed offshore rock outcropping, and the Bay of Marina Piccola. Explore Capri's fabled plaza, La Piazzetta, with its many chic boutiques and gift shops before taking the funicular back down to Marina Grande, where you will board your watercraft for the return trip to Naples marina where you will walk to the nearby pier.

Note: Capri is a very popular island and crowds should be expected during your visit. You may encounter crowds and delays at the funicular station in Capri during the peak summer months. Due to the short distances involved, local minibuses in Capri are not equipped with air-conditioning. The itinerary of the tour may be changed but always covering the mentioned sites. Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over rough stone and cobblestone streets with 10 - 15 steps. Comfortable walking shoes and sunscreen are recommended. Guests will be on their feet up to 90 minutes at any given time. The funicular in Capri is not wheelchair accessible. Inclement weather and rough seas may cause seasickness on the boat to/from Capri so guests should take the necessary precautions.

#### NPI - Taste of Sorrento & Excavation of Pompeii

 The cliff-top town of Sorrento is a popular resort destination due its charming atmosphere, breathtaking location, and local cuisine. Combining a visit to Sorrento with the moving archaeological ruins of Pompeii makes this tour an unforgettable experience. Travel from Naples via the autostrada and the Campanian coastal route to Sorrento. Enjoy the panoramic scenery of the Bay of Naples as you make your way towards the Sorrentine Peninsula.

Once in Sorrento proceed to a local farmhouse, nestled in the hills and located over this beautiful town. This simple family-owned farm produces mozzarella cheese, fresh vegetables, olives, and lemons. Visit the antique wine cantina and learn about the process of producing olive oil and hand-made mozzarella. Following the explanations and demonstrations, enjoy a taste of the mozzarella cheese, fresh tomatoes, salami and bread in a peaceful setting of lemon and olive trees.

You will have time (approximately 1.5 hours) at leisure to explore, shop and eat in Sorrento's charming flower-filled streets that offer a wide array of boutiques, souvenir shops, and atmospheric outdoor cafes. Please note that lunch is at the guest's own expense.

Rejoin your coach and drive towards Pompeii and enjoy views of Mt. Vesuvius, the still-active volcano located about fifteen miles southeast of Naples. Your guided walking tour through the rocky ruins of Pompeii will begin as you enter by the sea gate. Marvel at the many beautifully restored buildings. The baths, the theatres, the wrestling ground and the luxurious villas stand empty, yet there are still many echoes of Pompeii's daily life: the wine shop, the stepping stones, the mosaic floors and the brilliant frescoes are examples of

Pompeii's everyday life. The plaster casts of the volcano victims are particularly poignant and one can never forget the horrible events that brought life in Pompeii to an end.



Time permitting, a stop at a cameo shop will be made so you can browse for delicate, handmade earrings, bracelets and brooches. Return to Naples and catch glimpses of this metropolitan area, much of which stretches along the waterfront with a maze of crowded streets and their infamous motor traffic.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over cobblestone and even and uneven ground with steep inclines and approximately 10 - 15 steps. To access the farmhouse, guests will need to climb a narrow, uneven street with several steps at the entrance. Comfortable walking shoes, hat and sunscreen are recommended. Pompeii is not wheelchair accessible. The drive between Naples and Sorrento is approximately 1.5 hours and the return drive between Pompeii and Naples is approximately 45 minutes, dependent upon traffic conditions. Tour itinerary may change but all mentioned sites will be covered.

#### NPJ - Mount Vesuvius Hike & Pompeii

  Leaving the port, you will drive south via the motorway towards Mount Vesuvius, Europe's only still-active volcano that is located on the west coast of Naples. At approximately 3,000 feet, begin your trek on foot over narrow paths that zigzag up the mountain another 1,000 feet. Once on the rim of the crater walls, you will skirt the edge with an official alpine guide while enjoying this natural phenomenon and the panoramic views that includes Naples and its bay. Take along some scrape paper for a quick experiment. As you walk, look for hot spots where you can scrape a small hole in the ground, push the paper in, and watch it light automatically.




After visiting this unusual phenomenon, you will descend along the narrow paths to the parking lot and proceed to Pompeii. Once in Pompeii, enjoy a complimentary soft drink before entering the excavation site. Pompeii is possibly the most famous excavation in the world. There a flourishing civilization, buried for 1,700 years, has been brought to life again and where you can see how the citizens of the greatest empire the world has ever known lived and loved, worked and played, ate and drank and died. Entering Pompeii by the Sea Gate you are soon in the Agora, surrounded by temples, porticoes and law courts. 20,000 people lived in this provincial town, of which 2,000 perished in the horrifying eruption of Vesuvius in AD 79. Twenty feet of volcanic ash and pumice stone covered Pompeii. Much of this has been removed over the last 200 years to reveal the details of everyday life in Pompeii. Time permitting, you'll stop at a cameo factory where you will have the opportunity to observe local artisans at work in their century old tradition en route back to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 5.5 miles over varying terrain. A portion of the route will be uphill so guests should be in good physical condition. Guests suffering from heart disease and high blood pressure should not participate on this excursion. Caution is advised when walking across hardened lava and rocky ground where crevices still exude fumes and heat. Low heeled and comfortable walking or hiking shoes, hat and sunscreen protection are recommended. This tour will operate in all weather conditions so participants should take appropriate weather gear with them, carry a backpack for belongings and take bottled water to stay hydrated during the hike. Participants should be aware that there are certain inherent risks involved with any hiking excursion. A parent or guardian must accompany children who are 10 to 16 years of age. Enter Pompeii and see details of everyday life with wine yards still set in the counter of the wine shop and plaster casts of the locals frozen in time at the moment of the eruption. Afterwards, visit a nearby cameo factory and browse for delicate handmade jewelry. Stop at a typical Neapolitan Pizzeria to sample the real thing. Pizza was invented in Naples in 1830 and it tastes different here than anywhere else. Return to Naples for a short orientation drive of the city. Highlights include Castel Nuovo, San Carlo Opera House, Umberto Gallery, the former Royal Palace and the Castle of the Egg overlooking the Gulf of Naples. Your last stop will be at the National Archaeological Museum, home to one of the most comprehensive collection of murals and items from Pompeii and Herculaneum in the world. Noteworthy items include the Farnese Bull, a classical Roman sculpture and the murals, frescos and mosaics that once decorated the villas of Pompeii.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2.5 miles over cobblestones and uneven ground. Pompeii is not wheelchair accessible. There is a steep incline at the entrance of Pompeii with 20 - 25 steps. Comfortable walking shoes, hat and sunscreen are highly recommended. Photography is not permitted in the museum. Due to the scheduled Tuesday closure of the Archaeological Museum, this tour cannot be operated on during the Brilliance of the Seas' August 02, 2005 and October 18, 2005 visits to Naples. Should you visit fall on a Saturday, Sunday or local holiday, your coach may not be allowed to drive through Piazza Plebiscito due to local traffic regulations.

 A short walk to from the port area will take you to the Island Steamer Terminal where the a scheduled hydrofoil/jet-foil for Ischia will be waiting. The journey (approximately 45 minutes) takes you around the north of the Bay of Naples with fine views of the city rising up to Vomero Hill, crowned with the Castle of St. Elmo. The little harbor of Mergellina nestles below Posillipo, and the steamer then passes Capo Miseno, once on the headquarters of the Roman fleet, and the tiny island of Procida, formed by volcanic craters.

Once at Ischia harbor, board your coach to begin a round trip tour of the island. Ischia consists of two main districts: Ischia Ponte ("Ponte" means "bridge" and it refers to the Bridge connecting the Castle's isle to the coast) and Ischia Porto ("Porto" is the Harbor). The bridge was built in 1438 due to the Alfonso I d'Aragona's will, in order to connect Ischia to the rock where rises the Castle; then the small town of Serrara Fontana, the highest village on the island, from where there are grand views over the ravines and densely cultivated hillsides; from the top, a stunning panoramic view.




Sant Angelo is the only coastal resort in the territory of Serrara Fontana: it was once a small fishermen's village, while it is nowadays an exclusive tourist resort. The village is connected to a small rocky islet by a narrow strip of land. The rock has volcanic origins and here, before 1000 was built a small convent with a chapel consecrated to the Archangel Michele, from whom it derives its name. Your coach will drop you off at a vantage point from where you will have the opportunity to catch this beautiful Bay from the top. Continue your drive passing by the small towns of Lacco Ameno and Casamicciola, both resorts and thermal spas. Your orientation drive ends at a beautiful Thermal Park Castiglione. Tour the gardens and see the great waterfall with its marble statues showing Actaeon at the moment of being transformed by the goddess Diana into a stag. Afterwards, return to Naples and a typical Neapolitan Pizzeria to taste the real thing. Pizza was invented in Naples in 1830 and is known the entire world over as a unique taste, different from anywhere else. After lunch, enjoy an orientation drive of the city. Climb up Posillipo Hill for panoramic views of Naples. Continue past the famous Castle of The Egg, Castle Nuovo, and the elegant Galleria Umberto. Stop in the square for photos of the 17th century Royal Palace, San Carlo Opera House and the Church of St. Francis. There will be some free time for souvenir shopping before returning to the ship.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1 mile over even surfaces and dirt paths and walkways, inclines and 50 - 150 steps. Comfortable walking shoes, hat and sunscreen protection are recommended. Time permitting; guests will have approximately 15 minutes for souvenir shopping in the small shop located at the Royal Palace. The ride from the Royal Palace to the Waterfall will be done by local shuttle bus, which runs continuously. According to number of independent groups and individuals that will require this service, guests might wait for the shuttle bus at the pick-up points and the group might be split between two buses. ## Piraeus (Athens), Greece

The port city of Piraeus is an approximately 40-minute drive from the center of Athens, dependent upon traffic conditions.



On Monday, Wednesday, Saturday afternoons, and Sundays, most shops are closed in Athens. However, most touristic and souvenir shops will be open.

For a select shore excursion to be provided in another language (i.e. Spanish, French, German and/or Italian), the required minimum of 25 guests must be met. Please contact the Shore Excursion office directly on board the vessel for further details.

### PRA - Athens Sightseeing & The Acropolis

DURATION: 4 Hours Approx.

  Piraeus is the ancient name of the harbor created in the early 5th century BC. Today it is the main port for the Greek capital city, Athens. Approximately five million cruise ship and ferry passengers pass through the busy port annually.

Leaving the quayside, you will drive to Athens through the suburbs where the coach will enter the city center from the southwest along Syngrou Avenue. Drive past some of the famous sites such as the Temple of Olympian Zeus, the largest Corinthian style temple in Greece, taking over 700 years to build. Hadrian's Arch separates the old and new Roman towns. Other sights to see include the National Gardens, the National Library and the Parliament Building, formerly the Royal Palace. The Panathinon Stadium, built in 1895, was the site of the first modern Olympics held in 1896.


The tour highlight is a visit of the Acropolis to see the architectural masterpieces of the Golden Age of Greece, all built in the latter part of the 5th century BC. A winding pathway and approximately 150 steps lead to the top of the famous hill. See the Propylaea Entrance, the Erechtheum, the Temple of Wingless Victory and, of course, the crowning glory of Athens, the incomparable Parthenon. Dedicated to Athena, the patron goddess of Athens, it is Greece's largest and most impressive temple.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1.5 miles over steep inclines, 200 - 300 steps and uneven surfaces. Comfortable walking shoes, a hat and plenty of sunscreen are recommended. Due to new regulations, buses may be required to park some distance from the archaeological site and this may involve additional walking. Please be aware that ongoing restorations work is often carried out at the Acropolis. Time permitting; guests will have approximately 15 minutes for souvenir shopping in the shops below the Acropolis. At the conclusion of the tour, guests will have the option of exiting the tour at Constitution Square in Athens for independent shopping and making their own way back to the ship in Piraeus or returning to the port with the coach.

### PRB - Exclusive Athens with Lunch

 This tour has been designed for guests who wish to combine Athens Sightseeing with the one of the important museums of Athens. You will have an orientation drive through the city, featuring the Temple of Olympian Zeus, Hadrian's Arch, the Statue of Lord Byron, Constitution Square, the Tomb of the Unknown Warrior, Olympic Stadium, the Academy and the University Library. You will proceed to the Acropolis to begin your visit of this famous architectural masterpiece.

After visiting the Acropolis, your guide will lead you on foot to the Plaka (Old Town) for a guided walking tour of the area. This is Athens' oldest and most picturesque neighborhood where the beauty of the neo-classical colors, architecture and tiny gardens will delight you. Afterwards, you will have free time for independent sightseeing and shopping. Plaka's central square has an abundance of cafes, restaurants and souvenir shops. Lunch with wine will be served at the Dionysos Restaurant, which faces the Acropolis. While eating, you will admire the Parthenon.


Following lunch, you will continue to the Benaki Museum, the oldest museum (fully reconstructed in 2000) in Greece, which functions as a foundation under private law. The museum ranks among the great benefactions that have enriched the material assets of the Greek state. Your local guide will direct you through the major exhibits in the museum. At the conclusion of your visit, you will stop for coffee in the Museum's coffee shop/restaurant.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2 miles over varying terrain, inclines and 200 - 300 steps. Comfortable walking shoes, a hat and plenty of sunscreen are recommended. Photography, video recording, large handbags and backpacks are not permitted in the museum. Time permitting; guests will have approximately 30 - 40 minutes for shopping and browsing. Due to new Athens regulations, your coach may be required to park some distance from the Acropolis and this may involve additional walking. Please be aware that ongoing restorations work is often carried out at the Acropolis. Tour order may vary in order to avoid congestion.

#### PRC - Ancient Corinth & Canal Cruise

 Leaving Piraeus, drive along the coastal road of the Saronic Gulf to the famous Corinth Canal. An unforgettable sight, the Canal is 4 miles long and 72 feet wide and was built with sloping sides, which reach a height of approximately 230 feet. The depth of the water in the canal is approximately 24 feet. Although many attempted to construct a canal in this location, success was not found until the 19th century. Admire the spectacular view of the canal from a bridge more than 200 feet above the water before reaching the Isthmia pier, the entrance to the Canal and where you will join a boat for a cruise along the canal. During the cruise, local mezes and snacks will be served. After the cruise, disembark at Isthmia pier and continue to Ancient Corinth, one of the most important towns in antiquity. Ancient Corinth, built at the foot of the famous Acrocorinthos Hill (altitude 575 meters), served as a mighty acropolis or citadel in times of mythology. This ancient city not only led the way for Athens and the wider territory of Greece but for the entire Mediterranean world. The renowned Corinthian capital, which still adorns public buildings around the world, had its origins here (Callimachus, 5th century BC). The long and extremely interesting history of this city includes the time of St. Paul (50 AD), who visited the city twice and founded the Church of Corinth. The featured venues on this tour are the Apollo Temple, Fountain of Glauka, Spring of Periander and the remains of the beautifully paved 25-foot wide Lechaion Road.

Please be aware that ongoing restorations work is often carried out at the listed venues. On this tour you will not see, pass by or visit the famous "Acropolis of Athens."

#### PRE - Athens & Cape Sounion With Lunch

 Your tour begins with the highlights of Athens and the legendary Acropolis built during the Golden Age of Pericles. You will explore the ruins of this ancient city and admire its crowning glory, the Parthenon. Lunch will be served at a local restaurant serving traditional Greek food.

After lunch and a short drive, you will reach the southernmost tip of the European landmass, Cape Sounion. High on a cliff overlooking the Aegean Sea stands this imposing temple dedicated to the god of the sea, the Temple of Poseidon. The 16 Doric columns bear silent testimony to the tragedy of King Aegeus who threw himself to his death. You will pass the gate and climb a rocky path, roughly following the ancient approach into the sanctuary of the sea god. The temple was probably designed just after the middle of the 5th century BC and the remaining columns of Pentelic marble have retained much of their original lustrous white appearance.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 2 miles over uneven and cobblestone surfaces, steep inclines and 100 - 200 steps. The entrance of the Acropolis requires uphill walking with steps and uneven surfaces. Comfortable walking shoes, a hat and plenty of sunscreen are recommended. The total amount of driving time involved during this tour is approximately 3.5 hours (Piraeus - Athens - Sounion - Piraeus), dependent upon traffic conditions. Please be aware that ongoing restorations work is often carried out at the listed venues. Tour order may vary in order to avoid congestion.

**PRG - Panoramic Athens**

**DURATION:** 3 Hours 15 Minutes Approx.



This tour is designed for the comfort of those guests who may not be able to negotiate the uphill climb and steps leading to the Acropolis. This panoramic Athens tour features major points of interest.

Your city drive will take you from Piraeus to Athens covering the main points of interest in Athens - both ancient and modern - as your guide provides interesting commentary. From the comfort of the coach, you'll see Hadrian's Arch, the Statue of Lord Byron, the Temple of Olympian Zeus, Constitution Square, the Tomb of the Unknown Warrior, the National Gardens, the Panathinion Stadium, the Academy, the University, and the National Library. If possible, distant views of the Acropolis and a photo stop will be made at the Olympic Stadium, if traffic and time permits.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 400 yards over even surfaces in the pier terminal area and 2 - 3 steps to enter the coach. There are no shopping stops on this tour. You will stop for photos only. No interior visits will be made during this excursion.

**PRH - Athens Sightseeing & National Archaeological Museum**

Leaving the quayside you will drive to Athens through the suburbs where the coach will enter the city center from the southwest along Syngrou Avenue. Drive past some of the famous sites such as the Temple of Olympian Zeus, the largest Corinthian style temple in Greece, taking over 700 years to build. Hadrian's Arch separates the old and new Roman towns. Other sights to see include the National Gardens, the National Library and the Parliament Building, formerly the Royal Palace. The Panathinion Stadium, built in 1895, was the site of the first modern Olympics held in 1896.

The National Archaeological Museum is an unrivaled treasure house, which contains an outstanding collection of masterpieces from excavations throughout Greece, an essential Athens experience. The museum's main divisions are prehistoric, with Mycenae predominating. Sculpture from the Archaic (eighth century BC) to Hellenistic (third to second century BC) periods and pottery from geometric (the end of the fourth century BC). A few of the museum's most important exhibits are the bronze statue of Poseidon, the head of Hygeia (Goddess of Health), the bronze statue of the "Jockey-Boy" of Artemision, the Golden mask of "Ageamnon" and the brilliant Minoan-style frescoes from Thira (Santorini). Due to the extensive renovations and necessary closures of different sections of the museum, the exhibits visited may vary between groups/coaches. The local tour agent and Royal Caribbean International cannot guarantee which exhibits will be open during each call date.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1 mile over even surfaces with 20 - 50 steps in the museum. Comfortable walking shoes are recommended. Flash photography, large handbags and backpacks are not permitted in the National Archaeological Museum. At the conclusion of the tour, guests will have the option of being dropped at Constitution Square in Athens for independent shopping and making their own way back to the ship in Piraeus or returning to the port with the coach.

**PRI - Ancient Athens, Plaka & Shopping**

Designed for the guests who would like a more leisurely visit to Athens. Your city drive will take you from Piraeus into Athens covering the main points of interest both ancient and modern as your guide provides interesting commentary.

First stop will be in the pedestrian zone of the Acropolis where your guide will provide a short explanation on the Acropolis and Parthenon (exterior visit only). From a scenic viewpoint, you will be able to photograph the famous Acropolis, which stands in the distance on a rocky hill high above Athens. Imagine how the Parthenon must have looked thousands of years ago when it was decorated with sculptured metopes, statues and a frieze over 500 feet long. Reboard your coach for an orientation drive of Athens from the comfort of your coach. You will see Hadrian's Arch, Temple of Olympian Zeus, Constitution Square, Tomb of the Unknown Soldier, Parliament, the Academy, the University and the National Library. At the termination of the orientation drive, you will arrive at the most suitable point for entering the Plaka. Proceed with your guide on a short walking tour of Athens's oldest and most picturesque neighborhood. The maze of cobblestone pedestrian streets is lined with shops, boutiques, souvenir stands and flea market stalls that beckon all that enter. Limited taxi service can be found along Firá's main street or in the central square.

**SOA - Akrotiri Excavations & Santorini Island with Wine Tasting**

**PRICE:** ADULT: 59.00 / CHILD: 39.00 USD

**DURATION:** 3 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



In 1450 BC, severe volcanic eruptions destroyed all life on Santorini, sending it far beneath the waves. Legend has it that it was this explosion that caused Atlantis to vanish. In 1967, a tunnel dug through 160 feet of pumice at Akrotiri revealed a bronze-age town of some 30,000 inhabitants, which many believe was the lost city of Atlantis.

After going ashore by a local boat to the port of Athinios, your coach will climb 800 feet to the top of the caldera where your guide will point out the still active volcanic islet in Santorini Bay. A twenty-minute scenic drive takes you to the archaeological site at Akrotiri, on the southernmost tip of the island. Under a protective cover, you'll tour the Minoan-Era town replete with houses, ancient city's squares and cobblestone streets. Walk among the remains of buildings standing some two and three stories high, with traces of balconies on the 50-foot street fronts, preserved by the ash that enveloped them before the final explosion. The fact that pottery found there was contemporaneous with that of Minoan Crete led the archaeologists to believe that both civilizations were extinguished by the same natural disaster.

After your visit to the excavation site, you will continue to a local winery where you will have the opportunity to taste Santorini meze (Greek Snack) and a local wine tasting.




The tour concludes at the hilltop village of Fira, where you'll have the option of returning directly to the ship or remaining to shop or explore independently. The charm of this lovely cliff-top village lies in its very narrow, twisting cobblestone paths that cater to pedestrians only. From Fira you will join the cable car (ticket provided) and descend independently to the old port. A local tender will ferry you back to the ship, which will be anchored offshore.

**Note:** Guests must be able to walk approximately 0.75 mile over varying surfaces, inclines and 20 - 30 steps. Guests must be able to walk 0.25 mile in Fira on their own in order to reach the cable car station. Flash photos are not permitted in the excavation site. Tour order may vary but all listed sights will be covered. Due to the closure of the Akrotiri Excavation site on Mondays, the tour will not operate during the Brilliance of the Seas' 06/05/05, 10/03/05 and 10/25/05 sailings. **SOB - Village of Oia, Santorini Island & Wine Tasting**

   After going ashore by local tender boat to the port of Athinios, your coach will climb 800 feet to the top of the caldera. Driving through the picturesque scenery and small villages from the southern to the northern end of the island of Santorini, you'll travel across rich, volcanic countryside.

The beautiful village of Oia is perched atop a craggy cliff at the northern most point of the island offering panoramic views of steep plummeting cliffs and nearby small islands surrounded by the deep blue sea. The charm of this lovely traditional and somewhat removed village lies in its very narrow, twisting cobblestone alleyways and steps, pointing out the brilliant white stone buildings that create a maze of fine shops, cafes and domed churches. Walking through the village one can enjoy the panoramic views, admire the Cycladic architecture for which the town is well known, and visit many of the art galleries.

After your visit to Oia, you'll continue to a local winery for the opportunity to taste Santorini mezes (Greek Snack) and a wine tasting while enjoying the magnificent views. You will visit the bodega where the wine is aged and have the chance to purchase some of the locally produced wines.


The tour concludes at the hilltop village of Fira, where you'll have the option of returning directly to the ship or remaining in town to shop or explore independently. The charm of this lovely cliff-top village lies in its very narrow, twisting cobblestone paths that cater to only pedestrians. From Fira, you will join the cable car (ticket provided) and descend independently to the old port. A local tender will ferry you back to the ship, which will be anchored offshore.

#### SOC - Volcano Hot Springs Hike & Swim

 Santorini is one of the most spectacular islands in the Mediterranean. It presents the awesome sight of a volcanic crater, partially submerged by the sea. The two islands in the caldera that is now Santorini's harbor, Palea Kameni and Nea Kameni - "the volcano," to the local people are the youngest volcanic lands in Greece. You will travel by boat directly from the ship to Erinia Cove, on the volcanic island of Nea Kameni. You will step out onto the Daphni lava flow, the oldest lava on the island. The path to the top of the dome is over volcanic sand, and lava fragments. You will observe large fragments of lava that were ejected in a molten state and cooled very rapidly as they traveled through the air. Upon reaching the summit of the crater, you will have some time to relax and enjoy the view of the island of Santorini and the amazing cliff of the caldera.




Following the same route in reverse, you will return to your boat and sail to the thermal springs of Palea Kameni. The boat will anchor in the deep green sulfur springs and you'll have a chance to swim in the mineral rich, warm waters (max 35°C) of the Hot Springs. On the return boat trip, you will be dropped off at the small boat harbor of Fira where you can use your round trip cable car tickets that are included in this excursion.

Note: Guests must be able to walk approximately 1 mile uphill over loose gravel paths on the volcano island. Hats, sunglasses, and comfortable walking shoes are essential. Due to the nature of the terrain it is suggested to wear comfortable, "closed-toe" walking shoes on this tour. Swimming in the thermal springs requires open-ocean swimming (depending on anchorage point) and is done at guest's discretion. Guests may be required to swim up to 50 yards to reach the hot spring area since the currents are constantly changing. Life jackets are provided on this tour. Participants should be aware that there are certain inherent risks involved in any swimming excursion. If you are planning on swimming, don't forget to wear your swimsuit and take a towel from the ship.

Further inland stands the historical monastery of Profitis Ilias (closed to visitors), which was formed in the beginning of the 18th century, is currently home to one solitary monk, and provides commanding views over Santorini Island. After a photo stop in the Profitis Ilias area, you will return to visit the village of Pyrgos that is a traditional village with fine old houses and the remains of a Venetian castle sitting on the hilltop. Join your guide on a walking tour through the narrow, ascending streets that encircle the village. Your walking tour will conclude at the unique circle-shaped tavern where you will enjoy some local specialties and the magnificent views over Santorini Island. Local dishes served will include tomato fritters, fava puree, cheese pies, meatballs, local cheese, tomatoes, olives and unlimited wine.

Your tour terminates at Fira Town near the Metropolis Church where you are free to enjoy yourself with independent sightseeing, shopping or browsing. Due to the high volume of visitors, many cities on the French Riviera have strict parking regulations. This may involve extensive walking from the coach parking lots to the various venues and sites visited. During the peak summer months, you may encounter heavy traffic and large crowds in each city or venue. Due to this reason, local guides may decide to alter the tour itinerary and the order in which it is accomplished.

For a select shore excursion to be provided in another language (i.e. Spanish, French, German and/or Italian), the required minimum of 25 guests must be met. Please contact the Shore Excursion office directly on board the vessel for further details.

VFA - Grande Corniche, Eze & Monaco  
PRICE: ADULT: 155.00 / CHILD: 120.00 USD  
DURATION: 8 Hours 30 Minutes Approx.



This excursion will travel along the mountainside roads of the French Riviera, allowing for spectacular views of the small villages along the coast and the Kingdom of Monaco. Starting from Villefranche, you will drive along the famous Grand Corniche, which was originally built by Napoleon. Enjoy a scenic view of Roquebrune Cap Martin near the Italian border and La Turbie before reaching Monaco. Upon your arrival in Monaco, your coach will drive along a portion of the Grand Prix Motor Race circuit to the jewel of Monte Carlo, its Grand Casino.

You'll drive along the Middle Corniche to the charming medieval Village of Eze. Perched on the cliff 1,400 feet above the Mediterranean, the views are spectacular as you look back over Beaulieu and Villefranche. The village is best explored on foot, with its

Returning to Villefranche, your coach will drive along the Lower Corniche Road, passing some of the quaint resort villages before returning to the harbor in Villefranche. Note: At the Rock of Monaco and the Grand Casino, guests must take an escalator and an elevator from the parking structure. There will be time to take photographs from the city walls or of the Prince's Palace. Your coach will travel a portion of the Grand Prix Motor Race circuit before reaching the city of Monte Carlo.

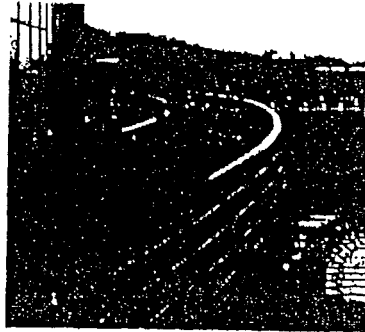

(B) WITHOUT LIMITING THE PRECEDING SENTENCE, IN NO EVENT WILL CARRIER BE LIABLE TO PASSENGER FOR ANY CONSEQUENTIAL, INCIDENTAL, EXEMPLARY OR PUNITIVE DAMAGES.

# Shopping in paradise

Florence  
History

**F**ew nations, let alone cities, can boast such an overpowering array of talent – literary, artistic and political – concentrated over so short a period of time. Florence became the center of artistic patronage in Italy under the Medici family, who made their fortune in banking and ruled the city as an independent state for some three centuries. During the years of rule under Lorenzo de Medici, Florentines held fiercely onto independence in the face of papal resentment. Later, in the late 18th century, Florence fell under Austrian and then French rule. In the 19th century, Florence was, for a short time, the capital of the kingdom of Italy. Today, Florence is a city to be savored, its finest monuments and works of art to be lingered over.

Cimabue and Giotto, the fathers of Italian painting, lived in Florence, along with Arnolfo and Andrea Pisano, reformists of architecture and sculpture; Brunelleschi, Donatello and Masaccio, founders of the Renaissance; and the universal geniuses, Leonardo and Michelangelo. Their works, along with those of many generations of artists, up to the masters of the present century, are gathered in the city's many museums. Thanks to Dante, the Italian language was born in Florence; with Petrarch and Boccaccio, literary studies were affirmed; with Humanism, the philosophy and values of classical civilization were revived; with Machiavelli, modern political science was born; with Guicciardini, historical prose; and with Galileo, modern experimental science.

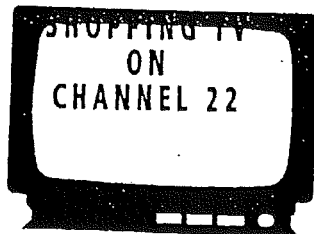
Originally a university town, Florence is now home of many specialized institutes, making it an international cultural center. It is also a city of indoor pleasures. Its chapels, galleries and museums are all fascinating treasures. They embody the complex, exhilarating and often elusive spirit of the Renaissance more fully than any other place in the country. The Arno River divides the city into two parts. The Santa Maria Novella, San Giovanni and Santa Croce are to the north, and "Diladaddamo", the area of Santo Spirito, is to the south.

An hour's drive from Florence lie the marvels of Pisa, where the 800-year-old Leaning Tower, delicate as carved ivory, continues to defy gravity alongside the exquisite marble cathedral and baptistry. Designed in 1172 by Bonanno Pisano and Tedescho, the cylindrical campanile, or bell tower, is comprised of a ground floor, six stories of open loggia and then the bell chamber. Over 400 years later, Galileo, Pisa's leading luminary, is supposed to have used the tower to demonstrate the principles of gravity.

Livorno (port city) is located in the center of Italy's hilly Tuscany region, the gateway to Florence. This was the birthplace of the Italian language and of the Inspirational Renaissance movement. From the 13th through the 16th centuries, this era of great creative freedom encouraged artists, scientists, writers and architects to create some of the world's most noted masterpieces. Among the many who reached the heights of success were Dante, Donatello, Michelangelo, Giotto, Botticelli, da Vinci and Machiavelli. This powerful era of achievement spread across Italy and into other parts of Europe, making the Middle Ages one of the most prosperous periods in European history.

#### G. PIAZZALE MICHELANGELO

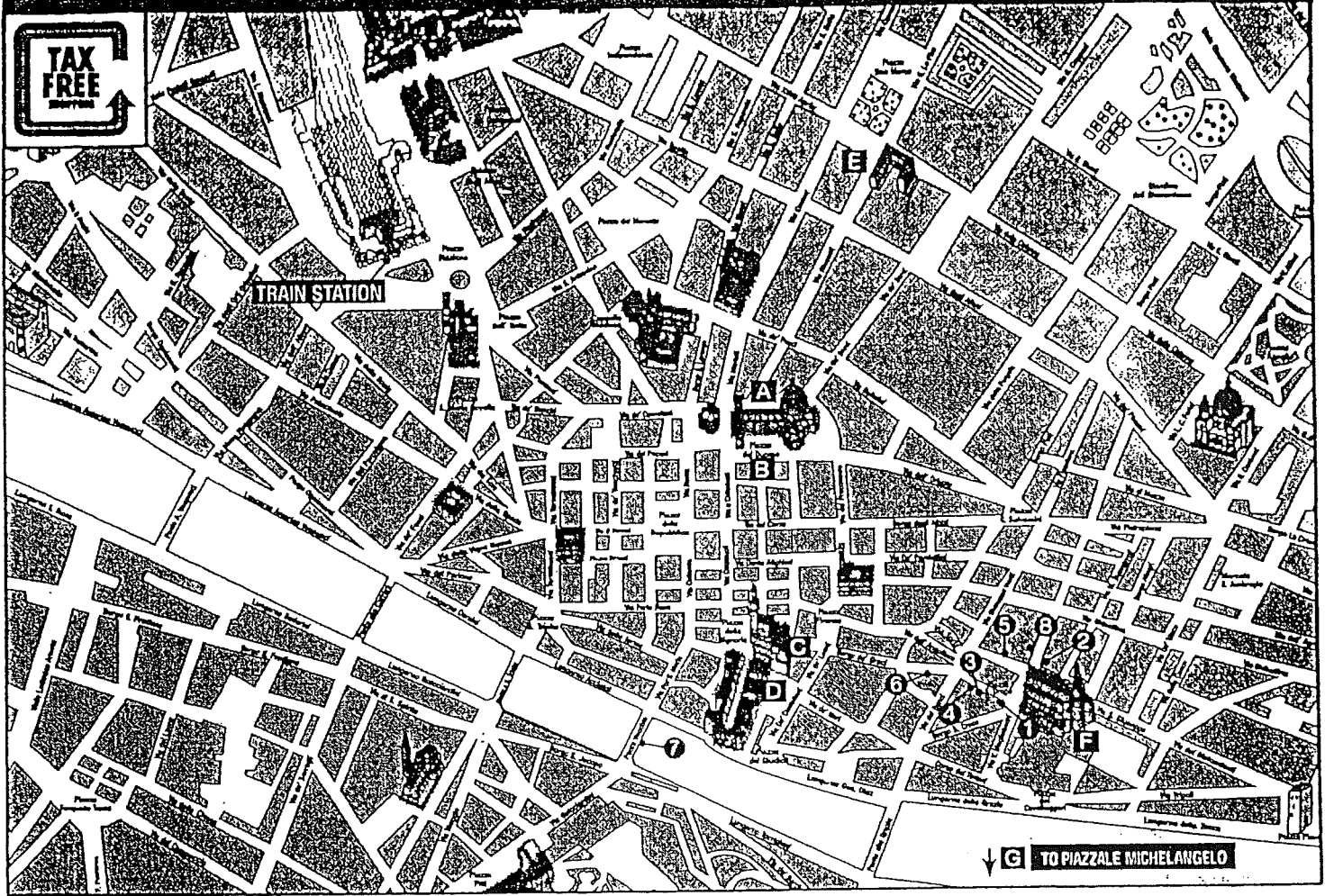

Created as part of major restructuring of the city walls, Poggi's sumptuous terrace is typically 19th century. In 1871, Poggi designed a monument base dedicated to Michelangelo. The monument itself was to be composed of copies of Michelangelo's works, including David and the Medici chapel sculptures from San Lorenzo. When the terrace was finished, Poggi designed the hillside building, now a restaurant, as a museum for Michelangelo's works.

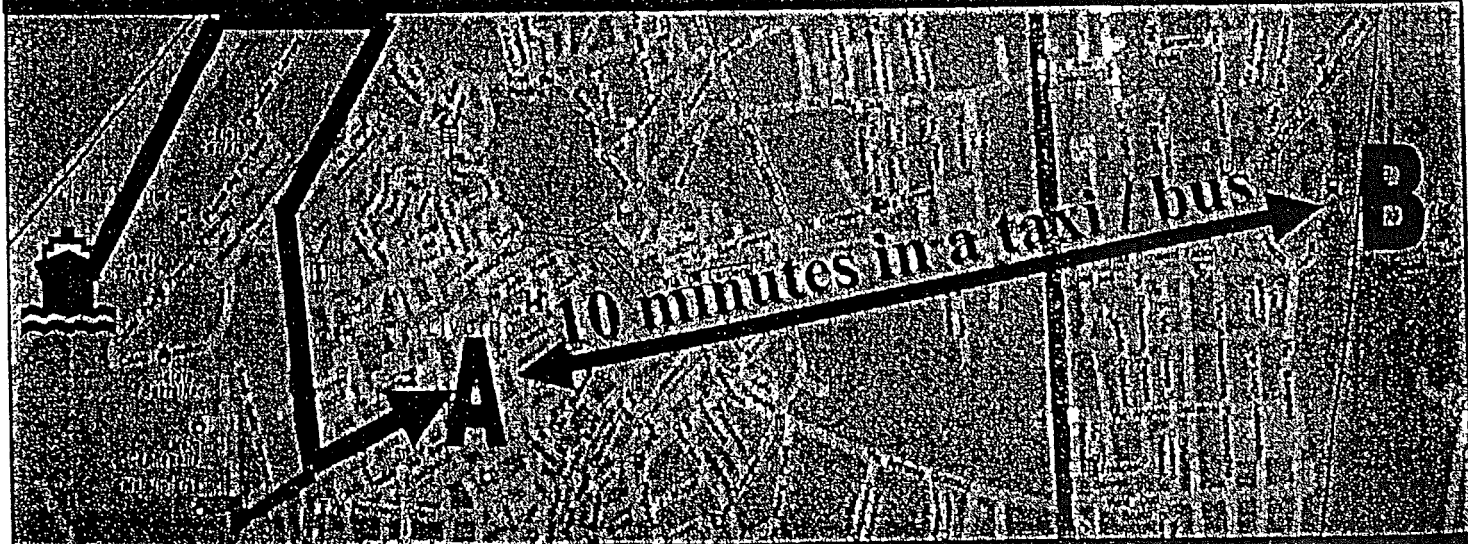

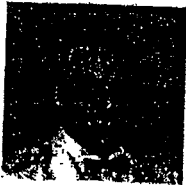


A - Shuttle drop off Piazza Grande

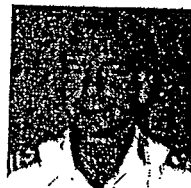
### HENRI ROSIER, EXECUTIVE CHEF

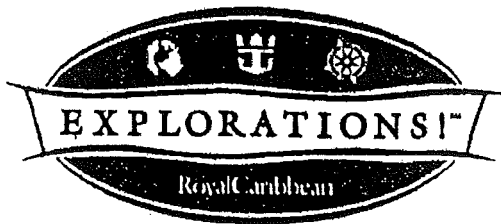
### BIRGER FISKUM, STAFF CAPTAIN

### Local Currency

The unit of currency in this port of call is the euro. There are 8 euro coins denominated in 2 and 1 euros, along with 50, 20, 10, 5, 2, and 1 cent pieces. Every euro coin will carry a common European face. On the obverse, each Member State will decorate the coins with their own motifs. No matter which motif is on the coins they can be used anywhere inside the Member States. There are 7 euro notes. In different colors and sizes, they are denominated in 500, 200, 100, 50, 20, 10, and 5 euros. The notes will be uniform throughout the euro area; unlike coins, they will have no national side. All euro notes are legal tender in all countries of the euro area.

There are a few taxis available at the pier, however, most prefer to accept full-day fares to Pisa or Florence. It is important to negotiate a fare before departing. Some taxi drivers may accept U.S. Dollars. The train station is located approximately 3 miles from the Ship's berth. For further information regarding train schedules to Florence and Pisa, check with the staff at the Shore Excursion Desk or the Port Lecturer. The ancient and historic city of Florence is closed to most automobile traffic. It is suggested to wear comfortable walking shoes when entering Florence as the great majority of sightseeing must be done by foot.

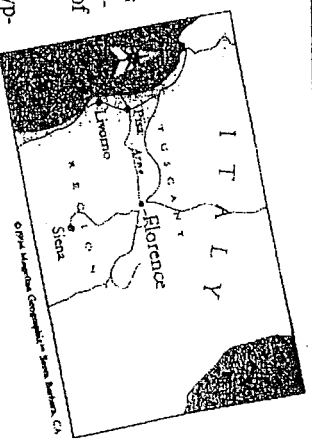
## LIVORNO

(Florence/Pisa)



### General Information

Livorno belongs to the region of Tuscany, which incorporates the west coast area of central Italy and includes the historic and culturally significant towns of Florence and Pisa.



The Tuscan climate is typically Mediterranean, the topography a combination of fertile valleys and sloping green hills on which Cypress trees thrive. The beauty of the countryside is featured in many paintings created by some of the most famous renaissance artists who flocked to Florence during this period.

The people of Tuscany are noted for their charm, generosity and taste for good living. They take great pride in their art and architectural treasures.

Livorno developed as a trading port during the 15th century and reflected the decline of Pisa as a result of the silt up of the River Arno. Today trade includes; timber, marble, alabaster and automobiles, as well as various craft items, most of which is derived from Florence.

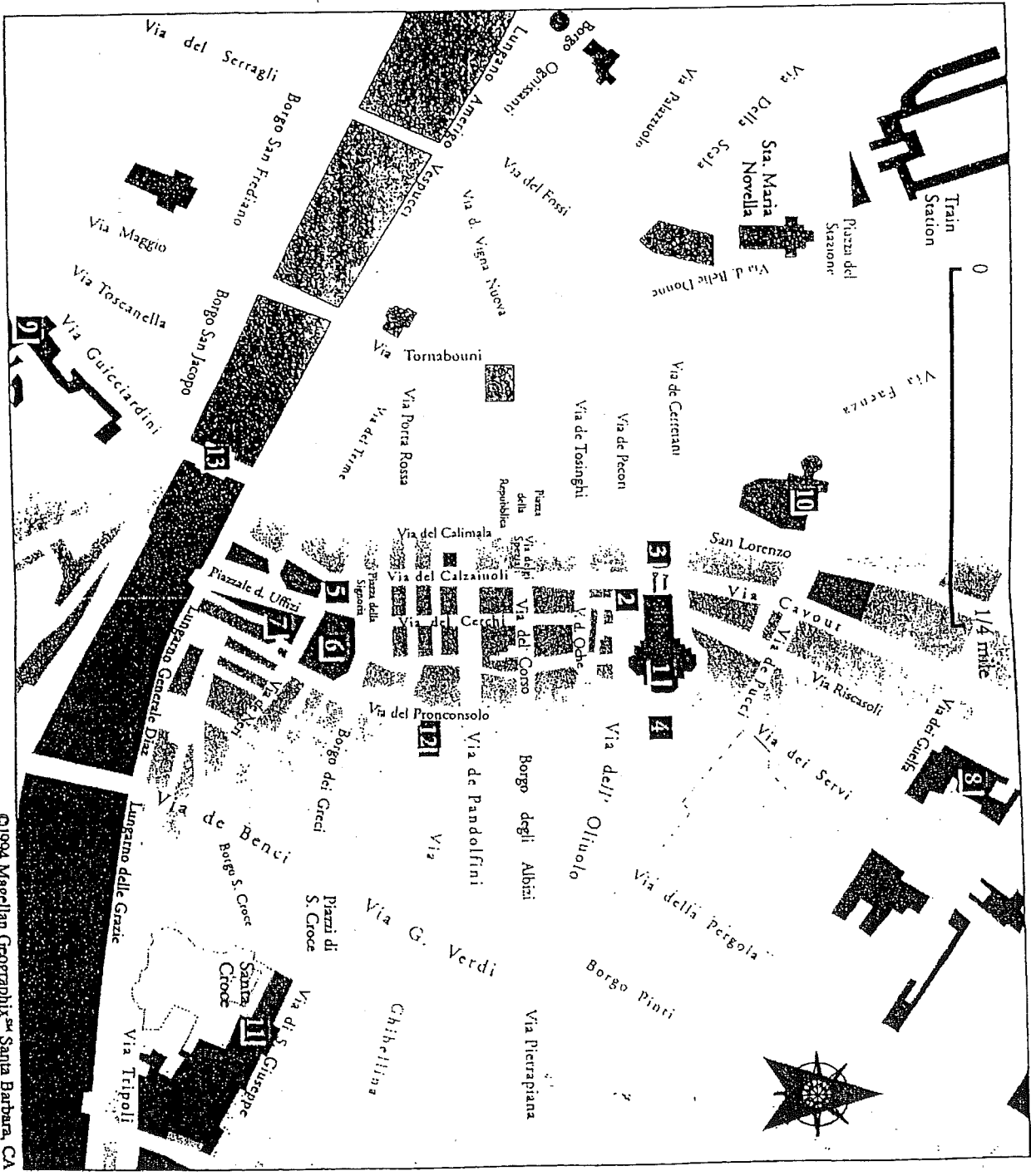
Pisa is situated a little inland, approximately 12 miles from Livorno, on the banks of the River Arno. It was once a republic and city of commercial importance, and bears witness to this period with it's majestic buildings and art works, the most famous being the Leaning Tower.

Florence, also found on the River Arno some 62 miles from Livorno, dates from 800 BC when a settlement was first established at a fording point on the river. Florence is a beautiful city, small and compact with narrow streets and large open squares. It is the 6th largest city in Italy, with a population of 500,000. The old quarter, with it's renaissance architecture, paintings and sculptures, could almost be described as a living museum.





# Places of Interest





## HISTORY

Florence and Pisa developed as Roman military trading towns. With the decline of the Roman Empire there endured a period of chaos, during which various peoples vied for control, including: the Byzantines, Goths and Lombards. It wasn't until the 8th century, with the introduction of Feudalism, that any kind of structured organization existed at all.

While Pisa had been a republic since the post-Roman period and had continued to flourish as a commercial and seafaring town, Florence didn't become self-governing until 1138. Shortly thereafter, Pisa fell under the control of Florence.

It was in the 13th century that the balance of power was transferred from the wealthy to the merchant population, and this brought about a period of economic growth, with Florence emerging as an important European center of finance and commerce.

Florence suffered greatly in 1347 and 1348 when at least half of its population were lost to the 'Black Death' (Plague).

In 1422 Giovanni Bicci Medici was elected Chief of the Republic of Florence and the control of the community returned to the wealthy. Prosperity continued and the Medici family remained in power for over 300 years, devoting much of their wealth to art and science. Following the romanesque and gothic styles of the medieval period, the reign of the Medicis coincided with the start of the Renaissance period and artists such as Michelangelo, Leonardo Da Vinci and Raphael all found inspiration in Florence and contributed to the city's works of art and architecture.

Florence was incorporated into Italy in 1860 and was recognized as the country's capital during the period from 1865, until Rome was chosen in 1870.

During World War II Florence suffered some damage as the retreating Germans blew up the City's bridges, all except the Ponte Vecchio.

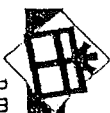
## Local Customs

**Bargaining:** Most items have fixed prices, but it may be possible to get a discount on a large purchase. It is normal to bargain at markets, except for food items.

**Tipping:** Generally a 15% service charge is added to restaurant bills, however, as this amount doesn't all go to the waiter, it is normal to offer a 5% tip to the waiter in addition to any service charge. For taxi drivers, a 5 - 10% tip is acceptable.

**Local Cuisine:** Pasta is most widely associated with Italian cuisine and there are many different types of pasta as well as sauces to accompany them. Try Fazzoletti, pasta filled with ricotta cheese and spinach. Some Tuscan specialties include: Ribollita, which is a variation on Minestrone, Papardalle - broad noodles, Stracotto, a beef stew with beans, and Bistecca alla Fiorentina, a charcoal grilled T-Bone steak marinated in olive oil and black pepper.

**Drink Specialties:** Espresso and Capuccino coffees are very popular. It is common in Italian cafes to take a coffee standing at the bar and often there is no seating. Chianti is the most famous wine of Italy, but the region of Tuscany produces a number of very good quality wines. Bottled water is recommended.



## Shopping Facilities

Shops are generally open from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. and 4:30 p.m. - 7:30 p.m. Monday thru Saturday. In Florence, some souvenir stores open on Sundays.

The Italians are renowned for their sense of dress and style, it is not surprising therefore, to find plenty of quality clothes stores and boutiques, particularly in Florence where the designer boutiques are to be found along Via de'Tornabuoni and Via della Vigna Nuova. Shops are also found on Via Calzainoli and Via del Corso. In Livorno the main shopping areas are to be found around Piazza Grande and Via Grande, approximately 1 mile from the Ship's berth.

Apart from clothing, quality leather products are also plentiful and considered good value for money. Mosiacs and inlays are specialties, as are gold items which can be found in Florence around the Ponte Vecchio. For souvenirs check-out the Straw Market (Mercato Nuovo), also in Florence, located at Via Calimala. Some tourist orientated stores may accept U.S. Dollars, most accept major credit cards.

Value Added Tax (VAT), is added to most purchases. **2** **Bell Tower**, a free-standing tower adjacent to the Cathedral, stands 292 feet high and dates from the 14th century. The Tower is reputed to be one of the most beautiful in the world, decorated in colored marble. 414 steps take you to the top, for a fine view of the City. (Open 8:30 a.m. - 6:50 p.m., daily. Admission Charge.)

**3** **Baptistry**, an octagonal structure built in the 11th century, in romanesque style, contains many mosaics dating from the 13th and 14th centuries. It is famous for its three bronze gates on the east-side, designed by Ghiberti and referred to by Michelangelo as the 'Gates of Paradise'. (The originals are now housed in the Museo dell'Opera del Duomo close-by). (Open 12:00 p.m. - 6:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday, 8:30 a.m. - 1:00 p.m. on Sundays. Admission Charge.)

**4** **Museo dell'Opera del Duomo** contains some superb sculptures, including Michelangelo's unfinished Pietà, intended for his tomb. (Open 9:30 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday, 8:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. on Sundays. Admission Charge.)

**5** **Piazza della Signoria** is the City's largest square and represents the historical and commercial center. The Neptune Fountain can be found here, and the side-walk cafes attract Florentines and tourists alike.

**6** **Palazzo della Signoria** (Palazzo Vecchio) dominates the Piazza, with a copy of Michelangelo's statue of David adorning the stairway. (The original is now in the Accademia Museum). Completed in 1314, the Palace later became the seat of the City's Government and is today the City Hall, containing many frescoes and significant works of art. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. daily, 9:00 a.m. - 2:00 p.m. Thursday and Sunday. Admission Charge.)

**Loggia della Signoria** also in the Piazza of the same name, houses the bronze statuary, 'Perseus' by Cellini and the 'Rape of the Sabinas' by Giambologna. (Always Open.)

**7** **Uffizi Gallery**, located just off Piazza della Signoria, once the administrative offices of the Medici rule, now contains Italy's most important art collection, including gothic and renaissance works by such famous masters as: Giotto, Botticelli, Leonardo Da Vinci, Michelangelo, Raphael and Rubens. (Open 8:30 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday. Closed on Mondays. Admission Charge.)

**8** **Accademia Gallery** can be found on Via Ricassoli and contains some of Michelangelo's most important sculptures, including the 'Statue of David'. (Open 8:30 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday. Closed on Mondays. Admission Charge.)

**9** **Pitti Palace** was once the Grand Ducal and Medici residence and the Royal Palace of united Italy from 1865 - 1870, when Florence enjoyed brief recognition as the country's capital city. It now comprises a number of museums including: Museo degli Argenti which exhibits the Medici family's collection of gold, silver, jewels and cameos; Gallery of Modern Art, and the Palatine Gallery which contains a collection of priceless paintings. (Open 8:30 a.m. - 6:50 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday. Closed on Mondays. Admission Charge.)

**Boboli Gardens**, also located at the Pitti Palace, features 10 acres of ornate Italian gardens. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 1 hour before sunset. Closed 1st and last Monday of the month. Admission Charge.)

**10** **Church of San Lorenzo**, just off Piazza San Lorenzo, is of renaissance design and contains two shrines, an early one designed by Brunelleschi and a newer one, the interior of which was decorated by Michelangelo and includes several of his sculptures. (Open 7:00 a.m. - Noon, 3:30 p.m. - 6:00 p.m., 7:00 a.m. - Noon Sundays and Holidays) Medici Chapels, situated just behind the Church of San Lorenzo, contain the tombs of almost the entire Medici family. (Open 8:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday. Open the 2nd & 4th Monday of each month. Admission Charge.)

**11** **Santa Croce**, located on Piazza Santa Croce, was begun in 1294 built in gothic style. It now contains the tombs of some of Italy's great citizens including: Michelangelo, Galileo, Ghiberti and Machiavelli. Adjacent museum contains various frescoes and statues taken from church. (Open 9:30 a.m. - 5:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday, 1:00 p.m. - 5:30 p.m. on Sundays and Holidays. Admission Charge.)

**12** **Bargello Palace** - This austere looking fortress was once the of Magistrates and later became a prison. It now contains the National Museum and is considered on a par with the Uffizi Museum, exhibiting many fine Italian renaissance sculptures by such masters as: Michelangelo, Verrocchio and Donatello. (Open 8:15 a.m. - 1:50 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday and first and third Monday and second and fourth Sunday of the month.)

**13** **Ponte Vecchio** is the oldest bridge remaining in Florence. It is with goldsmiths' shops, it appears to be a normal street until reach the middle where the River Arno can be seen flowing beneath.

## Pisa

**Leaning Tower**, located at Piazza del Duomo in the Campo dei Miracoli was begun in 1172, however, having only completed three of the six stories planned, building was abandoned due to the fact that it was leaning. The Tower was completed in the mid-14th century. Standing 180 feet high built of white marble, it now leans a total of 14 feet from the perpendicular and continues to move at the rate of  $\frac{1}{4}$ " per year.

**Cathedral**, also located at Piazza del Duomo, was built in 1063 in simple geometric design. The cavernous interior is supported by 6 columns and it contains some beautiful mosaics. (Open 10:00 a.m. - 7:40 p.m. Tuesday through Saturday, 1:00 p.m. - 7:40 p.m. Sunday. Admission Charge.)

**Baptistry**, next to the Tower and Cathedral, was begun in 1152, but not completed until 1284. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 4:10 p.m., daily. Admission Charge.)

• Admission Charges are in local currency.

### Local Currency

The unit of currency in this part of call is the euro. There are 8 euro coins denominated in 2 and 1 euros, along with 50, 20, 10, 5, 2, and 1 cent pieces. Every euro coin will carry a common European face. On the obverse, each Member State will decorate the coins with their own motifs. No matter which motif is on the coins they can be used anywhere inside the Member States. There are 7 euro notes. The main Post Office (Poste) is located just off Avenue Albert 1st (Open 8:30 a.m. - Noon, 2:00 p.m. - 5:30 p.m. Monday through Friday.)

Many telephones in France accept "Telecartes" which can be purchased in the Terminal Building, Post Offices, and Tobacconists in either 50 or 120 unit denominations. You can also place a call with your personal calling card using the following access codes:

### Transportation

A limited number of taxis are usually available at the Pier **4**, and most will accept U.S. Dollars.

A mini bus operates from just outside the Terminal to Place de Masséna in Nice. Alternatively, a more frequent bus service runs from Avenue Albert 1st, approximately 1 mile from the Pier. A train service operates from Villefranche to: Nice, Cannes and Monte Carlo. The station is located about 1/2 mile to the right as you exit the Pier, along Quai Courbet. **3** If the Ticket Office is closed, there is an automated machine which accepts local coins only.

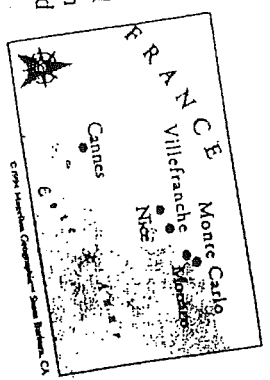

## Villefranche

### General Information



Villefranche is a small, coastal town, located in the heart of the French Riviera, which stretches from St. Tropez to Menton on the Italian border, and includes the cosmopolitan towns of; Cannes, Nice and Monte Carlo.

The Riviera, often referred to as the Côte d'Azur, with its beautiful beaches and pleasant climate, has developed into a major tourist resort. The hill-sides surrounding the Côte d'Azur contain many small, fortified towns which still retain much of their medieval character.

Villefranche is a charming little town, nestled against the hillside, overlooking the bay between Nice and Monte Carlo. The pace here is slow and the atmosphere restful.

Cannes, approximately 28 miles from Villefranche, was the first resort on the Côte d'Azur. Each May it attracts members of the 'Jet Set' for the famous Film Festival. The chic and the elegant display their wealth in the exclusive hotels that line the sea-front along Boulevard de la Croisette.

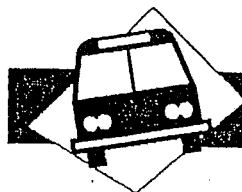
Nice, just 3 miles from Villefranche, is known as the capital of the French Riviera, its main attraction being its location, right in the middle of the Côte d'Azur. The beach, spanning the Baie de Anges, is lined by the Promenade des Anglais, built in 1824 and named for the British who paid for its construction.

Monte Carlo, some 6 miles from Villefranche, belongs to the Principality of Monaco and is governed independently, although the way of life is distinctively French. Known as the play-ground of the rich, it is famous for its wealth. Monaco is ruled by Prince Rainier III, a direct descendant of the Grimaldi family, who have reigned since 1275.

assumed control. Power continued to fluctuate between rulers in the area, but generally this was seen as a period of growth and development in terms of trade and culture.

In 1481, following the death of King René, Duke of Anjou, sovereignty passed to King Louis XI of France. Nice was an exception however, and became allied to the House of Savoy. Nice remained foreign to France, apart from a brief period during the reign of Napoleon, until 1860 when a vote was taken to resolve the issue.

During the French Occupation in World War II, the Côte d'Azur was left to the Italians. The Allied Forces landed in August 1944 along the coast of Provence, and began their move north towards Normandy.

## Local Customs

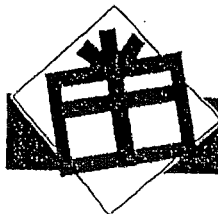
**Bargaining:** Not a way of life in France.

**Tipping:** Generally service will be included in the bill, however, it is customary to leave a few coins. For taxis, a 10% gratuity is normal.

**Local Cuisine:** Wining and dining is a major occupation for the French, and this region in particular enjoys fresh fish. The most popular dish is Bouillabaisse – basically a fish stew, the recipe varies according to the Chef. Salade Niçoise combines basic salad ingredients with tuna, hard-boiled egg, green beans and anchovies. Try Ratatouille as a vegetable accompaniment, a tomato based dish with onions, egg plant, zucchini and subtle spices.

**Drink Specialties:** Pastis is popular amongst the local; clear aniseed flavored aperitif to which water is added. The region of Provence produces a range of good quality white and rose wines.

Bottled water is recommended.



## Shopping Facilities

Shopping opportunities in Villefranche are limited. Nice, however, has a comprehensive range of shops, particularly along Avenue Jean Médicin, stretching from Place Masséna. Rather more exclusive shops can be found Monte Carlo on Rue des Moulins and Place du Casir. General opening hours are from 9:00 a.m. – Noon, 2:00 p.m. – 7:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. U.S. Dollars are not accepted in France, however, most stores accept major credit cards.

Locally produced items include; perfume, pottery, olive wood products, paintings and clothing of Provençal fabric.

### *Cannes*

**Boulevard de la Croisette** is famous for its exclusive hotels and designer boutiques which line the esplanade.

**Le Suquet** is the Old Town, situated on a small hill to the west of Cannes. The Lord's Tower, an ancient watch-tower built by the monks of Lérins, dominates the hill.

### *Nice*

**Chagall Museum**, located on Boulevard de Cimiez, contains a collection of Chagall's paintings. (Open 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m., daily from July to September, 10:00 a.m. - 5:00 p.m., daily from October to June. Closed on Tuesday. Admission Charge.)

**Fine Arts Museum** can be found on Avenue des Baumettes and contains a collection of impressionist works. (Open 10:00 a.m. - Noon and 2:00 p.m. - 6:00 p.m., daily. Closed Monday. Admission Charge.)

**Matisse Museum**, located on Avenue des Arenes, contains many of the great artist's sketches, paintings and collages. (Open 10:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. daily. Closed Tuesday. Admission Charge.)

**Old Town** is lined with many interesting shops. Visit the Cours Saleya to see the flower market which is held in the mornings. There are many side-walk cafes in this area.

**Russian Orthodox Cathedral**, located on Avenue Nicolas II, is a 19th century building of pink brick and grey marble, it has six onion domes and presents quite a spectacle. (Open 9:30 a.m. - Noon and 2:30 p.m. - 5:00 p.m., daily, unless there is a wedding or other ceremony in progress. Closed Sunday morning. Admission Charge.)

### *Monaco*

**Prince's Palace**, situated on top of Monaco Rock, home of Prince Rainier III, was built in the last century. The Changing of the Guards takes place every morning at 11:55 a.m. (Open 9:30 a.m. - 6:00 p.m., Admission Charge.)

**Cathedral**, built in the 19th century in neo-romanesque style, is located on the top of Monaco Rock. This is where the fairy-tale wedding of Prince Rainier and Grace Kelly took place, and where Princess Grace is now laid to rest.

**Oceanographic Museum**, situated on Avenue St. Martin on Monaco Rock, is also a research institute directed by Jacques Cousteau. As well, it contains one of the most spectacular aquariums in Europe. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. daily. Admission Charge.)

**Grand Casino**, once the main source of income for the Principality, this elaborate copper-domed building dates from 1878. The Casino has terrific sea views over a series of terraced gardens. Inside, view the American Room with its decorative ceiling. (Open Noon - 4:00 a.m. daily, the private salons opening at 4:00 p.m. Passengers wishing to gamble at the tables should check with Shore Excursion Staff regarding regulations. Photography is not permitted inside the Casino. Admission Charge.)

**Botanical Gardens** are located on Boulevard du Jardin Exotic on the outskirts of Monte Carlo. These delightful gardens, known as Jardin Exotic for the fact that many of the exhibits are unique to Europe, includes over 600 variations of cacti and succulents. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m., daily. Admission Charge. Entrance tickets also entitle the holder to admission to the caves next to the gardens and the Museum of Prehistoric Anthropology which is adjacent.)

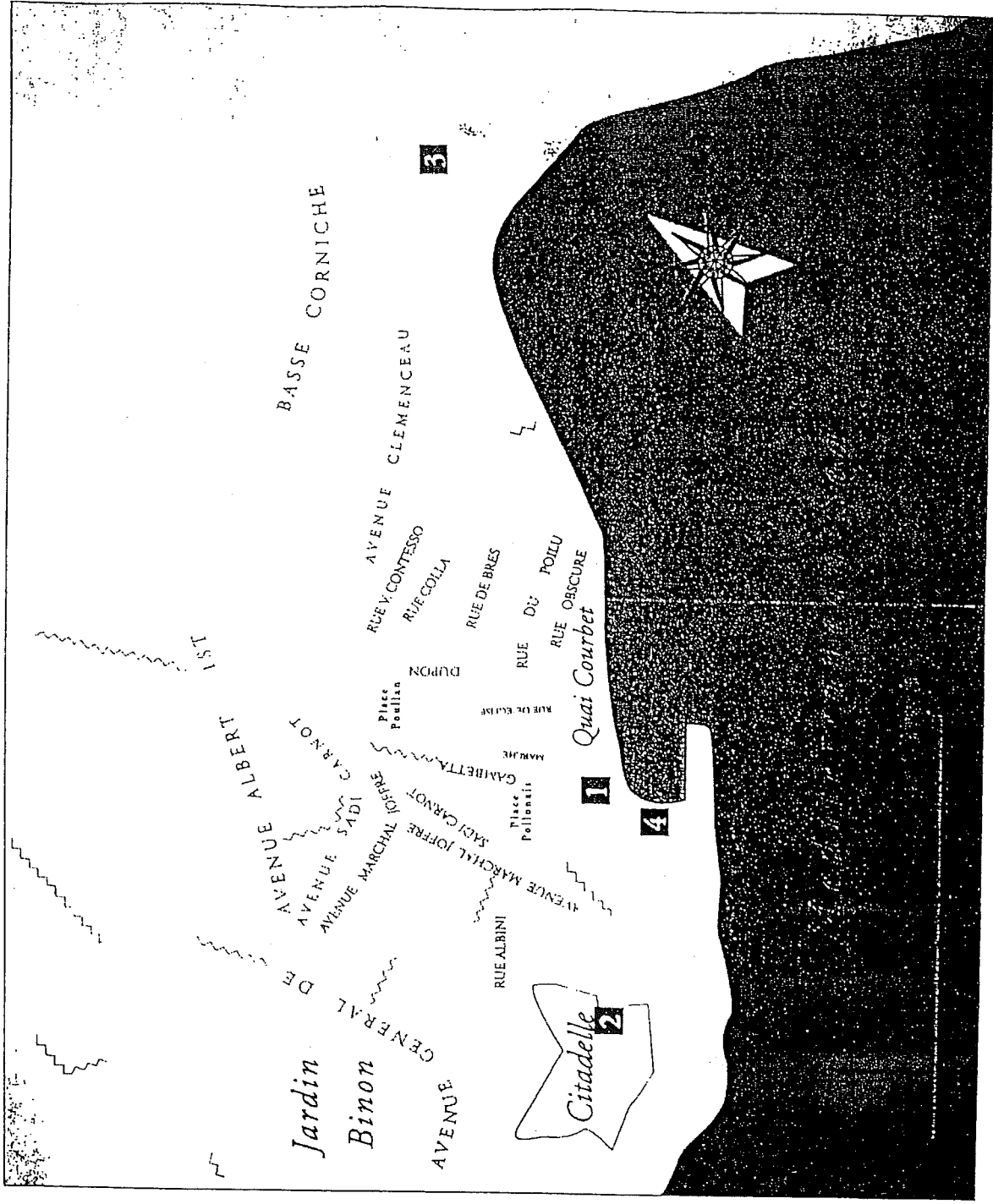
## History

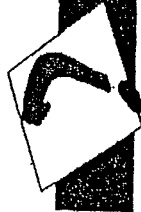

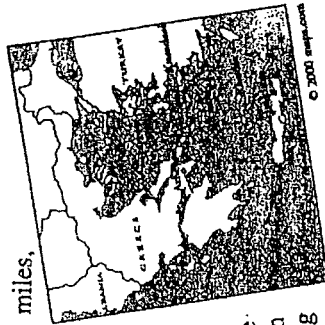
# Mykonos

## Port Explorer



### General Information

With an area of just 33 square miles, Mykonos is one of the smallest islands to belong to the Cyclades group. Its population of 5,000 residents is outnumbered by an annual pilgrimage of 900,000 visitors that swarm the streets, nightclubs, and beaches. Mykonos' beaches are unsurpassed and Mykonos Town is a charming village of winding streets with a traditional atmosphere, interesting shops, great restaurants, and the most exciting and sophisticated nightlife in Greece. These factors and its close proximity to Delos have made it the most popular island in its chain. Governing the scene is the unlikely town mascot, Petros II, the pelican. There was a Petros I, but he died ten years ago when struck by a car. So if you see a large pelican while eating at a taverna, or visiting with residents, take a picture. He is a local celebrity.



The main town is known as Mykonos Town or Chora, which simply means "capital," and it is the administrative center of the island. Its whitewashed houses, maze of shops, and typical windmills stand out against the brown earth and blue skies, forming a perfect postcard setting. The most outstanding feature of the town is its dazzling bright, blazing sunlight reflects off the freshly whitewashed churches and houses. Keep in mind you will get lost in the maze of streets constructed originally to confuse attacking pirates. This design helped foil would-be attackers by confounding them and enabling villagers to maneuver them into ambush. Such layouts are repeated throughout the Mediterranean region for this very reason. Those that live in the town can get around easily since they are used to the puzzle of twisting streets and alleys. But don't worry. If you can find the sea, you will easily find the pier and taxi stand.

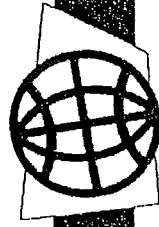
**II** The Library is located in an old 1735 mansion on Ayia Kyriaki Square. It contains approximately 6000 volumes from the personal library of the Mykonian historian, Ioannis Meletopoulos, as well as a display of ancient Cycladic coins and old seals. (Open 08:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 5:00 p.m. to 8:00 p.m., weekdays.)

**III** The Maritime Museum of the Aegean, at the end of Matogiánni, features a collection of model ships from pre-Minoan times to the 19th century, maritime instruments, paintings, prints and old coins. The garden has become the final resting place of old anchors, ships' wheels, cannons, compasses and fans from an old oil lamp lighthouse. (Open 10:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., daily during the months of April - October. Admission Charge.)

**IV** Adjacent to the Nautical Museum, Lena's House, a 19th century mansion depicts the life of a Mykonian lady, Ms. Léna Skriváno from her lace and needlework to her chamber pot. (Open 10:30 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. and 6:00 p.m. to 9:00 p.m., daily during the months of April - October.)

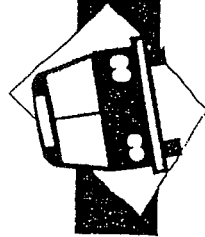
**V** The Catholic Church and **VI** the Cathedral are excellent examples of the more than 400 churches located on Mykonos. Each are impressive in their humble simplicity and their architecture. Most are built in the classic Cycladic style. The 'box base with a dome cap' design is simple but practical and sturdy for this often windy island. Building material is usually plaster or stone, with whitewashed walls and roofs that are accented with just a splash of color, sky blue or dark red. (Open daily from early morning until sunset.)

## History

According to Greek Mythology, Mykonos was named after the half-god, half-man, "Mykonos," son of Anios and grandson of Apollo. According to the legend, the rocks around the island are the petrified bodies of giants that were destroyed by Poseidon and Hercules. The first real inhabitants of Mykonos were the Carians from southwest Asia Minor. There after came the Egyptians, Phoenicians, Cretians, and Ionians during the 30 centuries of recorded Greek history. The Spartans conquered the Cyclades in 393 BC and after that, the Romans. Venetians ruled at first during the Byzantine period and finally the Turks landed in 1500. During the Turkish period, the natives developed the thriving fishing economy that still drives a large portion of the island's economy as is evident by the fresh selection in the local fish market. However, the inhabitants were not happy under Turkish dominion, and when the Greek War of Independence broke out in 1821, Mykonos was one of the first islands to raise the revolutionary flag. One of the most famous heroines of the Greek War of Independence was a rich Mykonian woman who sacrificed all her fortune to help Greece fight the Turkish oppression. Tourism began to develop on the island after WWI with the start of regular steamship service to Mykonos, but WWII put a stop to it for a while. The island served as an important port for the Allies in the war. Tourism picked up again after the war and has been booming ever since by playing host to thousands of tourist every year.

## Local Customs

**Bargaining:** Prices in large stores are fixed. Bargaining may take place in smaller owner-managed shops, and is expected with local street vendors.

**Tipping:** There is no absolute rule for tipping in Greece. A 10% tip is expected in most restaurants and a taxi fare should be rounded up to the nearest Euro.

**Local Cuisine:** Fish and seafood feature prominently on Greek menus, as well as fruits and vegetables. Bread is served at every meal. The breads vary with flavorings of currants, herbs, wild greens, or cheese. You will most likely find these three favorites on most menus: *taramasalata* (a dip or spread made from fish roe), *melitsanosalata* (made from smoked eggplant), and *tzatziki* (a yogurt cucumber and garlic dip usually used with bread). The traditional main entrees include *moussaka* (baked dish of minced lamb, potatoes, and eggplant), *gemista* (stuffed tomatoes or peppers). Fast food in Greece consists of *giro* (slices of grilled meat with tomato and onions in a pita bread), *souvlaki* (shish kebab), and pastries filled with a variety of stuffing including spinach, cheese, or meat. A meal is not complete without a piece of *baklava* (a very sweet phyllo pastry filled with walnuts and honey) for dessert.

**Drink Specialties:** The most common drink in Greece is wine (either white or red). Specialty drinks include *retsina* (wine flavored with pine resin for improving the quality), the local spirit *ouzo* (a clear licorice-flavor drink) and dessert wines from the north Aegean. Small cups of Greek coffee are common at breakfast. Bottled water is recommended.



## Shopping Facilities

All shops are independent on the island of Mykonos and their individual opening and closing time vary. Shops throughout the island cater to tourists and usually remain open throughout the day, possibly closing for an hour or two during lunch. Many tourist shops will remain open late into the evening.

Local breads and cheeses, and handicrafts are among the most popular tourist items. Traditional embroidery and hand-woven goods produced locally are also items of interest.

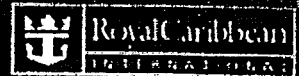

## Rome History

Rome, Italy's capital, rises on the banks of the Tevere, approximately about 18 miles from its main outlet in the Tyrrhenian Sea. It is situated at the center of an undulating plain, the Campagna Romana, which is confined on one side by the hills of Monte Mario, Gianicolo and Monteverde and on the other side by smaller hills of volcanic origin - the so called "Seven Hills".

The heart of Western civilization and of Catholicism, called the "Eternal City", Rome is now the seat of the Presidency, the parliament, the government, important judicial offices, international organizations and Italian artistic and cultural life. Within its boundaries is Vatican City, an independent state.

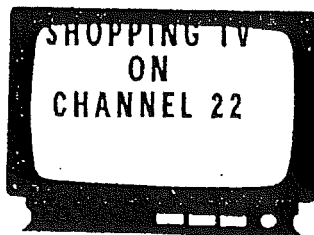
Of all Italy's historic cities, it is Rome that exerts the most compelling fascination. There's so much to see, with relics of more than two thousand years of continuous occupation, packed into its sprawling urban area. There are the classical features, including the Colosseum, the rubble Forum and Palatine Hill. There are relics from the early Christian period found in the ancient basilicas. The fountains and churches of the Baroque period also go a long way in determining the look of the city center. These are just part of the picture, which is an almost continuous history right up to present day. Romanesque churches, Renaissance palazzi, Rococo fountains and the ponderous buildings of post-unification, are often all found within a few paces of each other.

Covering a total area of only a little more than 100 acres, Vatican City is by far the world's smallest independent sovereign entity, and enjoys a unique history dating even from pre-Christian times. The Lateran Treaty of 1929, concluded between Pope Pius XI and Benito Mussolini, established the Vatican's present territorial limits. Steeped in an age-old tradition of political and spiritual might, for many centuries the unchallenged center of the Western world, the Vatican invites continued fascination. Its symbolic significance both past and present and its enduring international role, as both a religious and diplomatic force, have in many ways elevated this tiny city-state to a position of equality with many nations that are many millions of times larger.

Civitavecchia is the gateway port for Rome. Its recorded history dates back to 106 AD when its main function was commercial, receiving supplies from Rome, as it was one of the few ports that didn't naturally silt up. It was also the base for the Imperial war fleet. Today, the port is connected by modern, efficient roads and railways and its maritime station offers banking services, tourist information and ferry service to the outlying islands.

## SEE

### A. THE COLOSSEUM

This structure is Rome's most famous ancient ruin. It was inaugurated in 80 AD, held up to 50,000 spectators and was faced with marble and decorated with stuccos. It was an arena used for games and shows during ancient Roman times and it had an ingenious system of awnings to provide shade. Unfortunately, only about one third of the original structure remains. (Admission Fee)

### B. THE ARCH OF CONSTANTINE

Erected in 315 AD in honor of the Emperor's Victory over Pagan forces, this arch is located next to the Colosseum.

### C. THE FORUM

The Forum was once the political, commercial and social center of Rome, studied with public meeting halls, shops and temples. Today, it is just a mass of ruins, which began deteriorating as Rome declined.

### D. THE PANTHEON

This ancient structure was built in 27 BC and is one of Rome's finest, best preserved and perhaps least appreciated ancient monuments. It is located in Piazza della Rotonda and is known for its outstanding architectural harmony. It is now the burial site of painter, Raphael and members of Italian royalty. Hours are from 9:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m., Monday through Saturday, and from 9:00 a.m. to 1:00 p.m. on Sunday.

### E. CASTEL SANT' ANGELO

This structure was built as a tomb for the Emperor Hadrian in 135 AD. In the 6th century, it was transformed into a fortress and remained a refuge for the popes for almost 1,000 years. It is located near the Vatican and is now a museum displaying historical relics and works of art. Hours are from 9:00 a.m. to 8:00 p.m., Tuesday through Sunday. It is closed on Monday. (Admission Fee)

### F. VATICAN CITY

When you enter this area, you are entering an independent and sovereign state, which is 108 acres and surrounded by thick, high walls. It is home to the Pope, the world's largest church, St. Peter's Basilica, world famous Vatican museum and Sistine Chapel.

### G. FONTANA DI TREVI

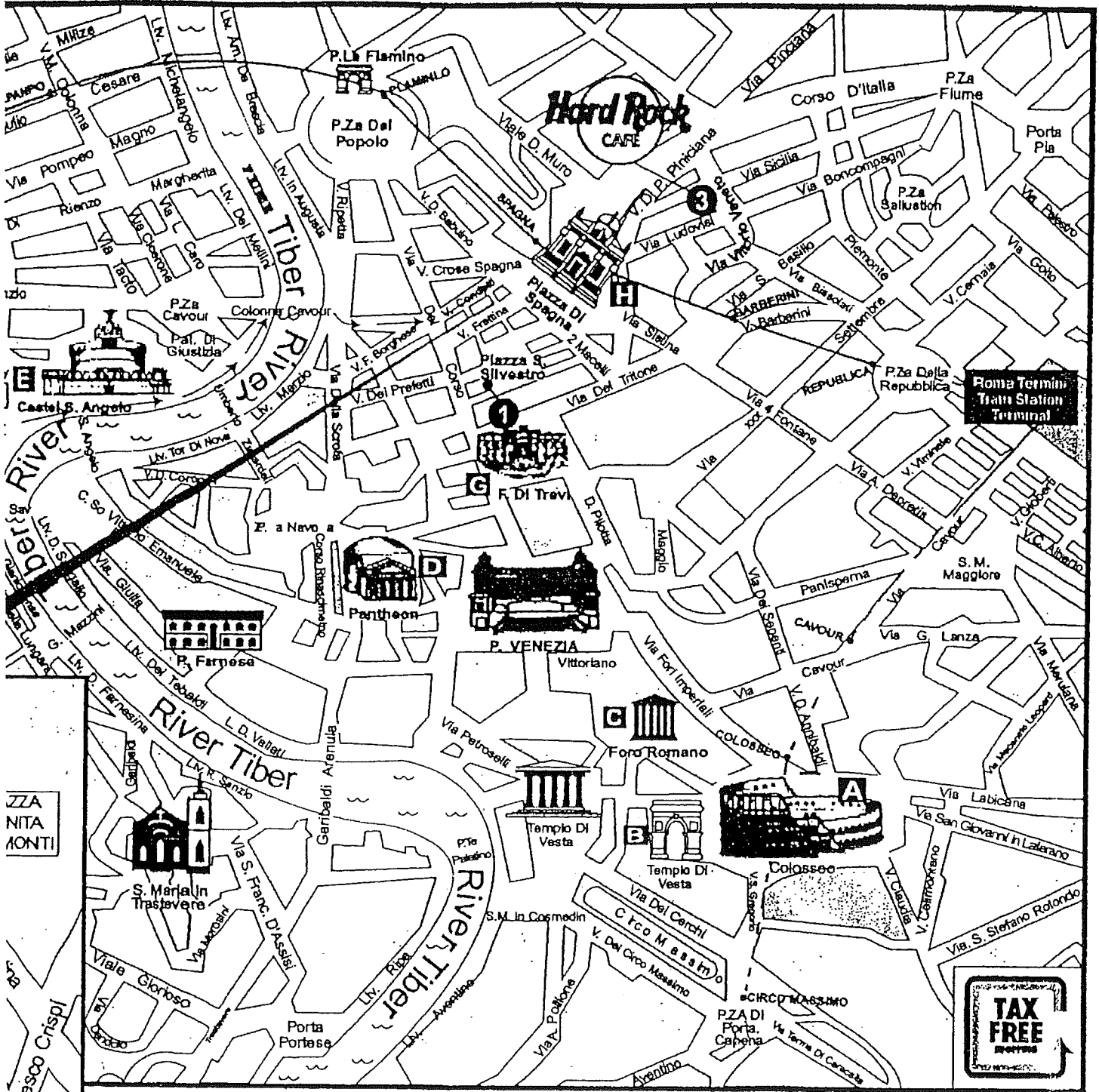
Completed in 1700's, this fountain combines mythical sea creatures and cascades of splashing water. According to legend, one must throw a coin into the water to ensure a return trip to Rome.

### H. PIAZZA DI SPAGNA

This irregular shaped piazza features various architectural styles, but the main focus is the celebrated Scalinata di Trinita del Monti or the Spanish steps. These steps harmoniously connect the piazza with the pincio hill right above it. Rome's fashionable shopping district begins just yards from the bottom of these steps.

## PLACES TO SEE

### EPHESUS

This is the Pompeii of Turkey as well as all Eastern Mediterranean. It houses one of the best collections of remains dating from Roman and early Christian times. It was the second largest city of the Roman Empire and also thought to be the site of the Christian Shrine. It is open daily from 8:00 a.m. to 6:00 p.m. (Admission Fee)

### THE HOUSE OF VIRGIN MARY

Tradition states that Virgin Mary accompanied by St John came to Ephesus at the end of her life. In 1967 Pope VI claimed the site authentic and each year a traditional service celebrated by the religious clergy honors Mary's Assumption into heaven.

### BYZANTINE HIPPODROME

Hippodrome, today named Sultanahmet Square, is the hearth of the Old Town. The ancient works in the middle of this square and the structures arranged in a line around the square are the most spectacular historical remains of Istanbul. The Hippodrome's construction was started in 203 during the reign of Septimus Severus just after Roman conquest of the city. It was finally completed on May 11, 330 for the ceremonies of Byzantine Emperor Constantine the Great, who wished to make this city a second capital for the Roman Empire.

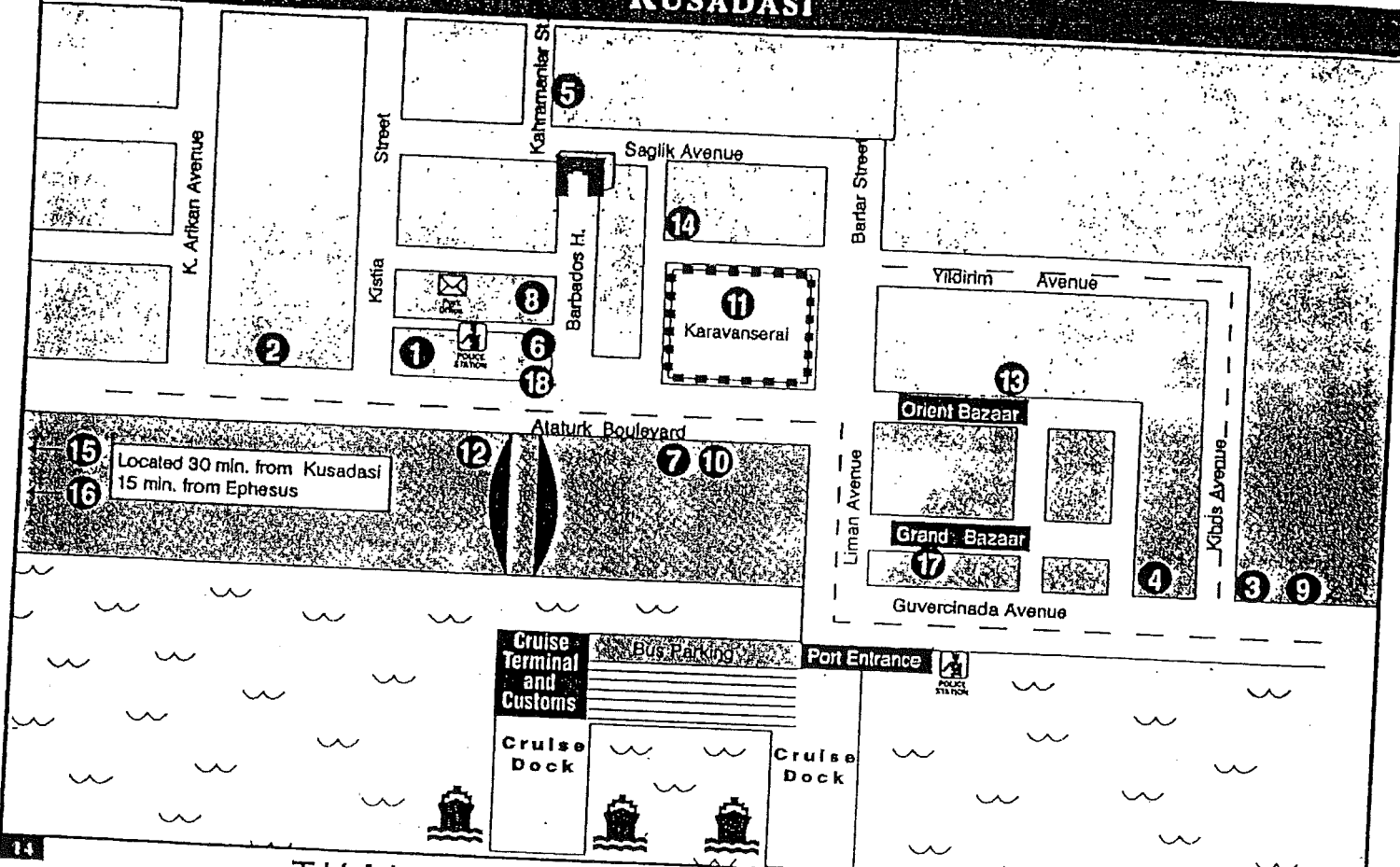
### MOSAIC MUSEUM

The museum was created by roofing a part of the Great Palace of the Byzantine Emperors, and was discovered in 1930's. The surviving mosaic floor shows a lively variety of wild and domestic beasts. It is thought to have adorned the colonnade leading from the royal apartments to the imperial enclosure beside Hippodrome and dates from the 5th century A.D.

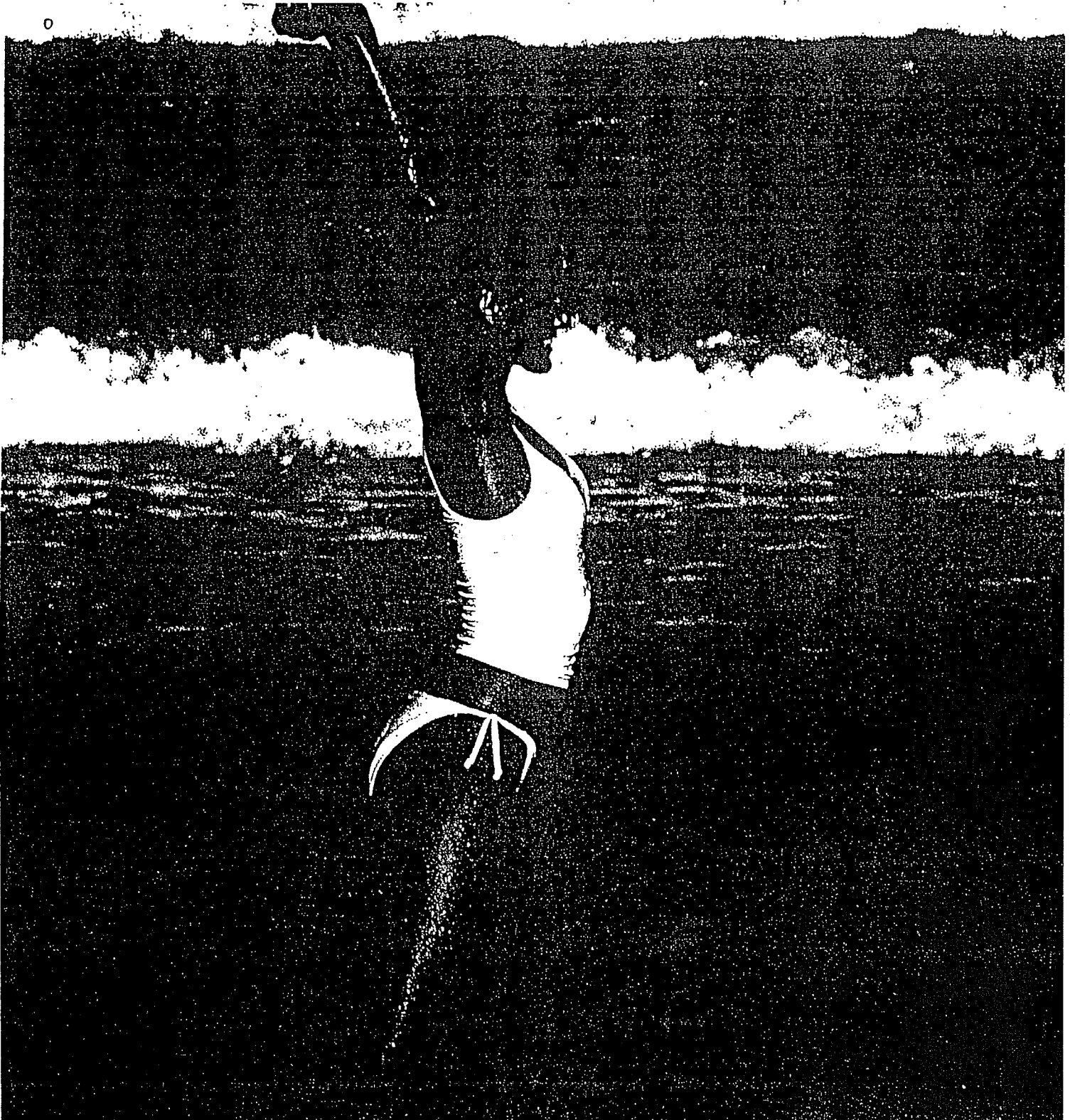

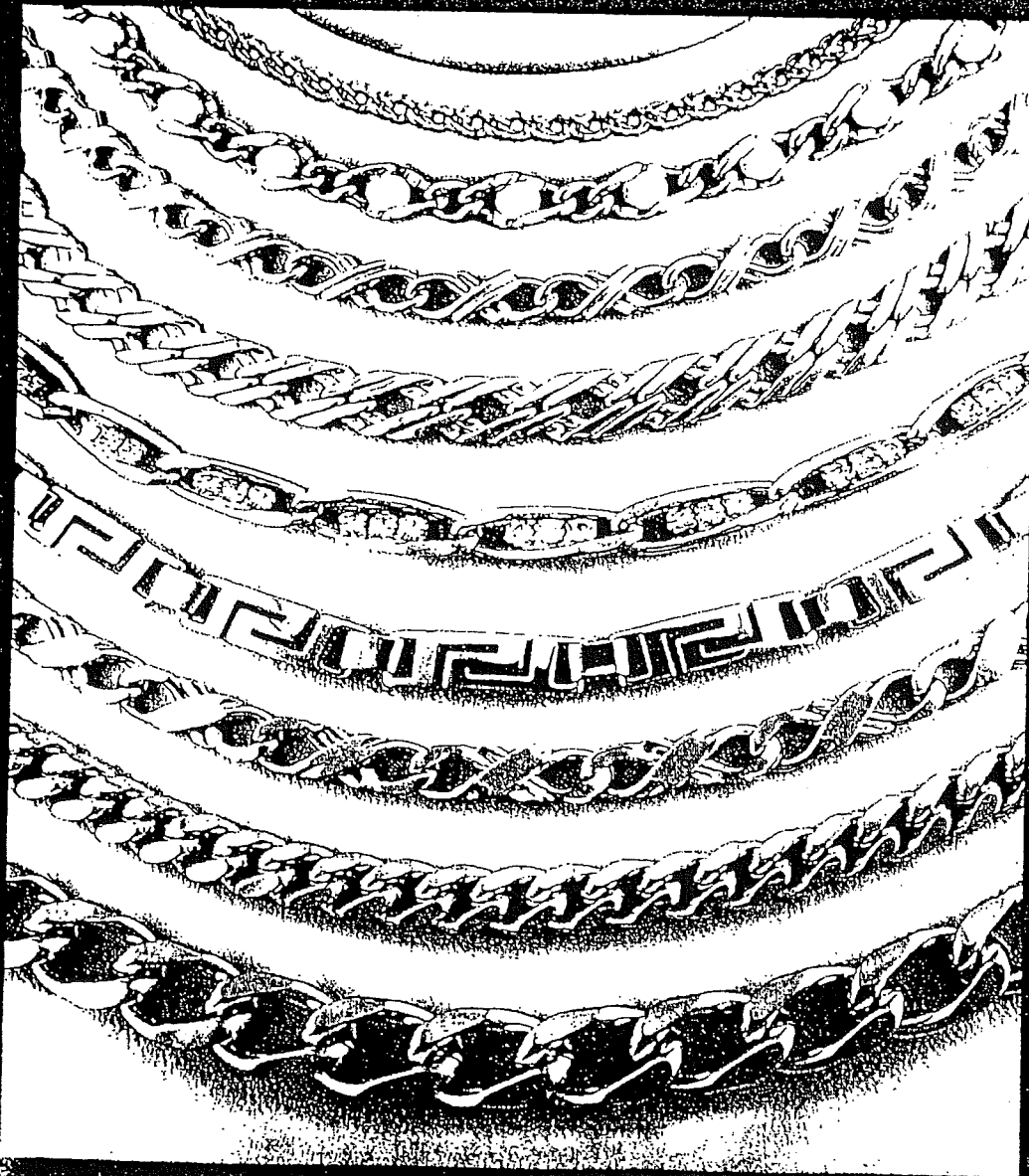

Major currencies can be changed at the numerous banks, exchange offices, shops and hotels. Rates for cash are better than for traveler's checks. Major foreign currencies and credit cards are widely accepted.


Kuşadası is one of the most popular seaside resorts in Turkey, attracting a large number of tourists each year. It has a population of approximately 50,000, and its close proximity to the many ancient cities, archeological sites, villages and parks makes it an advantageous port of call.

Kuşadası means "bird island", a name derived from the small island of Güvercin Adası (Pigeon Island) which is now connected to the city by a causeway. Güvercin Adası is home to a famous defensive castle built to protect against enemy attack, a monument that can easily be seen as your ship sails into the harbor.

Twenty minutes outside of Kuşadası, close to the town of Selçuk, is the well-preserved ancient city of Ephesus, one of the best examples of ancient Roman architecture. Also within the vicinity are the ruins of St John's Basilica, the religious shrine of The Virgin Mary's House, and the single remaining column of the temple of Artemis, which was one of the Seven Wonders of the Ancient World.

The port of Kuşadası was very active for several centuries, however, the Kuşadası of today was founded by the Venetians. Two hundred years after the Conquest of Constantinople the port became a major trading post with Europe and Africa. The Ottomans fortified the harbor and built many new buildings and mosques that are still intact. Today, Kuşadası is a haven for shoppers, home to excellent beaches, and is best known for its historical and archaeological sites.





**E** The Turkish Baths near the Mosque offer a traditional bathing experience. Sauna, loofa scrub and a short massage are included in the fee. Men and women are welcome, but may be separated. Changing facilities are available. (Open daily from 7:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m. Admission charge.)

**E** Karovaplaji and Yavansu plaji are two of the most popular sandy beaches and are considered the best. Both beaches can be reached by taxi or public bus. Bus schedules are available at the Tourist Information Office.

### *Beyond Kusadasi*

**Ephesus** - is one of the most fascinating archeological sites on the eastern Mediterranean. The findings at this ancient city are the remains of one of the most important cities in the Roman Empire. The ruins from the Roman and early Christian era are so extensive and well preserved that it is easy to imagine the daily interactions of the 250,000 people who used to live here. This area grew to be the second-largest city in the Roman Empire and the site of a Christian Shrine thought to be the one time home of the Virgin Mary. Ephesus flourished as the center for worship to the fertility goddess Cybele. The Arcadian Way was the street and the amphitheater held over 24,000 people. The Temple of Hadrian, the Celsus Library, the Marble Way and the Fountain of Trajan are under constant restoration, but in amazingly good condition. (Open daily from 8:30 a.m. - 5:00 p.m. Admission charge.)

After the 7th century BC the...

From the beginning of the 14th century to the middle of the 15th century, the Ottomans gradually carved away at the Byzantine Empire. In 1453, Constantinople, the target of the Ottomans since the time of Osman, was finally captured. Istanbul became the heart of a vigorous and youthful empire.

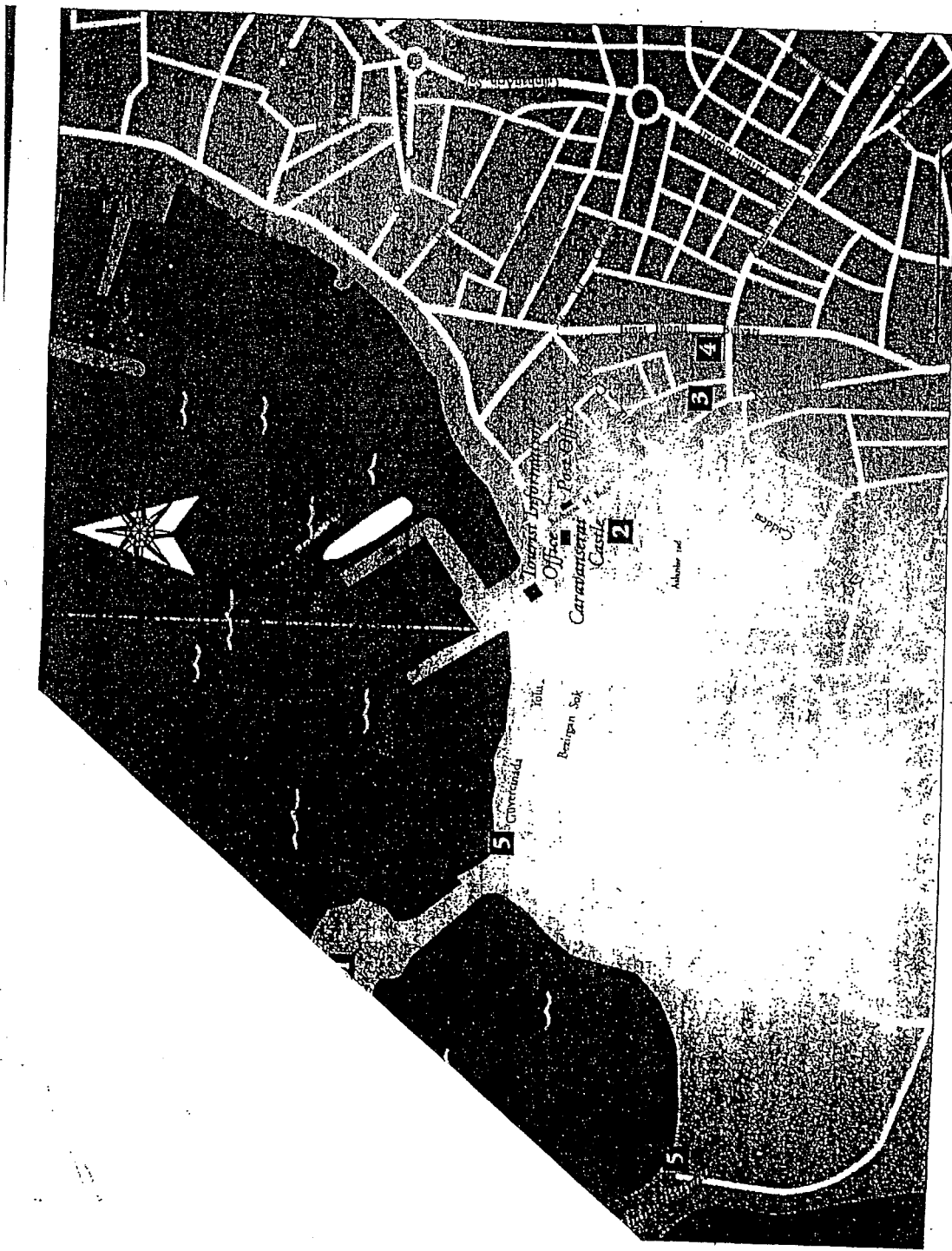
Suleyman became Sultan in 1520 while the Ottoman Empire was already considerable, but under him the expanse of the empire doubled, stretching from the Balkans and Greece to the Black Sea, west to Iraq and southward into Africa.

The Ottomans sided with Germany during World War I. After the Allies won, Britain and France divided the Arab provinces, under the heading "League of Nations". Plans for the division of Anatolia (the plains) were drawn up, and Greece invaded in order to capture disputed territory. Three days after the Greek invasion, Mustafa Kemal Pasha (later named Ataturk), the victorious commander of the Turkish forces at Gallipoli, arrived at the northeast Black Sea port of Samsun and began the three-year national struggle for independence. The allied powers signed an armistice in 1922. The Treaty of Lausanne (1923) recognized Turkey's present boundaries. Turkey was proclaimed a republic on October 29, 1923, with its first elected President - Mustafa Kemal, and designated capital - Ankara. Later, though Nazi Germany's early successes resulted in a popular call to join the war on the side of Germany to avenge the humiliation of World War I, the government remained neutral. At the end of the war, with the impending defeat of Germany, Turkey joined the Allies.

Rome, the 'Eternal City', capital of Italy and the Catholic Church, is a modern, lively and fashionable city. It lies roughly in the center of the region of Lazio (Latium), between the Tyrrhenian Sea to the west and the Apennine Mountains to the east. The Tiber River curves through the City and Ancient Rome is situated on the left bank, as are the original Seven Hills of Rome and the more modern shopping areas, while the Vatican City is on the right bank of the Tiber.

Many Romans today are employed in tourist related industries, as well as in government, film-making and some other small-scale industries. The citizens of Rome still enjoy a relaxed way of life, and live and love life to the fullest. It is believed locally that on the last day of the world the Romans will throw a great farewell party, a gastronomic feast with wine flowing from the City's many fountains - "La Dolce Vita!"

Rome is unique because of its many fine buildings that span so many centuries of history and it is richer in masterpieces, both architectural and artistic, than most any other city in the World.

### History

According to legend, Romulus and Remus, twin sons of the War God; Mars and Rhea, a Vestal Virgin, were abandoned as babies and brought up by a She-Wolf. They grew up to lead a band of outlaws and adventurers before Romulus killed his brother and founded Rome in 753 B.C.

From 800 to 600 B.C., Rome was ruled by seven Latin and Etruscan Kings, but in 509 B.C. the Romans revolted against the Etruscans and established a Republic. Soon its influence spread, and the entire Italian Peninsula, Spain, Gaul and the Mediterranean fell under its dominion. A long period of civil war ended with Julius Caesar's defeat of Pompeii in 48 B.C.

In 27 B.C. Octavius Augustus, Caesar's nephew, became Rome's first Emperor, during whose reign, many famous buildings were erected. Some of Rome's most spectacular structures were built during the Flavian Dynasty, including; the Colosseum, the Arch of Titus and the Forum of Trajan.

Rome was gradually transformed to Christianity during the 4th century, causing much social turmoil. The Papacy developed into the Supreme Ecclesiastical Power in the West. Eventually Rome's over-extended empire became top heavy with it's own bureaucracy and in 395 A.D. the Empire was split in two and soon fell into decline.

By the 5th century A.D. Rome's grandeur had long past and the Dark Ages descended upon Rome, with invasions by Goths, Lombards and Franks. It wasn't until the 15th century that a resurgence took place and Rome progressed rapidly. In 1814 it was annexed to the French Empire by Napoleon, but in 1870 Italian troops recaptured the City and restored it to the Kingdom of Italy. A year later the Capital was moved from Florence to Rome. In 1922 Mussolini began the Fascist Regime that lasted 20 years. At its fall, Rome was occupied by the Germans until liberated by the Allies in 1944. In 1946 Italy was declared a Republic by referendum.

For dessert try Ricotta Cake, a form of cheesecake, or Zuppa Inglese; a liqueur soaked sponge, covered with a custard, similar to English Trifle.

**Drink Specialties:** Through-out Italy there can be found many coffee bars, often without seating, where Espresso or Capuccino are the thing to drink. The local wine is Frascati, a light, dry white wine from the region just to the south of Rome.

### Shopping Facilities

In Civitavecchia the main shopping area includes Piazza Vittorio Emanuele and Corso Centocelle, however, shopping opportunities are limited.

In Rome many stores catering to tourists will open on Sundays. The main shopping district is that between the Spanish Steps and Via del Corso, particularly Via Condotti and the streets adjoining it, where the more exclusive boutiques are found, and Via Frattina where lower-priced items may be found.

Fashion is the main attraction with particularly good buys in leather and silk. Other items of interest include; Italian art and antiques, ceramics, costume jewelry and straw goods. There is a flea market at Porta Portese every Sunday.

Some tourist orientated stores may accept U.S. Dollars, most accept major credit cards.

**2** The Arch of Constantine, next to the Colosseum, was erected in 315 A.D. and honored the Emperor's Victory over Pagan forces and Rome's conversion to Christianity as a result of Constantine's battlefield vision of a cross.

**3** Forum, adjoining the Palantine Hill, is now a mass of ruins. It was once the commercial, civil and religious center of Rome and here stood large ceremonial buildings, the House of the Vestal Virgins, temples, two public halls and many monuments and statues. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Daily.)

**4** Pantheon, located in Piazza della Rotonda in the center of the City, is the most perfect of the ancient monuments. First erected in 27 B.C., it was later restored by the Emperor Hadrian, and in 606 A.D. became a Christian church. It is now the burial place for prominent people, including the painter; Raphael and members of Italian royalty. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.)

**5** Castel Sant' Angelo was built by Emperor Hadrian as his mausoleum in 139 A.D., and is an imposing fortress on the right bank of the Tiber, near the Vatican. It is now a museum displaying works of art and historical relics. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m., daily. Closed Mondays. Admission Fee.)

**6** Vatican City - this tiny sovereign state contains the residence of the Pope, the world's largest church and most famous square and many art treasures. It has its own post office and postage stamps and is governed politically by the Pope and protected by a small army of Swiss Guards.

**St. Peter's Basilica**, in the Vatican, stands on the site of the Circus of Nero. The largest Catholic church ever built, consecrated in 1626 after many years of construction under the direction of several famous architects including Bramante, Raphael and Michelangelo. Among the chief objects of interest are the 5th century bronze statue of St. Peter, the tomb of Peter under the altar, and Michelangelo's Pieta, a superb marble sculpture of the Virgin and the dead Christ. (Open 7:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m., daily. The Basilica is closed to tourists during Sunday services.)

**Vatican Museum** is actually eight museums, five galleries and the Sistine Chapel, which is the private chapel of the Popes and named after Pope Sixtus IV who ordered it built. From 1508 to 1512 Michelangelo worked on the ceiling, painting the story of humanity from the creation to the flood, the largest work ever accomplished by a single artist. (Open 8:45 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., ticket office open until 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, 8:45 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. Saturday. Closed each Sunday except the last Sunday of each month. The Museum reserves the right to close

• Visitors wearing shorts, sleeveless T-Shirts or blouses or otherwise revealing clothing will not be permitted to enter St Peter's Basilica or the Vatican Museums.

**Piazza San Pietro** is the most popular of the many squares in Rome. Standing before St. Peter's, it is said to hold 400,000 people and the area is surrounded by 284 doric columns, designed by Bernini.

**Piazza Navona** is believed by the Romans to be one of the most beautiful squares in the world and is dominated by Bernini's impressive 'Fountain of the Four Rivers'. A favorite people watching spot with many quaint outdoor cafes.

**Piazza di Spagna** (Spanish Steps) is a picturesque square and steps named after a palace that housed the Spanish Embassy. The oldest feature of the area is the Barcaccia Fountain, depicting a sinking barge and reputedly the work of Bernini. The 137 steps were actually built by the French to connect the French Quarter at the top, to the Spanish Quarter below.

**Piazza Venezia** is at the end of Via Del Corso. Here is the huge monument to Victor Emmanuel II, built in 1911 of white marble, the largest outdoor altar in Europe, which also contains Italy's 'Tomb of the Unknown Soldier'. It is in this square that Mussolini made his speeches from the balcony of the 15th century Palazzo Venezia, his official residence.

**Fontana di Trevi** - Of Rome's many beautiful fountains, the Trevi is the most famous. Located on Via Della Muratte, there is a romantic legend attached to the Fountain that says 'whoever tosses in a coin will one day return to Rome'.

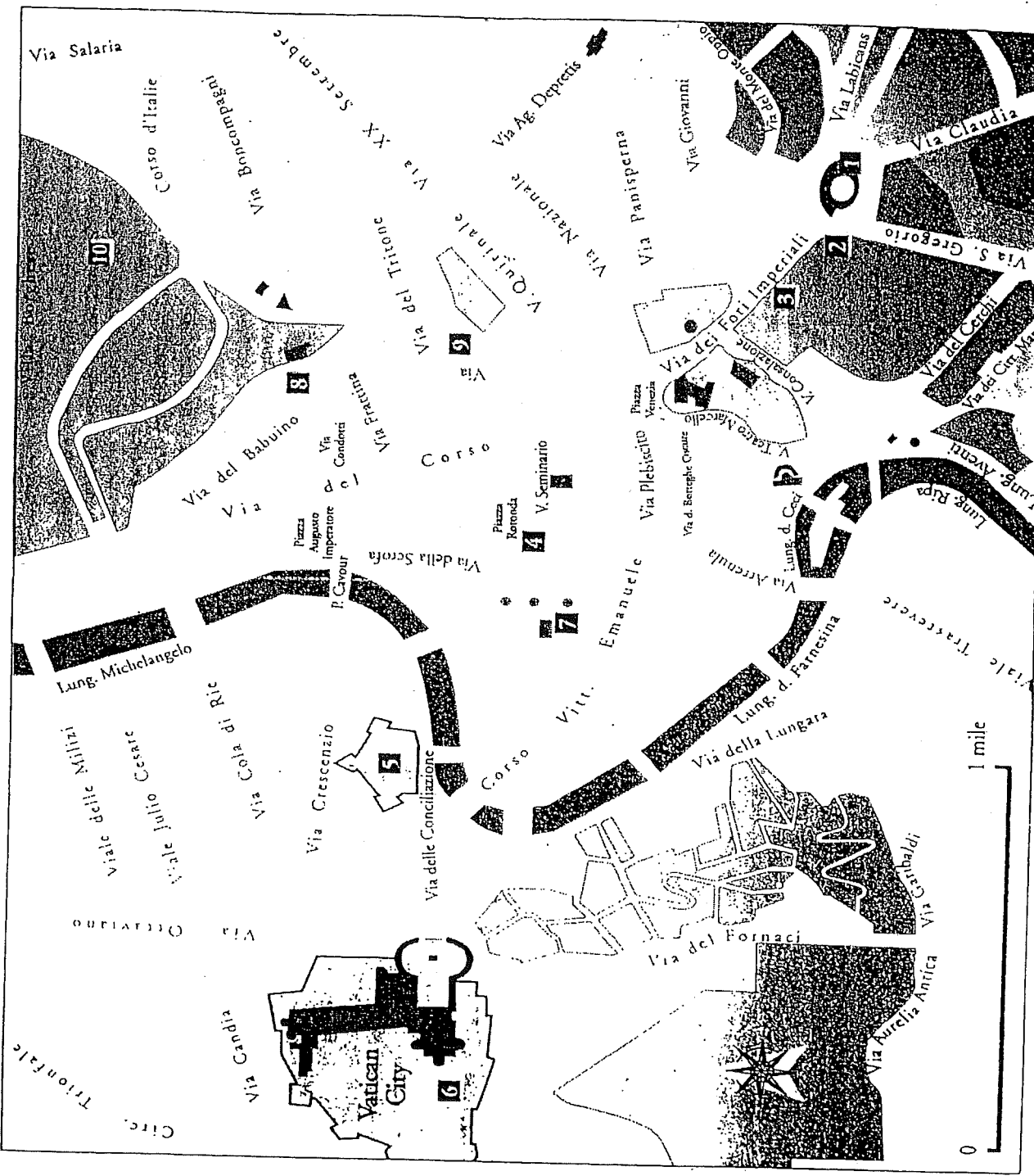

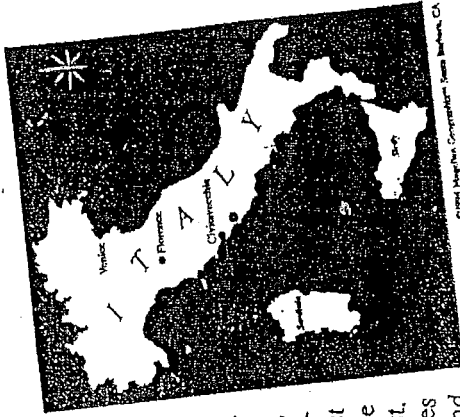

A year later the Capital was moved from Florence to Rome. In 1922 Mussolini began the Fascist Regime that lasted 20 years. At its fall, Rome was occupied by the Germans until liberated by the Allies in 1944. In 1946 Italy was declared a Republic by referendum.

### Local Customs

**Bargaining:** Most items have fixed prices, but it may be pos-

**Tipping:** Generally a 10% service charge is added to restaurant bills, however, as this amount doesn't all go to the waiter, it is normal to offer a 5% tip to the waiter in addition to any service charge. For taxi drivers, a 5 - 10% tip is acceptable.

**Local Cuisine:** There are many varieties of pasta available with a wide range of sauces, Bucatini all'amatriciana is one example associated with Rome, a thick spaghetti in a tangy tomato and bacon sauce. Osso Bucco is popular, a casserole of veal shin, flavored with garlic, tomatoes and wine. For dessert try Ricotta Cake, a form of cheesecake, or Zuppa Inglese; a liqueur soaked sponge, covered with a custard, similar to English Trifle.

**Drink Specialties:** Through-out Italy there can be found many coffee bars, often without seating, where Espresso or Capuccino are the thing to drink. The local wine is Frascati, a light, dry white wine from the region just to the south of Rome.

Bottled water is recommended.



### Shopping facilities

Shops are generally open from 9:00 a.m. - 1:00 p.m., 4:30 p.m. - 8:00 p.m. Monday through Saturday. Shops usually remain closed on Monday mornings, particularly in Rome.

In Civitavecchia the main shopping area includes Piazza Vittorio Emanuele and Corso Centocelle, however, shopping opportunities are limited.

In Rome many stores catering to tourists will open on Sundays. The main shopping district is that between the Spanish Steps and Via del Corso, particularly Via Condotti and the streets adjoining it, where the more exclusive boutiques are found, and Via Frattina where lower-priced items may be found.

Fashion is the main attraction with particularly good buys in leather and silk. Other items of interest include; Italian art and antiques, ceramics, costume jewelry and straw goods. There is a flea market at Porta Portese every Sunday.

Some tourist orientated stores may accept U.S. Dollars, most accept major credit cards.

Value Added Tax (VAT), is added to most purchases. Visitors who spend over a certain amount may be entitled to re-claim some or all of the tax paid, however, regulations and conditions governing the refund of VAT are subject to change. RCCL cannot guarantee the cooperation of local authorities.

**2** The Arch of Constantine, next to the Colosseum, was erected in 315 A.D. and honored the Emperor's Victory over Pagan forces and Rome's conversion to Christianity as a result of Constantine's battlefield vision of a cross.

**3** Forum, adjoining the Palantine Hill, is now a mass of ruins. It was once the commercial, civil and religious center of Rome and here stood large ceremonial buildings, the House of the Vestal Virgins, temples, two public halls and many monuments and statues. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. Daily.)

**4** Pantheon, located in Piazza della Rotonda in the center of the City, is the most perfect of the ancient monuments. First erected in 27 B.C., it was later restored by the Emperor Hadrian, and in 606 A.D. became a Christian church. It is now the burial place for prominent people, including the painter; Raphael and members of Italian royalty. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 6:30 p.m. Monday through Saturday, and 9:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m. on Sunday.)

**5** Castel Sant' Angelo was built by Emperor Hadrian as his mausoleum in 139 A.D., and is an imposing fortress on the right bank of the Tiber, near the Vatican. It is now a museum displaying works of art and historical relics. (Open 9:00 a.m. - 8:00 p.m., daily. Closed Mondays. Admission Fee.)

**6** Vatican City - this tiny sovereign state contains the residence of the Pope, the world's largest church and most famous square and many art treasures. It has its own post office and postage stamps and is governed politically by the Pope and protected by a small army of Swiss Guards.

**St. Peter's Basilica**, in the Vatican, stands on the site of the Circus of Nero. The largest Catholic church ever built, consecrated in 1626 after many years of construction under the direction of several famous architects including; Bramante, Raphael and Michelangelo. Among the chief objects of interest are the 5th century bronze statue of St. Peter, the tomb of Peter under the altar, and Michelangelo's Pieta, a superb marble sculpture of the Virgin and the dead Christ. (Open 7:00 a.m. - 6:00 p.m., daily. The Basilica is closed to tourists during Sunday services.)

**Vatican Museum** is actually eight museums, five galleries and the Sistine Chapel, which is the private chapel of the Popes and named after Pope Sixtus IV who ordered it built. From 1508 to 1512 Michelangelo worked on the ceiling, painting the story of humanity from the creation to the flood, the largest work ever accomplished by a single artist. (Open 8:45 a.m. - 4:30 p.m., ticket office open until 3:30 p.m. Monday through Friday, 8:45 a.m. - 12:30 p.m. Saturday. Closed each Sunday except the last Sunday of each month. The Museum reserves the right to close

Flash photography is not permitted in the Vatican Museum, and no photography of any kind is permitted in the Sistine Chapel.

Visitors wearing: shorts, sleeveless T-Shirts or blouses or otherwise revealing clothing will not be permitted to enter St. Peter's Basilica or the Vatican Museums.

**Piazza San Pietro** is the most popular of the many squares in Rome. Standing before St. Peter's, it is said to hold 400,000 people and the area is surrounded by 284 doric columns, designed by Bernini.

**Piazza Navona** is believed by the Romans to be one of the most beautiful squares in the world and is dominated by Bernini's impressive 'Fountain of the Four Rivers'. A favorite people watching spot with many quaint outdoor cafes.

**Piazza di Spagna** (Spanish Steps) is a picturesque square and steps named after a palace that housed the Spanish Embassy. The oldest feature of the area is the Barcaccia Fountain, depicting a sinking barge and reputedly the work of Bernini. The 137 steps were actually built by the French to connect the French Quarter at the top, to the Spanish Quarter below.

**Piazza Venezia** is at the end of Via Del Corso. Here is the huge monument to Victor Emmanuel II, built in 1911 of white marble, the largest outdoor altar in Europe, which also contains Italy's 'Tomb of the Unknown Soldier'. It is in this square that Mussolini made his speeches from the balcony of the 15th century Palazzo Venezia, his official residence.

**Fontana di Trevi** - Of Rome's many beautiful fountains, the Trevi is the most famous. Located on Via Della Muratte, there is a romantic legend attached to the Fountain that says 'whoever tosses in a coin will one day return to Rome'.

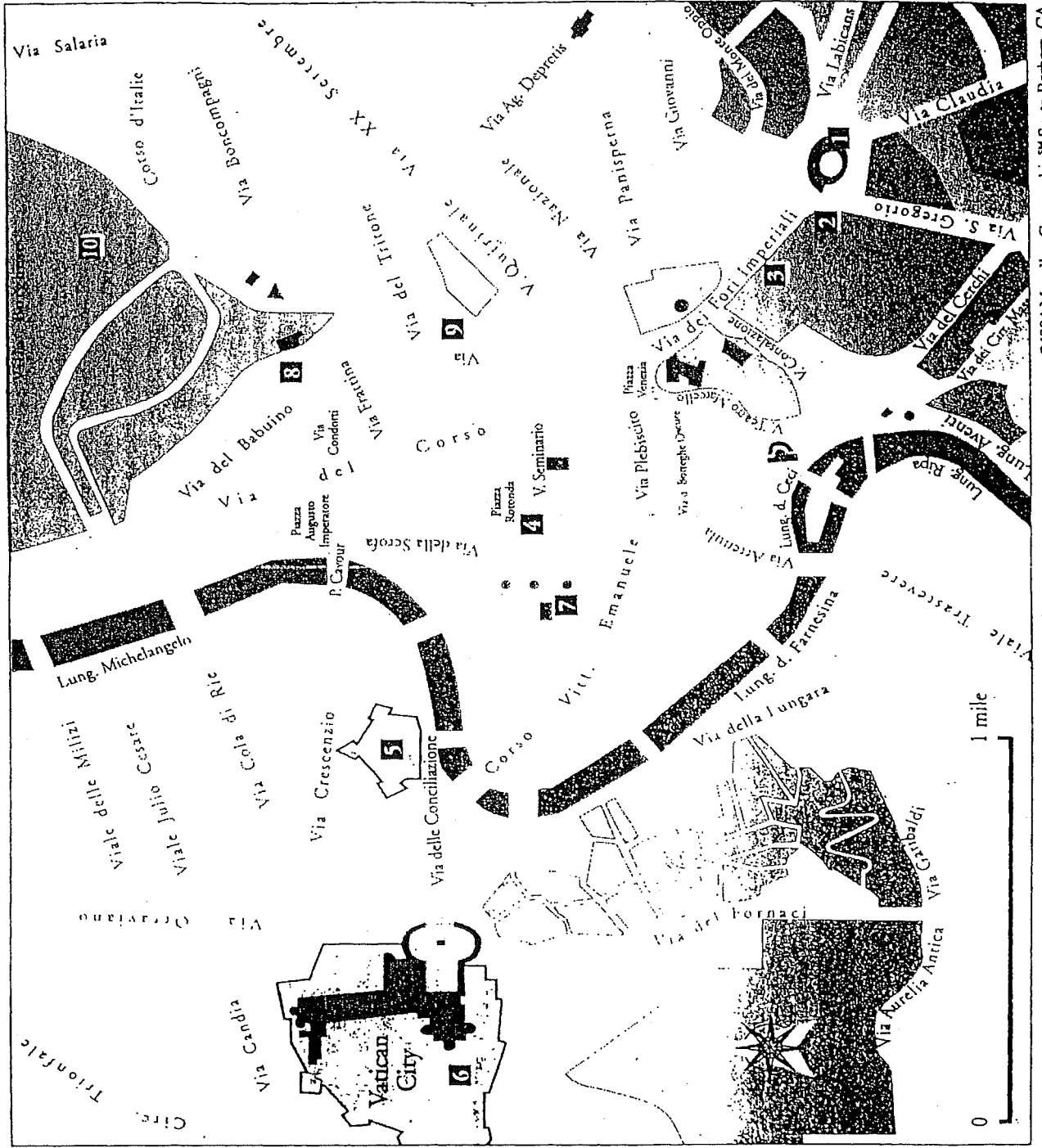
**Villa Borghese**, the most famous of Rome's parks, is beyond the Via Veneto and includes the Galleria Borghese, a pleasure palace created by Cardinal Borghese in 1613. The Gallery contains many famous works of art and sculpture. (The park is always open. Museum entrance is every 2 hours and is based on reserved bookings. Open 9:00 a.m. - 7:00 p.m. Tuesday through Sunday. Closed Monday. Admission charge.)

Rome, as a city, represents a vast array of cultural and entertainment interests, too numerous to fully mention. For further information please consult the Shore Excursion Desk or the Port Lecturer who will do their best to assist.

This elite Roman resort was devastated by the same volcanic eruption that buried Pompeii in 79 A.D. Unlike the ash and lava that devastated Pompeii, Herculaneum was covered by a torrent of mud, which protected the ruins from atmospheric agents and illegal excavators. This natural preservation of wooden elements, foodstuffs, fabrics, and architecture provides a fascinating and intimate look into the Roman's private life in ancient times. 
